# Undergraduate Enrollment Growth at U. T. Academic Institutions 

## Trends

1. Undergraduate enrollment at U. T. System academic institutions grew by $22.3 \%$ between fall 2000 and fall 2005, an increase of 25,753 students.
2. Without U. T. Austin, which is operating under enrollment management controls and is decreasing enrollment, U. T. System undergraduate enrollment increased by 35.8\%.
3. Undergraduate Hispanic enrollment grew by 16,114 students. This increase is more than five times greater than any other ethnic group. The growth rate from fall 2000 to 2005 for Hispanic undergraduates was 37.8\%. Their representation increased from 37.0\% in fall 2000 to $41.7 \%$ in fall 2005, making them the largest ethnic group at the undergraduate level.
4. The enrollment growth rate for undergraduate African American students was 39.9\%, a net increase of 2,189 students. These students comprised $5.4 \%$ of undergraduates in fall 2005, up from $4.8 \%$ in fall 2000.
5. White undergraduate student enrollment grew at a much slower rate (5.5\%) with a net increase of 2,858 students. White students comprised 39.0\% of undergraduates in fall 2005, down from $45.2 \%$ in 2000.
6. While the numbers of undergraduate men and women grew by $21.8 \%$ and $22.8 \%$ respectively, the relative proportion of men and women on U. T. System campuses changed very little from 2000 to 2005 (e. g. there were 53.9\% women in fall 2000 and $54.1 \%$ women in fall 2005).
7. U. T. San Antonio experienced the largest undergraduate enrollment growth, a net increase of 7,156 students.
8. U.T. Tyler had the fastest growing undergraduate student population, increasing by more than $70 \%$.
