# Provincial Politics THE ADQ MAKES HEADWAY IN FOUR QUÉBEC REGIONS

# **ANALYSIS REPORT Publication Date: March 2, 2007**

#### Methodology

This study was conducted by Leger Marketing through telephone interviews among 3,101 Quebeckers from February 25 to February 28, 2007. The maximum margin of error obtained for a sample of this size is  $\pm$  1.8% 19 times out of 20. Depending on the region, margins of error vary between 4% and 7%.

Using data from Statistics Canada, the final results were weighted according to gender, age, mother tongue and region to ensure a sample representative of the Québec population.



#### 1. Voting Intentions Tighten Up

If elections had been held in Québec between February 24 and February 28, the Liberal Party would have obtained 36% of the vote, the Parti Québécois would have received 29% of the vote and 25% of voters would have been in favour of the Action démocratique. The other parties would have shared 11% of the vote: 5% for Québec solidaire, 5% for the Green Party and 1% for the other parties.

Voting intentions in Québec are stable since Léger Marketing's last poll conducted from February 21 to February 24. The gap between the PLQ and the PQ has narrowed from nine to seven points, but the ADQ strengthens is base by obtaining 25% of voting intentions (compared to 24% during the last poll).

The Parti Québécois is leading among Francophones, but the lead is slim (33% versus 28%). Moreover, the PLQ seems to have made a recovery among non-Francophones, where it obtains 71% of voting intentions in comparison with 63% at the last poll. The PQ has also taken the lead on the ADQ among non-Francophones (12% versus 9%).



## Quebec Regions could Drop the PQ, Sometimes for the Liberals, Sometimes for the ADQ

- Montreal East could give its best score to Québec Solidaire, which obtains 10% of voting intentions in this region.
- Liberals are practically the only ones in the running in the Western part of the island, with 61% of voting intentions. The Parti Québécois (17%) takes the lead over the ADQ (10%).
- Laval could lean towards the Liberals, while a tight three-way race is being contested in Montérégie.
- In the West, Outaouais remains a Liberal bastion and Abitibi a PQ bastion.
- > The PQ is third in the Mauricie and Centre-du-Québec regions
- PQ supporters and Liberals supporters are nearly tied in the Townships.
- > The race is extremely tight in the Capitale-Nationale, where the three parties are practically tied.
- > The ADQ leads in the Chaudière-Appalaches region.
- ➤ The PLQ is turning up the heat on the PQ in Saguenay-Lac-St-Jean.
- The PLQ has a comfortable lead in the Bas-St-Laurent and Gaspésie regions

## 3. **45% of Voters could Change their Minds**

The vote remains extremely volatile: 45% of voters could switch parties from now until the election. The proportion of voters who reserve the right to change their minds is statistically comparable in all regions, except in Saguenay-Lac-St-Jean and the Côte-Nord regions where a greater number of voters say their choice is final (59%). Moreover, Liberal (59%) and PQ (58%) voters seem to have made their decision, unlike ADQ voters with only 48% saying their choice is final.

## 4. The Best Québec Premier: Boisclair Still Lagging Behind

Jean Charest and Mario Dumont are in a tight race to merit the title of who would make the best Premier of Québec. Charest was chosen by 30% of voters and Dumont by 26%. André Boisclair trails behind with 19%.
