Backgrounder

The Art of Classical Chinese Theater, As reflected in Kunqu

Singing, dancing and acting to poetic works by masters of the Yuan and Ming dynasties, the Kunqu theater towers as the predominant dramatic force in China from the sixteenth century down to the present day. Indeed, with the libretti of most Kunqu plays so marked by poetic splendor, a Kunqu performance is often treasured by audiences not only as a riveting theater of singing and dancing, but also as a fine reading of high literature.

The performer of the Kunqu theater: a singer, dancer, acrobat and actor -- all four in one, is the pivotal element on stage. All motions and emotions are expressed by the elaborately made up and resplendently robed actor through dancing, singing and acting against a stark background on a bare stage with minimum props. A bamboo flute serves as the principal musical instrument; other wind and string instruments are added to enhance the beauty of the music. A small drum and a pair of wooden clappers set the beat; gongs and cymbals are used to punctuate the action and emotion.

This much revered and beloved 400-year-old genre that uniquely blends poetic eloquence, musical refinement and dramatic wonder has left its mark on hundreds of musical theaters in China, including the Beijing opera, its most prominent descendant.

Both *The Monkey King* and *The Golden Falcon*, operas performed at this production, are of the Kun genre, and *Farewell My Concubine* is a famous opera from the Beijing opera repertoire.
