The Bell Difference

We hear it all the time: “I’ve paddled a (insert brand here) for years, but I recently paddled a Bell and that’s the boat for me.” We’ve never heard the opposite. There must be a reason ...

Bell Canoe Works has spent nearly twenty years designing, redesigning, testing, researching and experimenting for one reason; to produce the best canoe possible. So what makes Bell canoes uniquely superior?

Differential Rocker: Simply put, differential rocker means more rocker in the bow than the stern – approximately one inch more. The added rocker in the bow helps the boat turn, while less rocker in the stern helps the boat track. A boat with little or no rocker in the bow has a tendency to punch through waves, rather than up and over. The end result is an asymmetrical, seaworthy hull that tracks well – the perfect combination.

Elliptical Cross Center: Also known as a constant radius bottom, an elliptical cross center guarantees constant stability. Primary and secondary stabilities mantras of the past when talking about Bell hull design. Bell hulls are predictably stable throughout the lean.

Shouldered Flare: The Bell signature. Shouldered

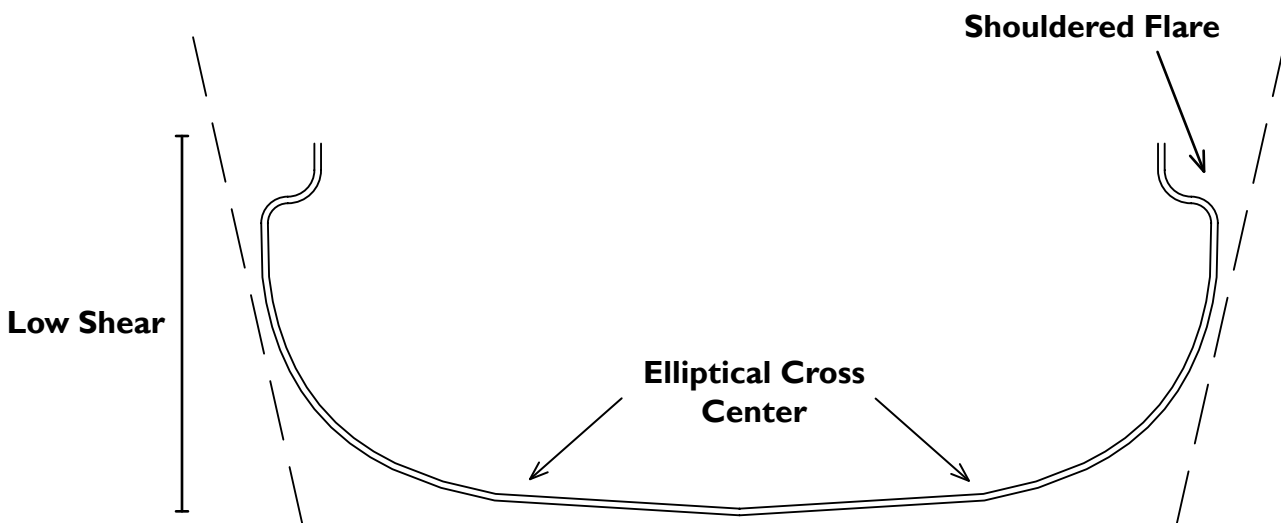
flare is what separates Bell from the competition. If you’re looking for a dry canoe, constant flare is what you need. The problem is that constant flare

results in an extremely wide, uncomfortable boat. Bell canoes are flared to within 2 inches of the gunwale, then shouldered back toward the paddler, bringing you comfortably close to the water.

Low Shear: Have you ever paddled a high-sided canoe in a stiff breeze and felt like a kite off its string? You’ll never have that sensation in a Bell canoe. The shouldered flare keeps the boat dry, but also reduces the profile of the boat making it less prone to debilitating cross wind.

That sounds swell, but what does it all mean!!? Paddling a Bell boils down to efficiency. Sure, it’s great to drive 100 mph, but you’re not going to get 50 miles per gallon doing it. If you’re looking for a stable, predictable, dry, low-profile, lightweight, durable, efficient canoe that looks as good in a photo as it paddles on the water, choose a Bell.



Choose Your Own Adventure



Congratulations. You've given it some thought and you want to paddle a canoe. There's something about the mist rising off an early morning lake, the waves crashing off the bow, the wildlife you just can't reach on foot, that makes you tick; paddling is your adventure, and Bell can help you decide which adventure is for you.

Royalex or Composite? This decision may be the biggest influence on the outcome of your adventure. Are you looking for a high performance canoe to explore the Boundary Waters, portage over long distances, and something durable yet lightweight? A composite canoe is your answer. If you'd rather picture yourself cruising down rivers, bouncing off a few rocks, perhaps even boost the adrenaline with a little whitewater (while saving a few bucks), then Royalex is your material of choice.

Royalex

You've got a budget in mind, but still want a canoe that outperforms the rest on the market, right? This is the path to take. Think about what kind of water you're most likely to encounter: lakes and slow, calm waters; rivers, including some tame rapids; or full fledged whitewater? *Choose.*

1. *Lakes:* If lakes are your destination, you've narrowed your perfect boat down to three choices: the **Angler**, the **MorningStar** or the **NorthWind**. If paddling to you means bigger fish, better ducks, or a closer look at the wildlife, gear up in the **Angler**. Looking for a day or weekend trip, perhaps bring along the kids and a dog, the **MorningStar** is the boat for you. Looking for a little more capacity, and maybe a little longer trip? Paddle the **NorthWind**.

2. *Rivers:* Current is your friend. Sometimes it's nice to just

guide the canoe rather than propel the canoe. Paddling solo? The **Yellowstone Solo** is your boat. Taking a friend along for the casual cruise, perhaps an extended weekend? Paddle the **Yellowstone**. Fancy yourself a modern-day explorer, toting lots of gear and constantly seeking the next adventure? The **Alaskan** will take you there.

3. *Whitewater:* Cool. If you're lucky enough to find a partner to paddle whitewater with, then you'll never be happier in tandem than in a **Nexus**. If you're more likely to go it alone, the choice is easy: experienced paddlers looking to carve it up opt for the **Ocoee**; beginner to intermediate paddlers still wetting the paddle, go with the **Prodigy**. A little beefier around the middle? **Prodigy X**. Dig it.

Composite

Efficiency. Fine entry lines. Lightweight yet durable. 30 year life expectancy. If these qualities matter to you, a composite canoe is the answer, and your adventure begins here. *Choose one:* 1. *Double-Blade Solo Touring*, 2. *Solo Touring*, 3. *Tandem Touring*, or 4. *Classic Design*.

1. *Double-Blade Solo Touring:* You appreciate the efficiency and design of a canoe, but tend to pick up a kayak paddle before your single-bladed stick. If you're somewhat of a traditionalist and an Adirondack pack boat whets your whistle, take home the 19 lb. **Bucktail**. If you're looking for a recreational kayak for lightweight backcountry travel, paddle a **Rob Roy 12**. If speed and capacity take precedence, the **Rob Roy 15** will take you there, wherever there may be.

2. *Solo Touring:* 14', 15' or 16'? Nimble explorer, all-purpose performance canoe, or the pocket rocket turned fully loaded tripper? It's that simple. **Yellowstone Solo**, **Merlin II**, or **Magic**. The choice is yours.

3. *Tandem Touring:* Sedan, Sedan Sport, station wagon, or full-sized SUV. If you're paddling tandem, there's a Bell to fit your every need.

The **MorningStar** handles medium loads and is ideal for the weekend cabin excursion.

Looking to add a little spice to that weekend excursion,

perhaps a little solo paddling? Take a seat in the **NorthStar**. Freedom never tasted so good.

Does your adventure culminate with the ultimate touring canoe that handles large loads, performs like a dream and leaves room for the dog? There's a reason the **NorthWind** is the most popular performance canoe.

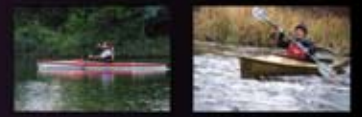
If you have it, bring it. Two kids, a dog, camp chairs, extra tent, bacon, eggs, and butter for your toast. You'll never have to choose between the stout or the lager when you paddle a **NorthWoods** – bring it all.

4. *Classics:* There's something about the recurved stems of a classic wood-canvas canoe that settles the nerves, but those inklings to paddle traditionally quickly fade after you throw out your back portaging all that weight. That's why Bell offers the Classics series. These designs have endured the test of time, but are now available in the same ultralight performance materials the rest of the Bell line boasts. The **Chestnut Prospector** (also available in Royalex®) is the only "Prospector" commissioned by the Chestnut Canoe Company – no kidding. Think of the **Chestnut Prospector** with a little less rocker, and the **Seliga Tripper** is what you get. Designed by Joe Seliga of Ely Minnesota, we're proud to add his legacy to the Bell adventure.

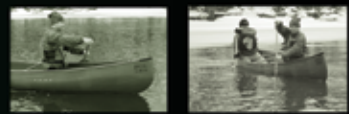

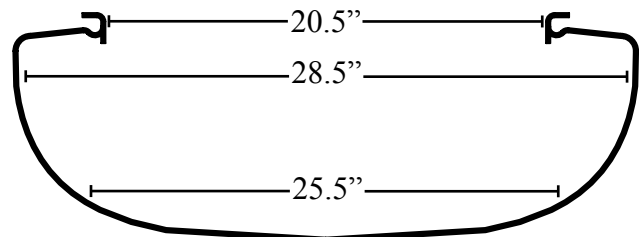

Feast your eyes on the Rob Roy 12! The lil’ buddy of the Rob Roy 15, this twelve foot ultralight puts you on the water quicker and easier. At a mere 26 pounds in the KevLight layup (as seen on left), car-topping, portaging, and day paddling are a breeze.

So, is it a kayak, or a decked canoe? The simple answer is; whatever you want it to be. With the seat placed on the floor of the hull, paddling with a double-bladed paddle is easy and efficient. Flip the boat over and take a look at the hull design and you’ll notice it boasts the same design characteristics that make Bell canoes the best on the market - **differential rocker, elliptical cross-section hull, and precision craftsmanship.**
