ACCESS: BY BOAT FROM PUBLIC BOAT LAUNCH IN CLUTE PARK MARINA/CAMPGROUND.

DIVE FLAG LAW

ONCE A BOAT IS ANCHORED AND DIVING IS ABOUT TO BEGIN, THE VESSEL MUST FLY A RED AND WHITE "DIVERSDOWN" FLAG. BY LAW THE BOAT MUST ALSO FLY THE BLUE AND WHITE" ALPHA" FLAG. DIVERS MUST STAY WITHIN 100 FEET OF THE DIVE FLAG. ALL STANDARD, SAFE DIVING PROCEDURES RELATING TO TOWING DIVE FLAGS MUST BE FOLLOWED. REFERENCE: SECTION 35-B, NYS NAVIGATION LAW AND RULE 27, U.S. COAST GUARD NAVIGATION RULES.




