### The Faculty



Bill W. Thompson, CPP

President, Thompson Training

During his more than 39 years in law enforcement, corporate security, and private security training and consulting, **Bill Thompson** has worked in many different security fields. Bill started his career in law enforcement with the Middletown and Kettering Police Departments located in southern Ohio. Six of his twelve years in public law enforcement Bill was the detective in charge of fraud, forgery, and credit card investigations. Bill then moved into the private security field as a Security Investigator at Winters National Bank in Dayton, OH. He then spent seven years as Director of Security for Gems Savings Association in Dayton, Ohio. From there he went on to become the Vice President and Director of Security for Fifth Third Bank in Cincinnati, Ohio. He served as President of both the Cincinnati and Dayton Chapters of ASIS as well as serving as Regional Vice President in 1993. Bill now is President of Thompson Training where he provides security training and consulting to numerous companies.

Bill has authored several articles, which have been published in nationally circulated banking newsletters. Bill has spoke on security issues to many different organizations including the University of Cincinnati, Bank Administration Institute, National Association of Bank Security, the American Society for Industrial Security, and the Institute of Internal Auditors.



Michael R. Moran

**Michael R. Moran, J.D., CFE**, is an attorney in private practice in Gahanna. He also serves as Solicitor & Prosecuting Attorney for the Village of Hartford and as Magistrate for Lithopolis Mayor's Court. Mr. Moran has 18 years diverse experience in both the public-sector (village, city, county, state, federal task forces) and private-sector law enforcement (contract and proprietary security and private investigation).

In addition, he is a Major in the Ohio Military Reserve JAG Corps, where he is assigned as Deputy Inspector General – Legal and as the agency representative to the National White Collar Crime Center. He is a former Manager for Pinkerton Investigation Services and has served as Legal Counsel for the Ohio Association of Security & Investigation Services (OASIS). He is a founder and past president of the Ohio Investigators Association, the professional association for state investigators. Mr. Moran has served in leadership in the Ohio State Bar Association, including currently as Chairman of the Administrative Law Specialty Board.

Mr. Moran is an NRA Certified Firearms Instructor and represented OASIS before the Ohio Supreme Court in a constitutional challenge to Ohio's concealed weapons statutes, 2001-2003. He also was heavily involved in drafting the language for House Bill 230, which last year created the Ohio Private Investigation and Security Services Commission and moved the licensure for those professions to the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Division of Homeland Security. He has instructed hundreds of citizens seeking concealed handgun licenses (CHL) on firearms law and has represented CHL applicants before Sheriff's Offices and in court appeals. He earned his Juris Doctor degree at Capital University Law School, where he also serves as an Adjunct Professor.



John "Jack" Hildebrand

John "Jack" Hildebrand, Senior Inspector, US Marshall's Service. Jack Hildebrand began a law enforcement career in 1990 after serving in the U.S. Navy. Hildebrand served as a Submarine Sonar Technician and Intelligence Officer for the Navy in the 1980s. Hildebrand became a Police Officer in La Mesa, California in 1990, serving as a patrol and training officer with City of La Mesa Police Department. In 1993 Hildebrand was selected to continue his law enforcement career by the United States Marshals Service. San Diego in the Southern District of California was the first duty station where Jack Hildebrand was stationed in the Marshals Service. Later Jack Hildebrand was stationed in Amarillo and Lubbock, Texas in the Northern District of Texas. While in Texas, Hildebrand initiated the Texas Panhandle Violent Crimes and Fugitive Task Force and ran that fugitive group for several years. The Texas Panhandle Fugitive Task Force was the first of its kind in Northwest Texas. In September of 2002 Hildebrand was selected to become the first Judicial Security Inspector in the Southern District of Ohio for a new program initiated nationwide by the Marshals Service. Hildebrand has been serving as the JSI in Columbus since November of 2002.

Jack Hildebrand has a Bachelor of Arts and a Masters of Arts in Speech Communication and Political Science from Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas. Hildebrand is a graduate of the San Diego Regional Police Academy, the United States Marshals Service Academy, and the Marshals Service Court Facility/Judicial Security training program. Jack Hildebrand has worked numerous high threat protection assignments throughout the nation including Operation Terror Stop in New York, and the United Nations General Assembly Protection Detail on the Palestine Liberation Organization Delegation and Chairman Yassar Arafat in 1996. Hildebrand currently is in charge of court facility security and judicial security for the federal courts in Cincinnati, Columbus, and Dayton, Ohio.



### Directions to the Makoy Center



#### From Downtown or East I-70

Take I-70 West to Exit 93, take I-270 North to Cemetery Road, exit westbound and proceed 2.1 miles to Main St (follow Bike Path signs), turn right, or North, proceed 1/4 mile to Center St, turn left and proceed two blocks to the Makoy Center on your right.

#### From the North, I-71

Take I-71 South to Exit 119B, take I-270 West 12.7 miles to Exit 13, Cemetery Rd, go West 1.9 miles to Main St (follow Bike Path signs), turn right, or North, proceed 1/4 mile to Center St, turn left and proceed two blocks to the Makoy Center on your right.

#### From the West, I-70

Take I-70 East from West of Columbus to Exit 91, Rome-Hilliard Rd, which becomes Main St in Hilliard. Proceed North 4.1 miles to Center St, which is 1/4 mile past Cemetery Rd. Turn left and proceed two blocks to the Makoy Center on your right.

#### From the South, I-71

Take I-71 North from South of Columbus to Exit 102, I-270 West (Dayton) proceed 12.3 miles on I-270 to Exit 13B Cemetery Rd, exit westbound and proceed 2.1 miles to Main St. Turn right and continue 1/4 mile to Center St, turn left and go two blocks to the Makoy Center on your right.

Note: There is no stop light or stop sign at Main St and Center St, follow the Bike Path

Bill Patterson

**Bill Patterson** is a nationally known expert on the news media. He has presented over 1,200 workshops, seminars and speeches on how to better use and understand the media. His entire 42-year professional career has been involved with the media.

He is Founder of Reputation Management Associates in Columbus, Ohio. RMA specializes in written and verbal communication, offering ten workshops involving media response training and speech and presentational skills coaching. Patterson is also a consultant to companies and organizations on news media strategy and crisis management planning.

Patterson began his career as a newscaster in 1962 and was quickly named News Director of WTVN Radio, Columbus. He remained the city's top-rated news executive until he left broadcasting in 1984 to become Vice President of Reputation Management at HMS Partners, then the largest communications agency in Ohio. In 1998, Patterson formed Reputation Management Associates to concentrate on media training, speech coaching and crisis consulting.

Patterson holds a Bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism from Ohio University and a Master's degree in journalism from Ohio State University. He has taught journalism at Ohio State University and Otterbein College, and currently serves as a guest lecturer at Ohio University. He has received over 30 journalism and public relations awards during his career as a professional communicator. He has had dozens of articles published in various national publications and is the author of the booklet, How to Use the News Media to Your Advantage.


