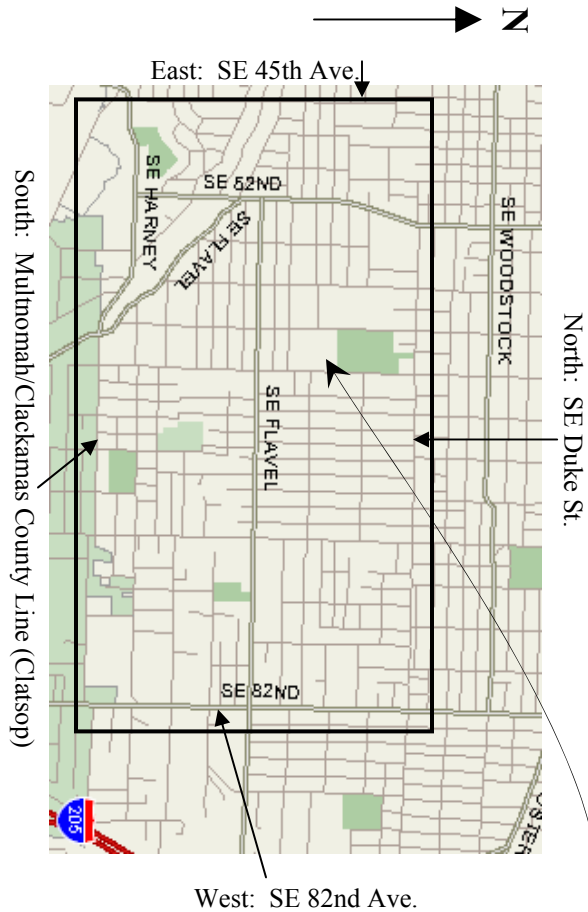


Neighborhood Association Map

WHAT IS A NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION?

A neighborhood association is a segment of Portland that covers at least 100 acres and at least 200 households. An association represents the neighborhood and has a status of "Recognized" by the City of Portland. The City provides financial support through District Coalitions. District Coalitions are umbrella organizations under which groups of neighborhood associations are organized. We don't discriminate against anyone—as neighbors working together, we represent the voice of the neighborhood.

BRENTWOOD-DARLINGTON NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION HISTORY

Our association started as the Errol Heights Improvement Association in 1974. We became a neighborhood association in 1986. Les Ryther Jr. was on the first association board.

We have been doing Clean-Up Days off and on since 1987.

The old Errol Heights community was made up of the following neighborhoods:

The association has been involved with improving parks, annexation, developing a neighborhood plan, safety action team, developing the Brentwood-Darlington Community Center, Cheap and Skinny Streets, and Green Thumb Projects.
