INDIA-SIERRA LEONE BILATERAL RELATIONS

Introduction

India and Sierra Leone share close and friendly relations. The level of bilateral interaction between the two countries, both being members of the Commonwealth, has declined following the 2001 withdrawal of Indian troops to UNAMSIL and due to lack of exchange of high level visits, bilateral consultations and depletion of the Indian community numbers in the civil war ravaged country.

1 Political

1.1. India's peacekeeping role

Successful participation of Indian military leadership of the UN Observer Mission and UN Peacekeeping Mission (UNAMSIL) with appointment of Brig. Joshi as Head of the UN Observer Mission in May 1998 and Maj. Gen. Jetley as Commander of the UN Forces in Sierra Leone (2001-2001) carries goodwill and political impact among the present political leadership of the country. Indian troops were phased out in January, 2001.

1.2. Bilateral visits

Though high level visits and consultations have stayed limited, major visits include visit of former Raksha Mantri, George Fernandes in July 2000; visit of Sierra Leonean Minister of Industry and Transport A.E. Bangura to New Delhi in November 1998; visit of a two member Parliamentary delegation led by the Speaker of the Sierra Leone Parliament to New Delhi in January 2003 and the visit of the Foreign Minister Alhaji Momodu Koroma and Trade and Industry Minister Dr. Kadi Sesay to New Delhi from 6-9 November 2005 to participate in the CII Africa Conclave.

1.3. Support to Indian candidature and other issues

Sierra Leone has supported India's candidature to various Commonwealth, UN and other multilateral fora. It has supported India's candidature for the permanent membership of UNSC and India's position on Kashmir issue.

2. Commercial and Trade Relations

2.1. Indo-Sierra Leonese trade turnover during the recent years are as follows:

- 2.2. Indian export basket mostly included drugs and pharmaceuticals, textile, steel and steel products and machine tools and major items of imports from Sierra Leone were woodpulp, waste paper and inorganic chemicals.
- 2.3. There are about 20 Indian NRI/PIO trading companies operating in Sierra Leone who manage the biggest departmental store in the country, run biscuit, candle making and agro-processing units and procure and supply food products and consumer durables in the country. During 2006, three mining concessions for tantalium, bauxite and iron ore has been awarded to an Indian firm. An MoU has been signed for rehabilitation of the Sierra Leonese national telephone company with UTL.
- 2.3. Potential exist for Indian participation in the sectors for generation of power, mining, agro-industries, diamonds and supply of drungs, pharmaceuticals, food products, etc.

3. Indian Assistance

- 3.1. Government of India's decision to gift 400 barracks to the Sierra Leone Army at a total cost of US\$ 795,000/- in Benguema, Wilberforce (Freetown) and Murraytown has been appreciated by the President. The construction and handing over of the project will take place by May 2007.
- 3.2. Under ITEC/SCAAP programme, 10 slots are provided to trainees, experts and students from Sierra Leone. These are fully utilized every year by the country. IT, journalism and enterpreneurship are the popular courses for the trainees.

3.3. The Government of Sierra Leone has requested for inclusion of the country in the TEAM-9 Initiative. Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation H.E. Mr. Koroma had written to the then Minister of State for External Affairs seeking Indian assistance for a number of projects which is under consideration. Sierra Leone seeks active Indian aid and assistance package for training, development of its energy and infrastructure facilities and humanitarian assistance in the form of medicines, transformers etc.

4. Defence Cooperation

A proposal for visit of a 3-member defence delegation led by Deputy Minister of Defence (President holds the charge of Defence Ministry) to visit India for identifying areas of long term cooperation including training projects of armaments etc. is under our consideration.

5. Indian community and Honorary Consulate General

- 5.1. Following the 1999 exodus of Indians, there are about 1500 Indian community members residing in Sierra Leone, most from Sindhi community dealing in trading activity. There is a functional Hindu temple in Freetown and a charity hospital run by the Choitram Trust which is used by the UN and diplomatic personnel and local government officials.
- 5.2. Since 1993, Shri K.H. Azad is functioning as India's Honorary Consul General in Freetown.

6. Issues relating to Commonwealth

Former Foreign Secretary, Shri K. Srinivasan, is the Commonwealth consultant to the country for preparing a study for setting up a professional diplomatic service in the country. The report is under preparation. Sierra Leone may seek India's assistance.
