City's Mosquito Control Continues - Citizens Urged to Assist

(Nacogdoches, TX) As somewhat damper weather remains in the local forecast, City of

Nacogdoches mosquito control efforts continue on track. During the very early

mornings, licensed City staff aggressively spray for mosquitoes citywide. Administered

by both the City's Health and Parks and Recreation Departments, the City's annual

program begins in April and ends in October.

The City's mosquito spraying occurs five days a week. Each morning, spraying

efforts focus on a different section of the city – with this process continually repeated

during the "mosquito season." A major goal in this program is abatement of breeding

grounds. Considered the best method for source reduction, chemical suppression of

mosquitoes through larvicides and adulticides is effective in disruption of breeding

cycles.

However, residents also play a vital role in source reduction by eliminating

standing water in containers such as tires, buckets, cans, bottles and any other items that

collect and hold water. City staff will continue to respond to specific areas within the

city as needed, and citizens are encouraged to report any area believed to need treatment

by calling the Nacogdoches Parks and Recreation Department at 559-2960.
