Did You Know?

The Schenectady Museum & Planetarium has a collection of 1.5 million photographs. It is the seventh largest collection in the United States outside of the Federal Government!

Did You Know?

The Schenectady Museum & Planetarium has collected 110 radios, 60 televisions, and two of the earliest television cameras in existence. The earliest television in the collection dates to 1928 and has a three-inch screen!

Did You Know?

The Schenectady Museum & Planetarium's world-famous technology collections include more than 20,000 artifacts, ranging from hundreds of experimental x-ray and electron tubes to nearly 2,000 home appliances!

Did You Know?

The Schenectady Museum & Planetarium's photograph collection includes 30,000 locomotive images, 25,000 radio and television photographs and 15,000 images of street lighting installations from all over the world!

Did You Know?

The International Technology Archives at the Schenectady Museum & Planetarium includes more than 15,000 patents, millions of advertising documents and business records, 1,000 motion picture films, and 5,000 books, in addition to its internationally-known photograph collection of 1.5 million photographs.
