KARAOKE TO THE STARS

Russell Brand guest presented a 'money can't buy' auction, run under the auspices of Harry Delmeny of Sotheby's. Guests were able to bid for once in a lifetime renditions of songs performed by some of the world's leading musical artists. Bryan Adams kicked off proceedings with a rousing 'Rocking All Over The World', swiftly followed by Shane McGowan's somewhat unique interpretation of Billy Joel's 'We Didn't Start the Fire'. Mick Jones brought the house down with 'Should I Stay Or Should I Go', whilst Lulu led a trio of Sharleen Spiteri, Chrissie Hynde and Sam Taylor Wood on backing vocals with an incredible 'Shout'. Nick Cave commanded a staggering £70,000 to perform Destiny's Child 'Bootilicious' whilst James Blunt volunteered at the last minute to sing 'Summertime' to Jools Holland's brilliant piano accompaniment. All that was left was for Elton John to wrap up what must have been the world's most unlikely karaoke session with a powerful rendition of 'Are You Lonesome Tonight'.
