# Fisheries (Inland Fish Habitat) Notice 2006

I write to advise the Victoria Recreational Fishing peak body (VRFish) on the remake of the Fisheries (Inland Fish Habitat) Notice. The intention of the Notice is to extend strengthened legislative protection for fish habitat in selected waters affected by dry conditions for an additional 12-month period, commencing 24 March 2006.

On this occasion I proceeded to remake the Notice without prior consultation. I undertook this irregular action primarily due to time constraints that necessitating me to expedite the remake of the Notice to ensure a seamless transition to the current period of Notice coverage. Importantly, my considerations included the fact the consultative support had been provided, without contention, on three occasions prior.

In accordance with Section 152 of the Fisheries Act (the Act), I am pleased to provide you with the above advice regarding my reasons for not undertaking consultation, and an attached copy of the Notice as it appeared in the Victorian Government Gazette on 23 March 2006.

In February 2003, the Fisheries (Inland Fish Habitat) Notice was issued in consultation with the Fisheries Comanagement Council (FCC) and the VRFish. This Notice was re-made for a further twelve months in March 2004, and subsequently re-made for another twelve months in March 2005.

The intention of the Notice is to provide enhanced protection from harvest to exposed dead timber, known to form critical fish habitat when submerged during non-dry years. This dead timber habitat is collectively referred to as coarse woody structure (CWS).

Although there has been some relief to drought conditions, CWS remains vulnerable to human interference in several impoundments still experiencing low water levels. As a result, it was appropriate to remake the Notice to extend protection for another 12 months. Advice regarding the progress of initiatives to enact permanent protection for CWS is pending.

#### FISHERIES NOTICE NO. 2/2006

## FISHERIES (INLAND FISH HABITAT) NOTICE NO. 2/2006

1. Title

This Notice may be cited as the Fisheries (Inland Fish Habitat) Notice No. 2/2006.

2. Objective

The objective of this Notice is to prevent the damage or removal of dead timber, being a component of aquatic habitat, which has become vulnerable to being taken from inland waters as a result of low water levels.

3. Authorising provision

This Notice is made under section 152 of the Fisheries Act 1995.

4. Commencement

This Notice comes into operation on 24 March 2006.

5. Prohibition

A person must not damage, cut or remove dead wood located at, or burn dead wood obtained from any point below the high water mark (full capacity) in any of the following waters:

- Lake Eildon
- Lake Eppalock
- Cairn Curran Reservoir
- Lake Mokoan
- Lake Hume
- Pine Lake
- Jil Jil Lake

- Bellfield Reservoir
- Green Lake
- Lake Fyans
- Lake Lonsdale
- Dock Lake
- Taylors Lake
- Laanecoorie Reservoir
- Rockland Reservoir
- Tullaroop Reservoir
- Toolondo Reservoir
- Lake GlenmaggieLake Batyo Catyo
- Booroopki Swamp
- Dooroopki

Penalty: 20 penalty units

## 6. Exemptions

Clause 5 does not apply to a person with an authority as defined in the **Conservation** Forests and Lands Act 1987 to manage wood for the purposes of fire prevention or control or for managing with hazardous timber.

7. Revocation

Unless earlier revoked, this Notice is revoked one year from the date of commencement.
