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Mission Statement

To achieve excellence, by means of providing knowledge in Buddhism, Pali and related fields and enabling students to reach high standards in virtue, knowledge in the Dhamma and relevant skills and to foster and nourish, both in and outside Sri Lanka, a way of life exemplified in the teaching of the Buddha.

The Message of the Venerable Vice Chancellor

The basic objective of this university, established in accordance with the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act No. 74 of 1981 as amended by the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka Act No. 37 of 1995, is the development of the study of Buddhism and the Pali Language both locally and abroad, and the promotion of erudite scholars conforming to it.

Accordingly, the study programme commenced from 1997 at the university complex at Homagama and continues to this day. Meanwhile an attempt is being made to achieve the above objective of the University through the establishments in Singapore, South Korea, Cambodia and Malaysia which function as the external foreign affiliated institutions. This arrangement continued in the year 2002. It has been proposed to inaugurate several more foreign affiliated institutions.

The proceedings to admit 50 new students for the year 2003, and to obtain 2 houses externally to provide hostel facilities for them were completed within the year 2003. Similarly the construction of the parapet wall around the boundaries of the Homagama complex were completed in the year 2002, while the acquisition of a plot of land, 4 acres 2 Roods 17 Perches in extent adjacent to the university complex and owned by the Western Provincial Council, was effected in the same year. The office building in Colombo was completely repaired and painted during the year.

It was during the year 2002, that the university was able to obtain an allocation of the sum of seventy five million rupees from the General Treasury for the year 2003, to construct students' hostels, lecture halls and a kitchen.

It was possible to bring to the attention of the Ministry, the need for the systematic organization of the Faculties and departments of studies, which has eluded its notice so far, but indicated in the audit queries, and to obtain the Ministry's approval.

Necessary steps have been taken to commence a certificate course in computer technology from the year 2003. It was during the year 2002 that steps were taken to plan and utilize financial allocations for all these activities.

In the year 2002, steps were taken to transfer the staff of all branches with effect from 2003, revamp office management in a manner enabling them to receive training in the functions of the office and to give a training in Information Technology.

Preliminary arrangements too commenced during the year 2002 to re organize the study programmes according to the unit system.

01 General

(A) Introduction

The Buddhist and Pali university of Sri Lanka established by the Act of Parliament No. 74 of 1981 of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka was ceremonially inaugurated on 22 April 1982. The main objectives of this University were the propagation of Buddhism, the development of Pali and Buddhist Studies in Sri Lanka and foreign countries and the provision of facilities for research in the relevant fields. The above mentioned Act has been revised by the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka (Amendment) Act No. 37 of 1995. With the activation of the above amendments, the erstwhile affiliated institutions became defunct, and the Buddhist and Pali University had been restructured in accordance with the structure of the other universities of Sri Lanka. The, restructured University along with the halls of residence is located at Pitipana, Homagama. Preliminary arrangements have been already made to turn the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka into a university of international standards equipped with all units. This university holds the membership of the Association of Universities of the Commonwealth. Similarly, it is an associate member of the Committee of Vice Chancellors and Directors (C.V.C.D.) of the university system of this country.

(B) Objectives

The objectives of the restructured university in accordance with the provisions of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka (amendment) Act No. 37 of 1995 are as follows:-

- I. Propagation of Buddhism in Sri Lanka and abroad, and training of the persons erudite in Buddha Dhamma and Vinaya for the purpose of fostering the Buddhist Missionary activities.
- II. Promotion of the study of the Pali Language the Buddhist Culture and the Buddhist Philosophy and uplifting those studies as relevant to the conditions of the present world.
- III. (a) Training of student monks and male lay students to teach Buddhism and the Pali Language in the Pirivenas, schools and equivalent institutions
 - (b) Maintenance of principled conduct and mental discipline among the student monks and male lay students, and the provision of facilities for the further growth of such conduct and discipline.
 - (c) Other factors related or ancillary to the above.

(C) Officials of the University

The most Venerable Madihe Pannasiha Maha Nayaka Thero, the President of the Sri Lanka Amarapura Maha Sangha Sabha, held the post of Chancellor of the University, while the Ven. Dr. Thumbulle Seelakkahdnha Thero held the post of Vice Chancellor. Ven. Dr. Ittademaliye Indasara Thero functioned as the Dean of the Faculty of Buddhist Studies and Ven. 03. Examinations and Study Programmes

I. Commencement of lectures of the First and Second Year Students

The lectures of the First Term of the academic year 2002 commenced on 03.01.2002 and ended on 22.03.2002. The lectures of the Second Term commenced on 22.04.2002 and ended on 25.07.2002, (leaving out the Wesak week commencing from 24.05.2002 to 31.05.2002). The lectures of the Third Term started on 22.07.2002 and ended on 27.09.2002. Fifty local new students and thirty foreign students have been admitted. Fifty local students and seven foreign students of the second year are engaged in their study programmes.

II. Diploma Study Programmes in Buddhism/Pali

The examinations of the students registered for the Diploma in Buddhism/Pali, in the year 2001, were conducted in August 2002 according to the annual Time Table. Two hundred and sixty nine students were registered for the Diploma Examination in Buddhism and thirty three students for the Diploma Examination in Pali. examinations will be conducted in August 2003. At the examinations held in August 2002, eighty nine participant students secured passes in Diploma in Buddhism, while three students were successful in the Diploma in Pali Examination.

III. The General Arts Degree Examination (External)

New students registered themselves for the General Arts Degree Study Programme (External) of the year 2002. The examinations of new students and the senior students were held in December 2002. Results are vet to be released.

IV. General/Special Arts Degree Study Programme (Internal)

04. Prizes and Scholarships

The prize is awarded to the student of an affiliated institution, who has secured the second position for the subject of English. It has been established by Mr. P. Subasinghe, the first Bursar of this University, to confer merit to his departed parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. Subasinghe.

X. Baduraliye Jinarama Prize, Heenatiyana Dhammaloka Prize

These two prizes are donated by the Sri Sucharita Campaign on behalf of the Venerable Baduraliye Jinarama Thero and the Venerable Heenatiyana Dhammaloka Thero.

Heenatiyana Dhammaloka Prize: The prize is awarded to the student who scores the highest marks for the question paper PAG. 302 of the Second Semester Examination of the General Arts Degree.

The Baduraliye Jinarama Prize: This prize awarded to the student who has scored the highest marks for the question paper SANG. 202 of the Second Semester examination of the General Arts Degree.

XI. The Francis Hewavidana Prize

This prize is being awarded by Mr. Francis Hewavidana of Elgodalla, Pitakatuwana, Kamburupitiya and is awarded to four students who receive education in their fourth year, and are in the forefront as skillful sermonizers on religion in the English language.

09 Acquisition of Lands

The Cabinet of Ministers, at its meeting held on 18 June 1997, granted approval to acquire a plot of land, five acres in extent, from the land where the District Agricultural Training Centre was located at the village of Pitipana, in the Divisional Secretariat division of Homagama of the Colombo District, Western Province, for the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka. A large of number of letters regarding the acquisition of land was exchanged among the relevant organisations. During the year 2002, Hon. Reginold Cooray, the Chief Minister of the Western Province as well as Hon. Lasantha Alagiyawanna, the Minister of Agriculture, Lands and Transport of the Western Provincial Council examined the acquisition of the plot of land applied for by the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka. Pursuant to this examination, the ownership of the following plots of land was transferred to the university with effect from 05 December 2002

- ❖ 01 Rood 23 Perches bordering the Moragahahena road
- ❖ 04 Acres 2 Roods and 17 Perches bordering the Gurulugomi Road

The Deed of transfer relevant to the ownership of these plots of land was donated by Her Excellency Chandrika Bandaranaike Kumaratunga, the President of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka to the Venerable Thumbulle Seelakkhandha Nayaka Thero, who is the incumbent Vice Chancellor of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka at Nittambuwa on 08 December 2002.

10. Acquisition of the lands and the building owned by the WP/H/Gurulugomi Junior School

The Cabinet of Ministers, at its meeting held on 22 February 1996, has decided to acquire the plots of land and the buildings located at Homagama in the Western Province for the siting of the Buddhist and Pali University of Sri Lanka at one location. Accordingly, the buildings owned by the Gurulugomi school have been refurbished and the university located therein. The relevant organisations and the Divisional Secretary of Homagama have been informed to take action to hand over the land where the Gurulugomi school is located. All documents required for the acquisition and transfer had been submitted to the Divisional Secretary. However, no action has been taken to acquire and transfer this land even by the end of the year.

11. The Construction of Hostels, Lecture Halls and a Kitchen

It has been possible to provide residential facilities to only one hundred students within the university. This lack of residential facilities has aversely implemented the intake of students. Planning has been done to construct hostels adequate to two hundred and four students. The commencement of the activities of construction of the buildings is due in the year 2003.

The classrooms that belonged to the old Gurulugomi Vidyalaya have been repaired and lectures for the students are conducted there at present. One lecture room is adequate for twenty five

students. As there is no room to conduct lectures to more than twenty five students, the garage where the vehicles are parked, is being used to deliver the lectures. With the hope of admitting one hundred students during the coming year, it has been planned to construct four lecture halls in the manner given below:-

- 1. A lecture hall for the Faculty of Buddhist Studies
- 2. A lecture hall for the Faculty of Language Studies
- 3. A lecture hall for the Computer Centre
- 4. A lecture hall for the English Language Studies

The construction of the lecture halls is due to commence in the year 2003.

The majority who studies in this university consists of student monks as it is a university specially allocated for the studies of monks. Therefore there is no kitchen for the student monks to partake of their meals and to prepare them. It has been planned to construct a kitchen and the construction activities are due to start in the year 2003.

In terms of the above requirements plans have been drafted for the above mentioned three projects and have been submitted, through the Secretary of the Ministry of Education and Higher Education to the Department of National Planning of the Ministry of Finance and Planning. Accordingly, it has been intimated by the letter dated 28.09.2001 that the estimated sum of Rupees fifty five million can be allocated through the Budget Estimate of the year 2003.

12. Constructions and Provision of Facilities

i. Construction of a parapet wall around the perimeter of the university

The construction activities which commenced during the latter part of the year 2001 were completed during the year 2002.

ii. The renting/leasing of two external hostels

Facilities adequate for the fifty students who will be admitted in the year 2003 are not available in the hostels located within the university. Therefore, two external hostels were taken on rent/leased at the premises of the following addresses on 15.12.2002.

- No. 10, Walawwa Road, Homagama
- No. 593/20/02, Gurulugomi Mawatha, Pitipana North, Homagama

iii. The Computer Training Centre

The computer training centre was established to impart training to the students of the university. Five of the computers used at the Computer Training Centre are donations from Korea, and it is planned to provide training to the students from 2003 using those five computers.

13. Maintenance and Repairs

The walls of the Main office in Colombo of this university was subject to fissures. All sections of the buildings had to be repaired and colour painted. Accordingly all sections of the building were repaired and colour painted during the year 2002.




