CENSUS 2001

Background

Since 1801, every 10 years the nation has set aside one day for the Census - a count of all people and households. It is the most complete source of information about the population available. The latest Census was held on Sunday 29 April 2001.

The information the Census provides allows central and local Government, health authorities and many other organisations to target their resources more effectively and to plan housing, education, health and transport services in the future.

Each Census collects basic information about the numbers of people, where they live, the balance of young and old, what jobs people do, and the type of housing they live in. However from one census to the next the questions asked are updated in response to the way society has changed and the particular issues that are important at the time. This means that exact comparisons with previous census are not always possible because of changes to the questions asked.

The first results from the 2001 Census were issued on 30 September 2002. Further figures for all Census topics have been produced from national to ward and output area, of which there are 679 in Gateshead.

This factsheet includes information from the Census for the new ward boundaries effective from June 10 2004 using aggregated data from output areas. The aggregated data has some margin of error due both to methodologies used by ONS to protect individuals and because output areas do not fit exactly within the new ward boundaries. Along with ward level information also included is comparative information about Gateshead and the other Tyne and Wear authorities along with England and Wales. A section detailing key services available in the ward is also included. Similar information about the other wards in Gateshead is included on the CD at the back of this pack.




OVERVIEW - CRAWCROOK AND GREENSIDE

Crawcrook and Greenside ward is located at the far west of the borough and adjoins Tynedale District Council to the west. The main residential areas are Crawcrook, High Spen and Greenside as well as the smaller settlements of Coalburns and Clara Vale. The remainder of the ward is rural in character. Housing is of mixed age and tenure with a high level of private ownership and only one in ten properties being Council owned.

Crawcrook has a range of shopping facilities and other services along its main street, including a small supermarket, with the other settlements being served by smaller shops. The closest main shopping area is at Blaydon Precinct but residents can also benefit from services offered at nearby Ryton. The ward has regular bus services to Newcastle, Gateshead, Blaydon and nearby Prudhoe.

The Index of Multiple Deprivation 2004 identified 33 areas (containing around 1,500 households each) in Gateshead that fall into the top 10% most deprived in England and Wales. Crawcrook and Greenside does not contain any of these areas.



- 70% of those of working age are economically active
- A higher percentage of people in Crawcrook and Greenside than the Gateshead average view their health as good
- Crawcrook and Greenside has the second highest level of car ownership



Population


The population in Crawcrook and Greenside ward is 8,520 people. Overall the population of Gateshead has declined by 4% between 1991 and 2001 down to a total of 191,151 people.

Age Structure

The graph below shows that in Crawcrook and Greenside there is a falling birth rate resulting in fewer young people. The graph also shows the baby boom population peaks for people in their 30's and to a lesser extent in their 50's. Particularly in the older age bands the graph shows significantly more women than men.

Households


The total number of households in Crawcrook and Greenside is 3,658. Overall in Gateshead, there has been a trend towards smaller households. In Crawcrook and Greenside the average household size is 2.3 compared with 2.2 for the whole of Gateshead and 2.4 for England and Wales.

Pensioners

In Crawcrook and Greenside 8% of households are all pensioner households. This is the ninth lowest level of pensioners of all wards in Gateshead and is below the national average of 9%. 15% of pensioners in Crawcrook and Greenside live alone. This is the fourth lowest level of all wards in Gateshead.

Non Pensioners

Of households in Crawcrook and Greenside 15% are single people, 42% are married, 9% are lone parents, 9% are cohabiting and 3% other types of household. Crawcrook and Greenside has the eleventh highest level of single person households of all wards in Gateshead.

Families with Dependent Children

The percentage of households which are lone parents with dependent children in Crawcrook and Greenside is 6%. This is the fourth lowest level of all wards in Gateshead. Of these 20% of lone parents are in full time employment and 30% are in part time employment.


30% of households in Crawcrook and Greenside have dependent children. Of households with dependent children 10% have no adults in employment.



Tenure

The proportion of households who are owner occupiers is 80% compared with 58% for Gateshead as a whole and 68% in England and Wales. Crawcrook and Greenside has the third highest owner occupied sector of any ward in Gateshead. The private rented sector in Crawcrook and Greenside is the eleventh smallest of all wards.


The type of property in Crawcrook and Greenside includes 95% houses or bungalows and 6% flats. Crawcrook and Greenside has the third lowest percentage of flats of all wards.





Ethnic Origin

The overall BME population in Gateshead is 1.6% compared with 0.8% for Crawcrook and Greenside. The largest ethnic group in Crawcrook and Greenside is Mixed. Crawcrook and Greenside has the fourth smallest BME population of all wards and this level is well below the average for England and Wales of 9%.



Percentage of population in Black and Minority Ethnic Groups in 2001




Economic Activity


A person who is economically active is defined as someone between the ages of 16 - 74 that was either working in the week before the Census, or was not working, but was looking for work and was available to start work within 2 weeks.

The overall level of economic activity in Crawcrook and Greenside is 70% compared with 61% for Gateshead and 67% for England and Wales. The percentage of economically active women is 65%. The proportion of women employed full time is 34%. 0.8% of people are long term unemployed which is the second lowest percentage of all wards.

In Gateshead, Wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles and Manufacturing were the employment sectors with the most people employed in them in 2001. In Crawcrook and Greenside Wholesale and retail trade, repair of motor vehicles was the largest sector of employment.

Crawcrook and Greenside has the seventh highest level of employees at the managerial level of all wards in Gateshead with 12% of employees in this category.






Percentage of People in Managerial Occupations in 2001




Qualifications

The percentage of people aged 16 and over with no qualifications at GCSE level or above in Crawcrook and Greenside is 28% compared with 38% for Gateshead and 29% for England and Wales. This is the third lowest level of residents with no qualifications of all wards in Gateshead.



Highest level of qualifications for people aged 16 and above in 2001




Percentage of People with No Qualifications in 2001




Health

The percentage of people who consider their health to be good in Crawcrook and Greenside is 66% compared with the Gateshead average of 63% and the England and Wales average of 69%. This is the fourth highest level of all wards in Gateshead. The proportion of residents with a limiting long term illness is 19%.



Assessment of health in the last twelve months - 2001




Percentage of population with a Limiting Long Term illness in 2001




Car or Van Ownership

In Gateshead and the country as a whole the percentage of households with at least one car or van has increased. In Crawcrook and Greenside ward, the level of vehicle ownership is 73%, compared with 57% for Gateshead and 73% for England and Wales. This is the second highest level of vehicle ownership of all wards in Gateshead.



Population

The population in all Tyne and Wear authorities has fallen between 1991 and 2001. The greatest falls were in Gateshead, -4% and Sunderland, -3%. This is in contrast to the growth in the overall population of England and Wales of 4%.

Household Composition

The trend in all districts and England and Wales is for the percentage of married couple households to fall but for rises in the number of single person, cohabiting and lone parent households. The most significant rise is in the number of single person households which in Gateshead is equal to over 4,000 additional single person households.


The average household size is falling with the average size in England and Wales falling from 2.5 to 2.4. Districts in Tyne and Wear, with the exception of Sunderland, have smaller households than England and Wales with Newcastle and South Tyneside having an average household size of 2.3 and Gateshead and North Tyneside, 2.2. While the population of Gateshead has fallen significantly between 1991 and 2001 the number of households has seen a small rise as a result of the growth in single person households.



Tenure

The level of owner occupation is particularly low in Newcastle at 53%, and South Tyneside at 56% with none of the Tyne and Wear authorities reaching the national average of 69%. South Tyneside has the highest level of social housing (Council and housing association) with 38% followed by Gateshead with 35%. Newcastle has the largest private rented sector with 11% compared with 6% for Gateshead.

The trend seen at the national level of a shift from social housing to owner occupation is also seen in all the Tyne and Wear districts.



Percentage of households living in council housing in 2001




Age Structure

The age structure of the population has changed between 1991 and 2001. The main trends are falls in population for ages 0 -15 and 16 - 29 and also 60 - 74 with rises in population for age bands 30 - 59 and 75 and over. Newcastle shows a slightly different trend with better retention of people in the 16 - 29 age band but with losses of population for both the 60 - 74 and 75 and over age bands.



Change in population for 0 - 15 year age band between 1991 to 2001




Change in population for 75 and over age band between 1991 to 2001




Ethnic Origin

The ethnic origin of the populations of the Tyne and Wear authorities are broadly similar with Newcastle being the most diverse with a non white population of nearly 7%. This compares with the England and Wales average of 9%. The non white population has grown in all Tyne and Wear authorities since 1991 with Newcastle having the biggest growth. The figure below shows the relative sizes of the Black and Minority Ethnic population and its composition for each of the districts and England and Wales



Size and Composition of Black and Minority Ethnic Groups in 2001




Percentage change in Black and Minority Ethnic Groups from 1991 to 2001



Economic Activity

The proportion of the population engaged in economic activity is highest in Newcastle and North Tyneside. The overall level of economic activity is higher for women than men but this includes a much higher rate of part time employment. The level of unemployment is highest in South Tyneside at 6% and lowest in Gateshead at 4%. The percentage of people working in manufacturing has increased in all districts with the largest increase of 7% occuring in Sunderland followed by a 6% increase in Gateshead. The number of people employed in the public sector such as health, social work, education and public administration is higher in the Tyne and Wear districts than the average for England and Wales. A detailed comparison with the 1991 Census is not possible due to changes in the categories used.



Economic Activity in 2001




Qualifications

Gateshead has the highest percentage of residents with no qualifications. All of the Tyne and Wear authorities are above the England and Wales average for residents with no qualification of 29%. Sunderland has the lowest level of residents with degree level qualifications with 12% compared with 21% for North Tyneside.

Between 1991 and 2001 all districts have seen significant increases in the number of resident educated to degree level. Newcastle has the highest rise of 12% followed by North Tyneside and Gateshead with rises of 11% and 10% respectively. South Tyneside and Sunderland both had rises of 9%. The overall rise in the number of people with degree level qualifications in England and Wales was 13% which means that the gap between attainment in Tyne and Wear and the rest of the Country has grown.

England and Wales




Highest level of qualifications for people aged 16 and above in 2001



Health

The level of health as reported by residents is largely the same across Tyne and Wear. However the percentage of people who say their health is good is significantly lower than the England and Wales average of 68%. This is a new question on the Census which means a comparison with 1991 is not possible.

General health




People who consider their health to be "Good" in 2001




Limiting Long-term Illness

The level of people who have a long term limiting illness is relatively high with Gateshead, South Tyneside and Sunderland having 24% and Newcastle and North Tyneside having 22%. The levels in Tyne and Wear are higher than the level for England and Wales and have increased significantly faster than the national average between 1991 and 2001.



People who have a "Limiting Long Term Illness" in 2001




Percentage increase in people with a Limiting Long Term Illness from 1991 to 2001




Car or Van Ownership

Newcastle has the lowest level or car ownership followed by South Tyneside then Gateshead. Non of the Tyne and Wear authorities reach the national average of 73%. However the level of car ownership in all the districts has increased faster than the national average meaning the gap between the region and the rest of the country is closing.
