Mission Statement

Our school is a learning community which welcomes diversity and is shaped by the pursuit of Christian values. We seek the excellence in all of us through a creative and challenging environment that provides outstanding preparation for today and tomorrow.

St Michael's Collegiate School was founded in 1892 by the Sisters of the Church, an Anglican order of nuns who came to Tasmania at the invitation of Bishop Montgomery. The Sisters remained in charge of the School until 1973 when a Board of Management and a lay Principal were appointed. The life of the School is anchored in its Christian foundation. Collegiate enjoys close ties with St David's Cathedral and All Saint's parish in South Hobart and there is a chaplaincy team on the staff.

Located on several campuses, Collegiate is essentially a vibrant city school within 10 minutes walk of the city centre. The main campus provides for girls in Senior School (Years 9 to 12) and Middle School (Years 5 to 8). Anglesea Village at South Hobart provides for 3 to 5 year old boys and girls in our Early Learning Centre and Kindergarten, and for girls in Prep to Year 4. Our Early Learning Centre at Bishop Davies Court in Kingston provides for babies from 3 months to 5 year old children. There are also fifteen hectares of playing fields at Ham Common at the foot of Mt Nelson, a rowing club at Pavilion Point beside the Tasman Bridge and equestrian facilities at Hopfield's Equestrian Centre, Mt Nelson.

Collegiate has an enrolment of over 800 students from Kindergarten to Year 12 and an additional 200 students in its Early Learning Centres. It has a staff of 80 teachers, 25 child care staff and 50 administrative, support and ancillary staff.

The School provides a diverse and rigorous academic program as well as extensive extracurricular opportunities in outdoor education, sport, debating and public speaking, community service and music and the performing arts.
