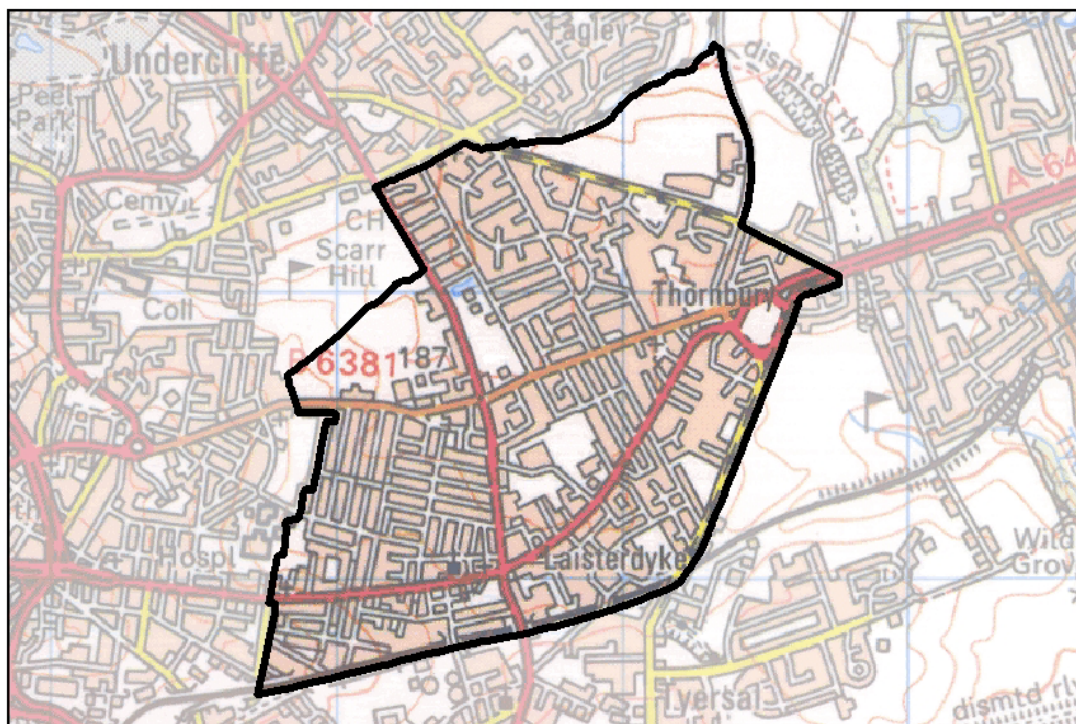


CENSUS 2001 BRADFORD DISTRICT WARD PROFILES

6. Bradford Moor

Bradford Moor is the smallest ward in the District. It lies on the District's border with Leeds. It is largely a built up area with both residential and commercial development. The boundaries of the ward are very similar to those of the old one.



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Population

The population of Bradford Moor is 18,393. It has a very youthful population profile. Over one third of the population is under 15 years of age and over ½ under the age of 24. Only 22.6% of the population is over 45 years of age. The District average is 36.1%.

Household Composition

Pensioner households account for only 13.5% of households in Bradford Moor. Nearly one third of all households comprise a couple with dependent children. This is higher than the average for the District – 22.4%. The proportion of lone parent families in this ward (10%) is also higher than the District average.

(1) A dependent child is a person in a household aged 0 - 15 years (whether or not in a family) or a person aged 16-18 years who is a full-time student in a family with their parent(s).

Household Characteristics

In Bradford Moor, there are more overcrowded households than the District average. 18.5% of all households are overcrowded compared to 8.3% for the District as a whole. Nearly ½ of all the households in this ward do not have central heating or the sole use of a bath and inside toilet. Nearly ½ are without a car/van and considering the youthful age profile of the ward a surprisingly large proportion of households have at least one person with a long term illness, 44.1% of households, compared to 36.4% for the District as a whole.

(1)The figures for the 2004 wards have been calculated by aggregating output area data. Output areas are small areas of between 100 and 125 households. Due to the rounding of this information for confidentiality reasons, the total household figure in this table varies slightly from the figure in the previous table.

(2) Overcrowding is defined as the number of households having one room too few for the household. A single person household is assumed to require two 'common' rooms (not including a bathroom) and a bedroom. Families are assumed to require two 'common' rooms (not including a bathroom) and a bedroom for each couple, lone parent, any other person over 16 years, each pair aged 10-15 years of the same sex, each pair formed from a remaining person aged 10-15 years and a child aged under 10 of the same sex, each pair of children aged 10 years and under and each remaining person. This is the definition of overcrowding used by government.

(3) Households without central heating or sole use of a bath and inside toilet.

(4) People who responded 'yes' to the question 'Do you have any long term illness, health problems or disability which limits your daily activities or the work you can do?' A prompt asked people to include any problems due to old age.

Housing Type

Terraced houses account for 63.2% of the housing stock in this ward. 23.1% of all dwellings are semi-detached houses and 10.1% flats, conversions or shared dwellings

Housing Tenure

64.2% of all households in this ward are homeowners. 16.9% of households rent accommodation from a social housing provider. The proportion of households who live in privately rented accommodation is 18.9%, compared to a District average of 12%.

Work ⁽¹⁾

In Bradford Moor, less than ½ of all people between the age of 16 and 74 are either working or seeking work (economically active). This is lower than the District average of 63.4%. The percentage of people who are economically active but unemployed is 17.5%. This is considerably higher than the District average of 6.9%.

Of those who are economically inactive in this age range, only 13.9% are retired, compared to 35% for the District as a whole. Nearly one third are economically inactive because their main role is looking after their families/home. This is higher than the District average of 20.9%. 17.3% of the economically inactive are students and 16.5% are permanently sick or disabled. A significant proportion of people are economically inactive for other reasons - 20%.

Unemployment ⁽¹⁾

32.2% of the unemployed in this ward have not worked for two or more years. This is higher than the District average of 31.9%. ¼ of those who are unemployed have never worked and 37.5% are under 24 years of age. This is higher than the District average of 32.3%.

Qualifications ⁽¹⁾

Over ½ of the population in this ward aged between 16 and 74 have no formal qualifications. This is higher than the District average of 35.1%. Only 8.9% have a professional / degree level qualification, compared to 15.9% for the District as a whole.

Ethnic group

Over ½ of the people living in this ward describe themselves as having Pakistani ethnic origins. 30.5% describe themselves as White, 6.5% as Indian and 3.5% as Bangladeshi.

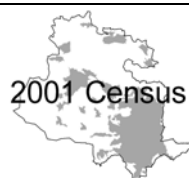
Health and unpaid caring

In the 2001 Census, 11.4% of the population in this ward described their health as 'not good'. The average for the Bradford District is 10.1%. 18.2% of the population have a long term illness that limits their daily activities. This may include any problems related to old age. This is slightly lower than the District average of 18.5%. In terms of unpaid care, 9% of the population provide some form of unpaid care. The percentage of carers who provide over 50 hours of unpaid care a week is nearly 30%. This is higher than the District average of 21.9%.
