Man has squeezed earth dry: Expert



Eminent environmental scientist Prof K P Singh, on 27 February, said overexploitation of natural resources was posing serious problems for mankind. He was addressing the inaugural function of a two day National Science Day Programme organised by the School of Biotechnology in the Science Faculty.

He remarked about the discovery of Raman Effect by the late Prof C V Raman. He said the temperature had increased by 6 degree Celsius due to global warming in the last 50 years. Lack of awareness and population explosion were the main reasons for such problems, he said. He also talked about deforestation, bio-diversity, the adverse effect of pesticides and global warming

He asked students to extend support to conservation efforts and stressed the need for steps to check overexploitation of natural resources.

Earlier, Prof Ashok Kumar, Coordinator, School of Biotechnology welcomed the guests.

Prof B D Singh introduced the theme of the programme. Institute of Technology Director Prof S N Upadhyay and Science Faculty Dean Prof P Chandra also addressed the inaugural function. Prof Anil Kumar Tripathi proposed the vote of thanks.

Over 200 students of 13 city schools participated in the programme, Most of them displayed models and posters on the environment. A large number of posters and models suggested ways to avoid environmental problems.

India on the Silk Road

A two day International seminar on Indian on the Silk Route was organized by the Dept of Foreign Languages and the BJK Institute of Buddhist and Asian Studies on February 27 to 28. It was attended by 17 eminent scholars from Japan, China, Belgium and France as well as from different parts of India. The seminar was inaugurated by Prof S L Jain, Dean, Faculty of Arts and was presided by Prof T K Biswas, Director. Bharat Kala Bhavan. Participants were welcomed by Dr Vinodanand Tiwari, Head of Foreign Languages Dept Prof Kamal Sheel, convener of the seminar, at the outset highlighted the importance of research on the Silk road and its continued importance for India.

It was the conduit for the flow of ideas and material goods between India and China and also rest of Asia. It historically established the international image of India. In his keynote address, Prof Eiichi Ishigami of Tokyo University highlighted Japan's linkages with the Silk Road and exhibited materials preserved in Imperial museum. Prof Vanput of Belgium discussed Xuan Zang's trip to Nalanda. Prof Vershauer (France) examined the impact of Silk Road on Japan. Among other significant papers were those by Prof Fujia Reio (Kyushu), Matsukubo Shyin (Nara), K Sugimoto (Osaka), Prof C Willemen (Royal Academy, Belgium), Prof Ghoble, Prof Rajiv Sinha, Dr Supriya Rai, Dr Pandit, etc. In his valedictory address, Prof H P Ray of Asiatic Society, Kolkata drew attention to the Northeastern portion of the Silk Road and its historical and present importance. Dr Lalji proposed vote of thanks.

Stress for geriatric care

Delivering the SM Marwah Oration on the inaugural function of a two-day Continuing Medical Education (CME) on 'Health Care of Elderly' at K N Udupa auditorium on 22 February. Head of the geriatric unit in the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (New Delhi) Prof A B Dey said, "Old age is not a curse but could prove to be a boon if your approach is positive."

The Medicine Department of the Institute of Medical Sciences has organised the programme in collaboration with the World Health Organization and Government of India.

Prof Dey said that adequate preventive measures were required after the age of 60 to live a cheerful old age. He said that generally old age was considered a curse because of various health and psychological complications but proper health assistance and a positive approach could change the phenomenon." We in India do not plan for our older life and that causes enormous difficulties," he said, advocating adequate old age plans to counter various problems, including a provision of medical expenditure for old age.

"In India, two out of three persons above the age of 60 are striving for survival whereas 87 per cent aged people suffer from acute problems of some kind", he said, adding that older people had common illnesses in large numbers.

He informed that blindness, deafness, arthritis, osteoporosis, generative diseases, mental ill health, decline in sensory system and metabolic syndrome were most common among people above the age of 60 in India. Earlier, Vice-Chancellor Prof Panjab Singh inaugurated the programme.

NAAC delegation

A twelve member delegation of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) was on a four-day visit to the Banaras Hindu University to assess the academic standard of this University.

Headed by a former vice chancellor of Pune University, Prof. Ashok S Kolhaskar, the NAAC delegation landed in BHU on 24 April and stayed till 27th April.

Prof Ashok S Kolhaskar, Prof B M Hegde and Prof S C Shetty were in 'A' team whereas Prof I V Subbarao and Prof B L Singhania were in 'B' team. Prof B Ramamurti, Prof Vishwanath N Das and Prof A Q Contractor were in 'C team Prof C Thangamuttu, Prof Sharmishtha Panja, Prof Jagdish C Bhatia and Prof Ranveer Singh were in the 'D team.

Infant mortality rate high in India

More than 9 million neo-natal deaths occurred each year across the world, out of which 98 per cent were reported in developing countries alone, said Head of the Pediatrics Department in the Institute of Medical Sciences (IMS), Prof B D Bhatia.

Speaking on the inauguration of an advanced neo natal intensive care unit at Sir Sunderlal Hospital in BHU on 22 February, Prof Bhatia highlighted infant mortality across the world.

He said that about 34 of every 1000 live born babies suffered neo-natal death (from birth to one month). "Neo-natal deaths account for twothird of deaths in infancy and 40 percent of deaths before the age of 5 years," he said, adding that the major causes of neo-natal death were infections, preterm delivery and asphysia, "Important indirect causes include low birth weight and hypothermia." Prof Bhatia said that the newly established neo natal intensive care

unit comprised of advanced equipment to extend facilities of artificial ventilator support, warmers, syringe pumps, photo-therapy, monitors etc.

He said that they would admit the newly born babies within 28 days of their birth. "There are 25 beds for newly born babies and 5 for their

The unit has been established with a sum of more than Rs.30 lakh," he informed. Addressing the gathering, BHU Vice-Chancellor Prof Panjab Singh, who inaugurated the unit, expressed the hope that the neo-natal care unit would serve the masses and help in bringing down infant mortality. IMS Director Prof Gajendra Singh expressed concern over the infant mortality rate across the country in general and in Uttar Prades in Particular. Prof Singh also promised to extend financial support of Rs.30 lakh for establishing pediatric emergency and intensive care unit.

Evening clinic begins

Authorities of the Banaras Hindu University introduced the much awaited 'evening clinic' at the Sir Sunderlal Hospital from 15 July evening.

Vice Chancellor Prof Panjab Singh inaugurated clinic and lauded efforts of the authorities of the SS Hospital affiliated to the Institute of Medical Sciences in patient care.

Prof Panjab Singh said services at the SS Hospital were being improved and the prestigious hospital would soon be equipped with a 'Hospital Information System' (HIS).

The 'Evening Clinic' would now run from 4.30pm to 6.30pm (except Sunday and holidays) in the out patient department (OPD) ward of the Hospital in which expert consultants of IMS-BHU would render their services to the needy.

Patients will have to pay Rs.200 to themselves diagnosed by senior consultants. Around 24 expert consultants would render their services at the clinic and each would diagnose a maximum of 25 patients per day.

Director of Institute of Medical Sciences, Prof. Gajendra Singh welcomed the guests and highlighted the facilities of the evening clinic. Deputy Registrar M R Pathak conducted the programmed and Medical Superintendent of SS Hospital, Prof Saroj Churamani Gopal proposed a formal vote of thanks.

Around 15 crore populace of Eastern Uttar Pradesh, some parts of Bihar, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh and Chattisgarh get benefitted by the services of the BHU hospital.

The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs

had approved the proposal to accord AIIMS status to 13 medical institutes including Institute of Medical Sciences-Banaras Hindu University across the country at a cost of Rs. I 5.6 billion, recently.

Ganges Civilization

A seminar on Studies on the 'Ganges Civilization', Shifting Paradigm was organised by Department of Ancient Indian History, Culture & Archeology on 10-12 February. It was concluded that much data has been added to the history and archaeology of the Gangetic Plain since Sir Mortimer Wheeler first used the term the 'Ganges Civilization'. New dimensions have been added to the history of cultures of the Ganga Plain. The dynamics of Interpretations of historical events and processes of cultural development have acquired new angles with availability of ever increasing evidence as a consequence of researches going on in the region. New chronologies have been located adding to the knowledge of cultures of the Ganga Plain. Influx of the Harappan tradition in the Ganga Plain away from its epicentre has been testified in a positive way. These facts and many more call for a fresh look at the pattern of growth of cultures in Gangetic Plain. Fresh paradigms of cultural interpretations have also emerged.

The seminar proposed to underline all the important issues of culture and archaeology of the Ganga Plain. Some of the broad themes identified as under:

- 1. Socio-Economic and Religious dimensions of cultures of the Gangetic Plain.
- 2. Contributions of Epigraphy, Palaeography and Numismatic studies

- 3. Art and Architecture
- Science & Technology: Recent Re-searches
- Archaeology of the Ganga Plain: New Perspectives
- 6. Chronology of Cultures of Ganga Plain. The convener of the Programme Prof Vibha Tripathi (HOD) proposed vote of thanks.

Use religion to bring peace

Religion is as important for varanasi as life and we need to use religion for bringing peace rather than to spread violence. Interfaith dialogue and discussions are important to know the ways in which religions are used to spread violence and not peace. Varanasi is known for respecting sentiments between traditional and modern thinking on social conditions. This was suggested at an international training workshop on 'Crafting peace through citizen's or multitrack diplomacy' concluded at the Malaviya Centre for Peace Research on 27 March. The workshop was led by an eminent scholar and practitioner of conflict resolution Dr. John Davies, the Director of the Centre for International Development and Conflict Management at the University of Maryland, USA. The three level in the workshop started with identifying needs, fears and concerns of citizens in a conflict-torn societies.

The workshop highlighted the promotion of self-restraint, disbelief in rumours, not passing on the rumours, restraint to be observed by political parties. The need to strengthen security mechanism, emergency health services, upgrade first aid facilities in public places, install closed circuit cameras in sensitive areas, ensure security response do not disrupt public life was also highlighted.

Leaders of both parties in conflict should issue joint statement. The society at Varanasi needs more peace volunteers for conflict management and in this hour of grief the victims need fair distribution of relief in which NGOs can actively participate. The role of media should be to bridge the communication gap and to convey the truth about what is happening not rumours to promote peace in a conflict-torn city. Reform in administrative levels is the need of hour to encourage people for better reporting joint music concerts need to be organised and common platform for all is needed to meet, negotiate and promote communal harmony. With traditional media help organising of street plays across the city on the crisis situation can promote sustaining

In Banaras Hindu University, as per the tradition, the Vice-Chancellor Prof Panjab Singh offered prayer at the Goddess Saraswati idol at university foundation site in the morning and then he reached Women's College to see the ongoing Basant Panchami festival.

peace at Varanasi. The workshop also suggested an expansion and strengthening peace communities to promote public vigilance in reporting suspicious acts and activities. Varanasi needs more peace march of intellectual and other communities for faith in the society. Promote role of women in peace making.

In the long run reforms in the social and religious setting were suggested through educational measures. Education reforms are needed to promote respect for human values, shared cultures and coexistence. Critical thinking of such Saints Kabir and Buddha will be useful to the people of city to identify issues that create disharmony among various groups so that they will help others rather than blaming. There was consensus that culture of blame needs to be discouraged and we need to understand the motives behind violent incidents and also need to understand why people choose violence to promote change. In the aftermath of globalisation the people are moving towards consumerism, materialism and the culture of get rich quicker in Varanasi that should be discouraged to make peoplefriendly.

They should also take some self responsibilities to promote peace forgetting their grief. Special consideration should be given to the reasoning behind actions of those most affected and most vulnerable. Marginalised people need to be brought into mainstream economically and socially and they need to be made aware about the disadvantage of the violence. Caste domination was criticised and change feudal and pariarchal mindset was argued.

In the valedictory function, the Dean Prof P N Pandey thanked the centre for holding such workshop, while Prof Priyankar Upadhyay, Coordinator of centre concluded the seminar.

IMS plans expansion



The Faculty of Ayurveda, under it's expansion plan is going to build a new 125 bedded hospital on the campus. The dean, Prof Manjari Dwivedi said that they ayurveda faculty, which consists of eight academic departments and 15 degree giving divisions, is going to expand it's strength and activities. The creation of six new departments was under process and it was expected that the President of India, would give his approval soon. A team of Central Council of Indian Medicine had visited to take stock of the available facilities.

Emphasis was on the 'ksharsutra therapy,' developed by this faculty to treat the patients of ano-rectal disease. About 10000 patients including foreigners were treated every year with this therapy, she said. Dravya-gun department of the faculty has a nursery of rare medicinal plants and herbs. The ayurvedic pharmacy is also gearing up to increase the production and sale of ayurvedic medicines, said. National Botanical Research Institute has given an order of the supply of ayurvedic medicines worth of Rs. 90000.

Good news for those looking for a mix of ayurvedic medication supported with yoga and meditation to get rid of physical as well as mental problems. Banaras Hindu University plans to soon offer these facilities.

The Faculty of Ayurveda, Institute of Medical Sciences in collaboration with the tourism department plans to introduce a unique concept of 'medical tourism' by offering different healing packages. Prof Manjari Dwivedi, the Dean of Ayurveda Faculty, said that 'the state government had sanctioned a fund of Rs.3.5 crore for the establishment of an advanced centre of Ayurveda combined with yoga and meditation. We will offer ayurvedic health packages ranging from one week to several months depending on the type and condition of the ailments." Dwivedi added that the people suffering from different chronic diseases would be treated at this centre.

She said that the proposed centre of ayurveda and yoga would have all necessary components including 'panchkarma and meditation' to cure all chronic diseases. Besides, it would also help in removing the misconception or wrong information about ayurvedic treatment from peoples mind. She added that it would also be instrumental in promoting the concept of 'medical tourism'

Importance of systems biology

"Systems Biology is an emerging field which integrates biological experiments with large scale data analysis and quantitative modelling" said prof Ramakrishna Ramaswamy of School of Information and Technology, Jawaharlal Nehru University (New Delhi).

Delivering the inaugural address of a three day national seminar and workshop on 'Bioinformatics and Computational Biology' at Mahila Mahavidyalaya on 23 March, he said that the main feature of systems biology was quantification. "Its focus is on systems that are composed molecular components. Although systems are composed of matter; the emphasis of this very field lies in dynamics such as cellular metabolism or interconnections", he said. He also talked about different networks, importance of networks, systems biology of cancer and also the possible designing of drugs.

"Understanding some elements such as structure of the systems (gene regulatory and biochemical networks as well as physical structures), dynamics of the system (both qualitative and quantitative analysis), this actually gives construction of the theory, model with powerful prediction capability), control methods of system and design method of the system (this brings engineers and biologists to work together) etc. are very necessary", he said.

Prof Ramaswamy also discussed chemical interaction in a system such as protein-gene interaction, protein-protein interaction and genome etc. he said that the connectivities and topologies of the network determined their properties. Seminar convener Prof Uma Jaiswal established the theme of the seminar and said that applying network methods to information and metabolomics that could help in analyzing growing databanks for pathogens, plant and

उच्च शिक्षा के मसले पर भारत सबसे बड़ा राष्ट्र : डा.पंजाब

नरेन्द्रदेव कृषि एवं प्रौद्योगिक विश्वविद्यालय के दसवें दीक्षांत समारोह में मुख्य अतिथि काशी हिन्दू विश्वविद्यालय के कुलपति डा. पंजाब सिंह ने कहा कि अन्य देशों की तूलना में भारत उच्च शिक्षा के लिहाज से सबसे बड़ा राष्ट्र बन गया है। बीते पांच दशकों में 25 की जगह 342 विश्वविद्यालय, साढे 17 हजार से ज्यादा महाविद्यालय हैं।
