

His Majesty's Visit to the Republic of Singapore

"Common aspirations for peace and stability through good governance"


His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and Her Majesty Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajah Saleha made a two-day visit to the Republic of Singapore from 26 to 28 January 2005.

The highlight of the visit was the conferment of an Honorary Doctorate of Law to His Majesty by His Excellency President S.R. Nathan, the Chancellor of the National University of Singapore on 27 January. The Honorary Degree was awarded in recognition of His Majesty's achievements in leading Brunei Darussalam and outstanding contributions to relations between Singapore and Brunei Darussalam.

The citation of the conferment was read by the Deacon of the Law Faculty, Professor Tan Cheng Han. The citation praised His Majesty's outstanding leadership which had brought peace, progress and prosperity to Brunei Darussalam. Brunei Darussalam, the citation stated, was seen as a responsible and committed member of the international community as a result of His Majesty's diplomatic skills.

In accepting the Honorary Doctorate, His Majesty expressed the appreciation of Brunei Darussalam for the excellent relations enjoyed with the Republic of Singapore. His Majesty noted the common aspirations of the people of Singapore and Brunei Darussalam for peace, stability through good governance and expressed the belief that good governance required a commitment to both the Rule of Law and to tolerance.

The awarding of such Honorary Degree is made to individuals who have rendered outstanding contributions to the University or to the community. The Doctorate of Law is one of two honorary degrees awarded by the National University of Singapore

During the visit, His Majesty and the Singapore Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong held a consultative meeting and exchanged views on ways of enhancing bilateral relations and discussed regional and international affairs.

His Majesty's Visit to Aceh Provice, Indonesia

"Concern on humanity goes beyond Brunei Darussalam's border"

Following the earthquake and tsunami that struck many Indian Oceans countries on 26 December 2004, Brunei Darussalam pledged \$6 million in humanitarian aid to communities affected.

On 1 February 2005, His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam visited Aceh Province in Indonesia to see personally the effects of the disaster.

His Majesty was the first foreign Head of state to visit the region following the disaster. His Majesty was briefed by the Coordinating Minister for People's Welfare, His Excellency Dr. Alwi Shihab, the Vice Governor of the Aceh Province, Haji Azwar Abu Bakar and local officials.

His Majesty first visited the beach area in Banda Aceh and the Baitur Rahman and Baitur Rahim Mosques where he presented copies of the Al-Quran. From Banda Aceh, His Majesty left for Sabang in Weh Island to be briefed by the head of the relief contingent from Brunei Darussalam stationed in Sabang. This was followed by a meeting with some of the contingent members from the Royal Brunei Armed Forces, the Ministry of Health and the Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Foundation. His Majesty also visited the hospitals where victims of the disaster were treated under the supervision of the medical officers and staff of Brunei's Ministry of Health and the Royal Brunei Armed Forces.

From the Sabang hospital, His Majesty went by helicopter to observe affected areas in the north-western region of Sumatra. His Majesty then stopped over at Tepin Rambot, where the Royal Brunei Armed Forces has its regimental aid post. There are 187 temporary camps in Tepin Rambot which accommodate about 570 occupants.

His Majesty left the Sultan Iskandar Muda Military Airfield, Banda Aceh, in the afternoon after completing the one-day visit ■

His Majesty's Visit to Australia

"A committment to strengthen bilateral cooperation"

On 15 February 2005, His Majesty the Sultan and yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam began a six-day State Visit to Australia at the invitation of the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, Major-General Michael Jeffrey.

The State Visit began with a meeting between His Majesty and the Hon. John Howard, the Prime Minister of Australia at the Prime Minister's Suite at the Parliament House in Canberra. The discussions between His Majesty and the Prime Minister covered a broad range of bilateral and regional issues. Both leaders discussed ways to enhance the relationship between the two countries. They welcomed the close bilateral links existing between the two nations in the fields of education, defence, security, economy, trade and investment. His Majesty and the Prime Minister also acknowledged the close partnership both countries shared in regional and international organisations.

The Prime Minister spoke about the shared vision of Brunei Darussalam and Australia. He also spoke highly of His Majesty's leadership in the region that has witnessed many challenges and successes.

While at the Parliament House, His Majesty also met leader of the opposition, the Hon. Kim Beazley. In supporting the remarks of the Prime Minister, Mr. Beazley recalled his own visit to Brunei Darussalam when he was the Defence Minister and expressed his warm welcome to His Majesty.

His Majesty expressed appreciation for the longstanding friendship and the important role Australians have played in Brunei Darussalam's development. His Majesty also acknowledged Australians' contribution to various areas of cooperation.

During a State Dinner hosted by His Excellency the Governor-General, Maj. Gen. Michael Jeffery and Mrs. Jeffery at the Government House in Canberra, His Majesty stressed that Australia's importance as a regional partner of Brunei Darussalam will continue to be closely linked to Brunei's economic future. His Majesty noted that Brunei Darussalam was also very pleased to be a long-standing regional partner in the ASEAN-Australia dialogue, in APEC and most importantly today, in its efforts to ensure regional security for everyone who lives and works in the Asia-Pacific Region. His Majesty further stated that the state visit is a commitment to strengthen bilateral cooperation and expressed Brunei Darussalam's appreciation and respect for the friendship and contributions made by Australians in all aspects of life in the Asia-Pacific.

On the occasion of the visit, Brunei and Australia signed a Memorandum of Understanding on counter-terrorism signer on behalf of Australia was Mr. Alexander Downer, the Foreign Minister and, on behalf of Brunei Darussalam, by the Minister of Industry and Primary Resources, Pehin Dato Haji Abdul Rahman Taib.

The signing of a Memorandum of Understanding on Cooperation to Combat International Terrorism is seen as a mutual effort to strengthen cooperation on security ■

His Majesty's Visit to Malaysia

"Strengthening the existing close relations and bilateral cooperation"

His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam began a four-day State Visit to Malaysia on Wednesday, 28 April 2005. His Majesty was accompanied by Her Majesty Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajah Saleha. The visit was at the invitation of Yang Di Pertuan Agong Malaysia, Tuanku Syed Sirajuddin Syed Putra Jamalullail in reciprocating the King's visit to Brunei in August 2002.

His Majesty has made several post working visits to Malaysia to strengthen bilateral cooperation and enhance the close relations shared by the two countries. The last of these was in August 1997.

Bilateral cooperation between the two countries includes trade and investment, defence, technical assistance, communications, education, tourism and on the ASEAN sub-economic zone, BIMP-EAGA.

In the afternoon, His Majesty and Her Majesty Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Saleha met YAB Datuk Seri Haji Abdullah Ahmad Badawi , the Prime Minister of Malaysia and his wife Datin Seri Endon Mahmood at the Shangri-la Hotel in Kuala Lumpur .

At a four-eye private meeting between His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and the Prime Minister of Malaysia, the two leaders discussed matters of mutual concern and efforts to enhance bilateral co-operation between the two countries.

On Friday morning, His Majesty toured the Malaysian National Service Programme's Setia Ikhlas Camp in Ulu

Semenyih in Selangor. His Majesty was received by His Highness Sultan Sharafuddin Idris Shah Alhaj, the Sultan of Selangor; and the Deputy Prime Minister of Malaysia, Dato Seri Mohd Najib.

After inspecting the guard-of-honour, His Majesty watched a demonstration of an unarmed combat by 64 members of the National Service and signed a plaque to mark the visit. The National Service training programme was established to enhance communal solidarity, national integration and

the spirit of patriotism Malaysian young people.

In a separate itinerary, Her Majesty the Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajah Saleha toured the National Planetarium in Kuala Lumpur. From the Planetarium, Her Majesty the Raja Isteri proceeded to the Istana Melawati in Putrajaya for lunch. The function was hosted by Her Majesty Seri Paduka Baginda Raja Permaisuri Agong

His Majesty's Visit to the Russian Federation

"The beginning of a new and promising stage in bilateral cooperation"

His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam arrived in Moscow on 6 June 2005, for a four-day official visit to the Russian Federation. The Official Visit was upon the invitation of His Excellency President Vladimir Putin of the Russian Federation.

The highlight of His Majesty's visit in Moscow was a meeting with President Putin at the Grand Kremlin Palace.

Talks between the two leaders focused on a broad range of issues, in particular the potential for Brunei-Russian trade, investment, military, scientific and technological exchanges. Reports from Kremlin also said that the meeting discussed the necessary legal framework to support this cooperation.

President Putin stated that His Majesty's visit to Russia was the "beginning of a new, promising stage in bilateral relations" and called His Majesty "a good friend and promising partner".

He also thanked His Majesty for supporting Russia in the Organisation of the Islamic Conference (OIC), where Russia has an observer status. His Majesty expressed his gratitude for President Putin's "contribution to the development of the region and the enhancement of security in Asia as a whole". His Majesty said, "One of the aims of my visit is to confirm that Russia really plays a very significant role in Asian regional processes.

"We have considered the possibility of the Russian government participating in the diversification of our economy, which is over-dependent on the oil and natural gas industries," His Majesty stated.

"We touched upon trade development and investment in the tourist industry and we are seeking closer cooperation with Russia," His Majesty added

On the occasion of the Visit, His Majesty was awarded an honorary doctorate by a leading Russian university, The Moscow State Institute of International Relations under the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Russia (MGIMO) . The award was in recognition of His Majesty's leadership in promoting inter-cultural dialogue and cooperation.

On 9 June 2005, His Majesty left Moscow for Saint Petersburg for the last leg of the Royal visit to Russia. His Majesty's programmes in Saint Petersburg included attending a luncheon hosted by Her Excellency the Governor of Saint Petersburg and visiting the Hermitage Museum and the Mariinsky Theatre

H.E. Bounnhang Vorachith, Prime Minister of the Lao People's Democratic Republic Visits Brunei Darussalam

His Excellency Bounnhang Vorachith, the Prime Minister of the Lao People's Democratic Republic, and Madame Vorachith arrived for a three-day official visit to Brunei Darussalam on 26 March 2005. The Prime Minister led a 35-member delegation.

At a banquet in honour of the visit held at the Istana Nurul Iman, His Majesty said that relations between Brunei Darussalam and the Lao People's Republic were purposeful and practical benefiting both partners in closely involving themselves in bold plans for the future offered by the ASEAN regional association. The ties, at the same time, were also warm and personal. "We have been very pleased to see a number of your students here especially those involved in the training available through our technical assistance programme under the initiative for ASEAN integration", His Majesty said

"Our joint commission also provides a practical way for us to share ideas and put forward new proposals. I hope it will continue to do this, "His Majesty added and also noted, "there is much more for it to consider, particularly trade and investment opportunities, continued cooperation in education and culture and in the development of our tourism industries,"

His Majesty also said that Brunei Darussalam was delighted to work with a government so ready and willing to join its neighbours in close cooperation and to play its own part in the development of South-east Asia.

His Majesty congratulated the Prime Minister on his country's achievements in the years since Laos joined ASEAN. "Ever since 1998, when I had the pleasure of visiting Laos and the honour of receiving your president here, this is what we have tried to encourage most of all. In Brunei, we strongly believe these are the basis upon which lasting good relations are founded,"

H.E. Bounnhang Vorachith in his reply thanked the Brunei government for helping Laos, especially in human resource development for the warm cooperation and friendship between the two countries and called on Brunei investors to take the opportunity to invest in Laos.

The Prime Minister visited various places of interest in the country, including a river cruise around Kampong. Ayer, Temburong National Park and Jame `Asr Hassanil Bolkiah mosque. The Prime Minister also visited the Royal Regalia, the Arts and Handicrafts Training Centre and the Lambak Kanan National Housing Scheme ■

Visits from Foreign Heads of States / Governments

H.E. Hu Jintao, President of the People's Republic of China Visits Brunei Darussalam

His Excellency President Hu Jintao of the People's Republic of China arrived in Brunei Darussalam on 20 April 2005 on a three nation State Visit to Brunei Darussalam, Indonesia. and the Philippines. H.E. President Hu was accompanied by his wife, Liu Yongqing.

In a written statement issued on his arrival at the Brunei International Airport, the Chinese President expressed his great pleasure at being invited to Brunei by His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam. President Hu Jintao said China attaches great importance to developing relations with Brunei.

His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and Her Majesty Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajah Saleha received President Hu Jintao Madam Liu Yongqing, at the Istana Nurul Iman. During the audience, His Majesty bestowed the state decoration of Brunei Darussalam, the Most Esteemed Family Order Laila Utama or Darjah Kerabat Laila Utama Yang Amat Dihormati, DK, which carries the title Dato Laila Utama upon President Hu Jintao.

His Majesty and the Chinese leader also held a bilateral meeting and discussed bilateral and regional issues of common interest. The two leaders also discussed ways to enhance existing bilateral relations, including trade, investment, tourism and defence and health. Also present at the meeting were HRH Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, Minister of Foreign Affairs, and his Chinese counterpart, Mr. Li Zhaoxing

At a State Banquet held in honor of President Hu Jintao, His Majesty underlined the expansion of ties and cooperation between Brunei Darussalam and China. His Majesty noted that ever since both countries established diplomatic relations in 1991, friendship had steadily grown. "All this is in addition to the crucial work today of opening up new trade and investment opportunities. It has been set up in a fine spirit of common respect and common purpose," His Majesty said.

In his reply, President Hu Jintao said developing China-Brunei friendship and cooperation not only benefited the fundamental interests of the two countries, but also contributed to peace, stability and prosperity in the region.

President Hu added that the relations of good neighbourly friendship and cooperation between China and Brunei had already become a shining example of equal treatment, mutually beneficial cooperation and harmonious coexistence between big and small countries

Exchange of Notes between Brunei Darussalam and China

An Exchange of Notes on the Exemption of Visas for Holders of Diplomatic, Official and Service Passports between the Government of His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and the Government of People's Republic of China was held on 21 April 2005, at the Empire Hotel and Country Club, Jerudong in conjunction with the two-day State Visit to Brunei Darussalam by Chinese President His Excellency Hu Jintao.

Representing Brunei Darussalam was Pehin Dato Lim Jock Seng, Permanent Secretary at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and Her Excellency Yang Yanyi, the Ambassador of the People's Republic of China to Brunei representing the People's Republic of China.

The Pakistani Prime Minister led a high-level delegation, which included Food and Agriculture Minister Sikandar Hayat Khan Bosan, Industries and Production Minister Jahangir Khan Tareen, Information Technology and Telecommunication Minister Awis Ahmed Khan Leghari, and Labour Manpower and Overseas Pakistanis Minister Ghulam Sat-war Khan.

His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam and Her Majesty Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Hajah Saleha later granted an audience to the Pakistani Prime Minister and Begum Aziz.

The Prime Minister also met members of the business community in the country, made a call to Minister of Education Pehin Dato Haji Awang Abdul Aziz bin Pehin Dato Haji Awang Umar, and held a discussion with the Chairman of the Brunei Investment Agency ■

Former U.S. President William Clinton Visits Brunei Darussalam

On 1 March 2005, His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam hosted a dinner for the former President of the United States of America, His Excellency William J. Clinton in Jerudong. Also present at

the function were HRH the Crown Prince Pengiran Muda Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah and HRH Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, the Minister of Foreign Affairs.

Former President Clinton, the 42nd President of the United States visited Brunei Darussalam for a brief personal visit following his tour of the region as the United Nations Secretary General's Special Envoy for the tsunami-affected countries.

The former President last visited Brunei Darussalam in 2000 as the American President to attend the APEC summit, hosted by Brunei Darussalam.

His Excellency Alberto G. Romulo, Foreign Secretary arrived in Brunei Darussalam on 7 March 2005 for a two-day working visit. During the visit, the Foreign Secretary held a series of audiences with His Majesty, the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei, His Royal Highness the Crown Prince Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah and High Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, the Minister of Foreign Affairs.

The highlight of the visit was the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding on Academic Cooperation in Higher Education between the Brunei Darussalam and Philippine governments.

The signing was held at the Balai Penghadapan Indera Kayangan on 10 March 2005. HRH Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, Minister of Foreign Affairs and Mr. Romulo signed on behalf of their respective governments.

The MOU is aimed at promoting cooperation in higher education and professional training between the academic institutions of the Philippines and Brunei Darussalam on facilities, faculty, student and staff exchanges in the areas of Information Technology, Mathematics, Science and other disciplines.

It also provides a framework for cooperation and collaboration by government and private academic institutions on education and training systems, curriculum

On 9 March 2005, His Royal Highness the Crown Prince Pengiran Muda Haji Al-Muhtadee Billah and YTM Paduka Seri Pengiran Anak Isteri Pengiran Anak Sarah binti Pengiran Salleh Ab Rahaman began a three-day official visit to Singapore at the invitation of the Singapore Minister of Defence, H.E. Teo Chee Hean. Accompanying Their Royal Highnesses was YAM Prince Abdul Qawi.

The visit included meetings with Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong, Senior Minister Goh Chok Tong and Minister Mentor Lee Kuan Yew.

On the first day of visit, HRH the Crown Prince and YTM Paduka Seri Pengiran Anak Isteri Pengiran Anak Sarah went on separate programmes.

HRH the Crown Prince began by visiting the Headquarters of the Singapore Ministry of Defence. Also present was YAM Pengiran Muda Qawi. HRH also attended a series of briefings on Singapore's Defence Policy.

"The International environment today is vastly different from 1945. We face new global issues, even while several old ones still remain to be solved.

Economics is high on the international agenda. Free markets and open competition have become the basis for economic cooperation. That most countries in the world are now concentrating on economic issue is an advance on a world pre-occupied with ideological conflicts.

The United Nations is still the best organisation to uphold a world order based on international law and the principles of sovereignty and territorial integrity. Interdependence between nations has increased but has not displaced the the sovereignty of nations as the basic principle in international relations.

The United Nations give all members, big and small, an equal voice. This is important for small states like Brunei Darussalam. The United Nations Organisations must change to meet new challenges, but I hope it will continue to give small nations and adequate voice in its deliberations."

The 2nd ASEAN-Canada Dialogue, Vancouver, Canada





The 2nd ASEAN-Canada Dialogue was held on April 4, 2005 in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. The Dialogue was preceded by a Retreat at Whistler on April 3, 2005. Delegations from ASEAN Member Countries and Canada, and the ASEAN Secretariat attended the Meeting and Retreat.

The Meeting was co-chaired by Mr. David Mulroney, Assistant Deputy Minister (Bilateral Relations), Foreign Affairs Canada, and Pehin Dato Lim Jock Seng, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Brunei Darussalam.

In his welcoming remarks, Mr. Mulroney expressed Canada's pleasure at hosting the Meeting. He noted that last year's Dialogue represented a watershed, being the first time that both sides had formally met at senior officials' level in seven years. He further noted the success of the ASEAN-Canada Partnership Symposium, held on 15 February 2005, and thanked Brunei Darussalam

for their assistance as Canada's ASEAN Coordinating Country, which had helped to make the dialogue possible. His Excellency further looked forward to upcoming events such as the inaugural ASEAN-Canada Senior Economic Officials' Meeting and Business Forum, to be held in Toronto in May 2-4, 2005 and the launch of the joint analytical study on ASEAN-Canada trade and investment.

In his opening remarks, Pehin Dato Lim Jock Seng highlighted that the Dialogue had paved the way in revitalising and enhancing ASEAN-Canada relations. He also welcomed recent progress in the relations, in particular the successful convening of the ASEAN-Canada Partnership Symposium in Brunei Darussalam. He also welcomed the outcome of the visit by a representative from the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) to the ASEAN Secretariat in February 2005 as a useful way to enhance the understanding of both sides in developing and implementing specific areas of cooperation ■

ASEAN-Canada relations was formalized in 1981 through the setting up of the ASEAN-Canada Joint Cooperation Committee (JCC). The Joint Planning and Monitoring Committee (JPMC) was set up in 1994 to oversee various projects at the planning and implementation level. Canada has provided technical assistance to ASEAN for projects on science and technology, human resources development, information and culture, and women in development, with a very strong emphasis on science and technology. Greater impetus is being given to the expansion of trade and investment between ASEAN and Canada.

The 15th ASEAN-EU Ministerial Meeting, Jakarta, Indonesia

Pengiran Dato Paduka Osman bin Pengiran Patra, Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs led the Brunei delegation to the 15th ASEAN-European Union Ministerial Meeting (AEMM) from 9 to 10 March 2005 in Jakarta, Indonesia. The 15th AEMM was preceded by an ASEAN-European Union Senior Officials' Meeting on 9 March 2005.

At the 15th AEMM, the Ministers discussed political-security issues, exchanged views on the regional and international situation, and reviewed ASEAN-European Union relations. The meeting also aimed to strengthen ties between ASEAN and the European Union.

ASEAN

Brunei and ASEAN to Start Free Trade with Korea





Brunei and other ASEAN member countries have agreed to start free merchandise trade with South Korea by next year. This consensus came to light during the first round of negotiations between both sides in Jakarta aimed at tariff-free access by 2009.

Four more rounds of talks are scheduled to take place between South Korea and ASEAN member countries in order to establish a specific timetable for cutting tariffs on merchandise, according to Korean news agencies on March 2.

Once the accord is signed in December, duties on 80 per cent of products traded between the two sides will be eliminated by 2009, with Korean corporations having tariff-free access to one of the world's top tree economic blocks with EU and North America FTA, the 530 million-strong ASEAN market.

Unlike previous FTA talks, Korea engaged in two-track discussions with ASEAN, due in part to the different levels of development among ASCAN economies, where the initial focus on merchandise will be followed by free-crossborder services and investment.

The first three-day talks between Korea and ASEAN on 23 February 2005 in Jakarta were co-chaired by Hong Jong-Ki, Deputy Minister for Trade, and David Chin, the Director-General at Singapore's Ministry of Trade and Industry, who headed the ASEAN delegation. About thirty delegates from ASEAN member countries took part.

The first round sprang from the decision to conclude a free-trade deal within two years from 2005 following the 'Joint Declaration on Comprehensive Co-operation Partnership between ASEAN and Korea".

His Majesty the Sultan of and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei together with other ASEAN Heads of States urged its acceleration at the Korea-ASEAN Summit last November in Vientiane.

First round discussions culminated with trade partners' agreement to begin talks on investment and services early next year and to conclude negotiations by the end of 2006. The next round of formal talks building on the latest round is set for April 19 in Seoul ■

ASEAN - Republic of Korea

The Republic of Korea (ROK) became a Dialogue Partner of ASEAN in July 1991. Cooperation between ASEAN and ROK covers trade, investment, tourism, science and technology, human resource development and development cooperation. Future areas of cooperation will include youth, media and culture. The ASEAN-ROK Special Cooperation Fund was established under the dialogue to finance technical and development cooperation activities.

An ASEAN-ROK Forum for the 21st Century has also been inaugurated in 1997 to recommend measures for the improvement of ASEAN-ROK relations for the next century.

ASEAN-ROK cooperation in the political field has been strengthened by regular dialogue and exchange of views on regional and international issues through existing mechanisms such as Summit, ministerial meeting, ASEAN-ROK Dialogue, ASEAN Plus Three Cooperation, Post Ministerial Conference (PMC) + 10 and the ASEAN Regional Forum (ARF).

ASIA-AFRICA

His Majesty Attends ASROC Summit in Jakarta and Bandung

On 29 April 2005, His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam attended the Asia and Africa Summit held in Jakarta, Indonesia. His Majesty was accompanied by His Royal Highness Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, the Minister of Foreign Affairs of Brunei Darussalam. The Asian-African Summit in Jakarta brought together more than forty heads of state and government and other leaders representing well over one hundred nations in the continents of Asia and Africa.

The meeting was co-chaired by the President of Indonesia, Doctor Susilo Bambang Yudhoyono and the President of South Africa, Mr. Thabo Mbeki. The meeting began with a minute of silence to remember the thousands who lost their lives during the earthquake and tsunami tragedy that hit many countries in the Indian Ocean Basin.

At the Summit, His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam signed the declaration of Strategic Partnership which sealed the renewed commitment of the leaders to help improve the fate of the people in the two continents.

In his address at the Summit, His Majesty said that Brunei offered its solidarity with all leaders attending the Asian African Summit in Indonesia, its friendship and commitment for peaceful cooperation amongst all the countries

His Majesty expressed deepest sympathy to all families who had suffered a great personal loss in the December tsunami and the more recent earthquake in Sumatra. His Majesty said the people of Brunei were

deeply distressed and would continue do whatever they could assist in rebuilding their lives and communities ■

address the State of South-South Cooperation and to review the development challenges facing by members of the group and the creation of a special development fund for the countries of the South.



HRH Prince Mohamed Bolkiah, the Minister of Foreign Affairs joined ASEM ministers at the official opening of the 7th Asia Europe Meeting [ASEM] Foreign Ministers' meeting at the Kyoto State Guest House on 7 May 2005.

Japan's Minister of Foreign Affairs Nobutaka Machimura hosted the ministers at a working dinner. In his statement during the course of the working dinner, HRH reaffirmed the basic objectives of ASEM and its importance to overall Asia-Europe relations.

The 7th ASEM saw foreign ministers calling on North Korea to return to the six-party negotiations on its nuclear programme amid growing concern that it is now preparing to test a nuclear weapon.

The Chairman's Statement of the 7th ASEM Foreign Ministers' Meeting, also confirmed the commitment to multilateralism and to a fair, just and rule-based international order with the United Nations playing the central role in addressing new global challenges and threats.

The ministers also reiterated the need to strengthen efforts on disarmament and the non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and called upon all states to implement urgently all international counter-terrorism conventions and relevant UN security convention.

The environment remains a priority as the statement from the Chairman of ASEM reiterated the importance of the Kyoto Protocol and the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change.

The statement also urged countries that had not yet concluded the Kyoto Protocol to do so as soon as possible to ensure wider participation. The Kyoto protocol is a requirement for 35 industrialized nations to cut down greenhouse emission.

The countries affected by the recent tsunami called for support from the countries and people of Asia and Europe to establish regional early warning systems in accordance with national priorities and under the coordination of UN agencies.

HRH Prince Mohamed, the Minister of Foreign Affairs also attended the Second Plenary Session of the Foreign Minister's Meeting. In the morning session, ministers discussed economic, social and cultural relations. This was followed by a working luncheon, during which His Royal Highness delivered a statement on the future direction of ASEM.

HRH also held a bilateral meeting with Benita Ferrero-Waldner, EU Commissioner for External Relations and European Neighborhood Policy, and discussed Brunei Darussalam EU relations ■

COMMONWEALTH

His Majesty Pledges Brunei's Active Participation in the Commonwealth



His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam in a message on the occasion of the Commonwealth Day on March 15, acknowledged the contributions, benefits and uniqueness of the Commonwealth and pledged Brunei's continuous active participation in all its endeavours.

"Today we celebrate Brunei Darussalam's membership of the Commonwealth and the spirit of goodwill and mutual respect that link us with our fellow members," stated His Majesty.

"We honour a partnership in which members seek, above all, to improve the day-to-day lives of all citizens by sharing each other's expertise and special experiences and, this year, we particularly support the Commonwealth's efforts to reach this fundamental objective through education."

In highlighting the relationship with the Commonwealth, His Majesty said, "We in Brunei Darussalam, like our fellow members, have benefited a great deal from our membership of the Commonwealth and will continue to offer our active participation in all its endeavours.

"In doing so, we recognise the unique qualities of a free association of 52 nations, which, although diverse in so many ways, brings its members together in friendship and in their commitment to social, economic and cultural development,

"We acknowledge the powerful contribution this makes to the principle of dialogue, peaceful negotiation and consensus that we believe are vital in the conduct of international diplomacy," added His Majesty.

His Majesty said that Brunei appreciated the Commonwealth's constant commitment to bringing direct, practical benefits to the day-to-day lives of its citizens.

He also praised the Commonwealth for doing all it could to ensure those future generations had the opportunities and the means to live peaceful, purposeful lives in peaceful, purposeful communities

The Commonwealth is an association of 53 independent countries and their people. Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II is the Head of the Commonwealth. The Commonwealth has no charter but is an informal grouping of countries in different regions of the world, consisting of different races and representing a number of interests, to exchange opinions in a friendly and intimate atmosphere. Its aims are to promote international peace and order, equal rights for all citizens and a fairer global society.

Brunei Darussalam's role in Commonwealth

Brunei Darussalam became the 49th member of the Commonwealth upon resumption of its independence on 1st January 1984. The Commonwealth has provided Brunei Darussalam with opportunities to pursue and promote its foreign policy objectives in a multilateral forum.

Since joining the Commonwealth, Brunei Darussalam has attended every Commonwealth Heads of the Government Meeting (CHOGM) respectively held in Nassau in 1985, Vancouver in 1987, Kuala Lumpur in 1989, Harare in 1991, Limmasol in 1993, Auckland in 1995, Edinburg in 1997 in Durban South Africa in 1999, Coolum, Australia in 2002 and Abuja, Nigeria in 2003. The next CHOGM will be in Valletta, Malta from 25-27 November 2005 and in Kampala, Uganda in 2007. These meetings have provided a platform on which international affairs can be discussed and bilateral relations developed and strengthened. Ministers have also attended the Commonwealth meetings in areas of education, finance, health, law, women and youth. This year, for the first time, the Commonwealth will convene a Pre-CHOCM Meeting for Foreign Ministers which will discuss substantive issues previously deliberated by leaders in CHOGM.

Brunei Darussalam has also participated in the Commonwealth Games since 1990 in Auckland and most recently in Manchester, England in 2002. The next Commonwealth Games will be in Melbourne in 2006.

The Heads of Government in 1965 established the Commonwealth Secretariat under the direction of Commonwealth governments. The Secretariat, which is based in London, is headed by the Secretary-General, Rt. Hon. Don McKinnon. The Secretariat co-ordinates the work of the association, organises intergovernmental consultations, services Commonwealth meetings and conducts programmes of co-operation and disseminates information.

Present at a joint press conference to announce the new agreement was Her Royal Highness Princess Hajah Masna, Ambassador-at-Large at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Also present were Mr. Ignacio Walker, Minister of Foreign Affairs of Chile, Hon. Jim Sutton, New Zealand Minister for Trade negotiations, and Mr. Li Hug Kiang,

Singapore Minister for Trade and Industry.

The new agreement signaled the beginning of a partnership that bridges Latin America, the Pacific and Asia.

The Trans-Pacific SEP was formally known as the Pacific Three Closer Economic Partnership (P3-CEP) with its negotiations first launched at the APEC Leaders Summit in Los Cobos, Mexico in 2002 by the Chilean President and Prime Ministers of Singapore and New Zealand.

In the Joint Press Statement, ministers from Chile, New Zealand and Singapore formally

accepted Brunei as a founding member of the agreement, on terms that allow Brunei progressively to implement some of its commitments over the next two years.

Dr Supachai Panitchpakdi, Director General of the WTO, briefed the morning session meeting on the latest development in the WTO Doha Development Agenda negotiations. HRH Princess Hajah Masna thanked Dr Supachai for his efforts over the past three years in advancing the Doha Development Agenda.

In the afternoon session, the APEC Mid-Term Stock Take process of the Bogor Goals of freer and more open trade in the Asia-Pacific region by 2020 were discussed. Ministers heard a report on the recommendation by the recently concluded Mid-Terns Stock-Take Symposium.
