

The History of the LEGOLAND® Parks

1968	LEGOLAND® opens in Billund, Denmark – 6 million LEGO® bricks
1970	Billy Smart Circus family opens the 'Windsor Safari Park' on the site
	that would later become home to LEGOLAND Windsor.
1977-1988	Safari Park changes ownership several times.
1989	Research begins for developing other LEGOLAND parks – over 1000
	sites are considered.
1992	Windsor Safari Park goes into receivership. The 150 acre site near
	Windsor is chosen as the location of the first LEGOLAND park
	outside of the home of LEGO in Denmark.
1992-1993	LEGOLAND Windsor – planning, design, site preparation, plus model
	design and construction begins.
1994	LEGOLAND Windsor – construction begins in earnest. Services,
	foundations and infrastructure installed.
1995	LEGOLAND Windsor – Big Ben placed in Miniland one year
	prior to opening. Buildings and attractions become established.
1996	Grand opening of LEGOLAND Windsor – 25 million LEGO bricks
	used.
1999	LEGOLAND California opens in Carlsbad near San Diego – 30 million
	LEGO bricks used.
2001	LEGOLAND Windsor enjoys a record attendance.
2002	The fourth park opens – LEGOLAND Deutschland, near Günzberg
2003	LEGOLAND Billund achieves a record attendance.
2004	LEGOLAND Windsor sees a record daily attendance on 30 October.
2005	Backed by Blackstone Venture Capital, Merlin Entertainments and
	the four LEGOLAND Parks become a combined business with the
	LEGO Group retaining a 30 per cent share.
