
CENSUS 2001 BRADFORD DISTRICT WARD PROFILES 12. Heaton

Heaton ward is a predominantly residential area. It stretches from Frizinghall in the east to Chellow Heights in the west. The Frizinghall area is a new addition to this ward.



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Population

The population of Heaton is 14,519. It has a slightly older age profile than the District as a whole. 31% of the population are under 24 years of age, compared to an average for the District of 35.9%. There are more people in the older age group categories than the average for the District, for example 16.3% of the population are over 65 years of age, compared to 14.4% for the District as a whole. Nearly 8% are over 75 years of age.

Household Composition

In Heaton ward, 23.2% of households are all pensioner households. This is higher than the District average of 22.8%. The proportion of households comprising a couple with dependent children (23.9%) is also above the District average of 22.4%. The proportion of lone parent families is 6.7%.

Household Characteristics

In this ward, 7.7% of households are overcrowded, compared to 8.3% for the District as a whole. 19.2% of households do not have central heating or the sole use of a bath and inside toilet. The District average is 23.2%. 29% of households do not have access to a car/van and 37.7% have at least one occupant with a long term illness. This exceeds the District average of 36.4%.

Housing Type

Nearly $\frac{1}{2}$ of all homes in this ward are semi-detached. Nearly $\frac{1}{4}$ are terraced houses. The proportion of detached houses at 15.1% is higher than the District average of 13.5%. Flats, conversions and shared dwellings account for 14.6% of the housing stock.

Housing Tenure

Nearly ¾ of households in Heaton ward are homeowners. 13.2% of households rent their accommodation from a social housing provider and 12.5% rent from a private landlord.

⁽²⁾ Overcrowding is defined as the number of households having one room too few for the household. A single person household is assumed to require two 'common' rooms (not including a bathroom) and a bedroom. Families are assumed to require two 'common' rooms (not including a bathroom) and a bedroom for each couple, lone parent, any other person over 16 years, each pair aged 10-15 years of the same sex, each pair formed from a remaining person aged 10-15 years and a child aged under 10 of the same sex, each pair of children aged 10 years and under and each remaining person. This is the definition of overcrowding used by government.

⁽³⁾ Households without central heating or sole use of a bath and inside toilet.

⁽⁴⁾ People who responded 'yes' to the question 'Do you have any long term illness, health problems or disability which limits your daily activities or the work you can do?' A prompt asked people to include any problems due to old age.

Work (1)

In Heaton, 61.7% of all people between the age of 16 and 74 are either working or seeking work (economically active). This is lower than the District average of 63.4%. The percentage of people who are economically active but unemployed is 6.8%. This is just below the District average of 6.9%.

Of those who are economically inactive in this age range, only 29.8% are retired. The remainder are students (17.6%); people looking after families and homes (23.3%); the permanently sick or disabled (16.2%); and people who are economically inactive for other unspecified reasons (13.1%).

Unemployment (1)

Nearly one third of the unemployed in this ward have not worked for two or more years. 20.5% of those who are unemployed have never worked and over one third are under 24 years of age. This is higher than the District average of 32.3%.

Qualifications (1)

32.1% of the population in this ward aged between 16 and 74 have no formal qualifications. 23.5% have a professional / degree level qualification, compared to 15.9% for the District as a whole.

Ethnic group

64.9% of the population of this ward describe themselves as White, with people of Pakistani origin being the second largest group at 25.6%. 3.7% describe themselves as having Indian origins, 2.5% as being of Mixed origin, and there are small numbers from other ethnic groups.

Health and unpaid caring

In the 2001 Census, 9.8% of the population in this ward described their health as 'not good'. The average for the Bradford District is 10.1%. 19.2% of the population have a long term illness that limits their daily activities. This may include any problems related to old age. In terms of unpaid care, 10.4% of the population provide some form of unpaid care. 21.3% of all carers provide over 50 hours of unpaid care a week.
