On April 18, 2004 we remember the memory of more than 6 million men, women, and children who perished during Holocaust. Nessah Educational and Cultural Center would like to invite you to honor their memory and to learn about the Iranian Jews who were saved by the "Schindler of Iran," Abdol Hossein Sardari. For the first time ever, Professor Fariborz Mokhtari of National Defense University in Washington D.C., will be sharing the story of the Iranian diplomat and how he saved over one thousand Iranian and other Jews from the merciless hands of the Nazis. One of the survivors, currently a resident of Los Angeles who at the age of 27 was one of the Iranian Jewish leaders in Paris, recalls that most Iranian Jewish families remained in France throughout the occupation without being harmed. After World War II Mr. Sardari was charged with illegal conduct for having issued unauthorized passports, and finally left Iran's Ministry of Foreign Affairs to join the Iranian Oil Company in the 1950's. He passed away in London in 1981.

Join us Sunday, April 18th at 6:30 pm in the evening for a memorial service, a speech by Holocaust survivor Henry Sattler, and a presentation on heroic activities Mr. Abdol Hossein Sardari.
