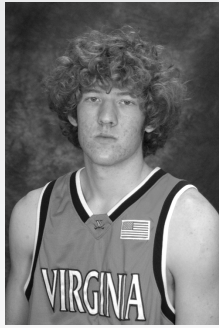


31 Andy Burns

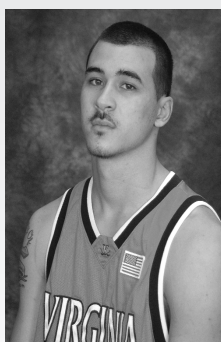

- Ranked 13th in the ACC in rebounding (6.3 rpg.) in all games in 2006-07 and ranked ninth in conference games (7.1 rpg.) during the regular season
- His tip in with 15.5 seconds remaining provided the Cavaliers with the winning points in their 64-63 victory at Clemson (1/28/07)
- Scored all seven of his points in the last 6:36 of the game, including a basket off an offensive rebound that tied the game with 2:23 left to play, in the Cavaliers' 75-69 come-from-behind victory over Georgia Tech (2/24/07)
- Scored a career-high 22 points and grabbed eight rebounds in the win over Maryland-Eastern Shore (11/26/06)
- Was 8-10 from the field in that game and made all six of his free throw attempts
- Established a career high with his eight field goals made against Maryland-Eastern Shore
 - Scored 13 points and had a game-high 12 rebounds in the 93-90 season-opening victory over nationally-ranked Arizona (11/12/06)
- Scored 13 points and tied his career high with a game-high 16 rebounds in 36 minutes in the home win over Maryland (1/16/07)
- Had eight career double-doubles, two during the 2006-07 season
- Had game-high totals of 10 rebounds in wins over UNC Asheville (11/22/06), NC State (12/3/06) and Duke (2/1/07), and 12 rebounds in a win at NC State (1/24/07)
- Had six double figure rebound games during the 2006-07 season, four against ACC opponents, and 15 in his career
- Led the team in rebounding in 13 games during the 2006-07 season
- When he wasn't in the starting lineup against American (12/28/06), it broke a streak of 34 consecutive starts for him
- Played off the bench in three consecutive games before starting the last 19 games
- Led the team in rebounds with an average of 7.6 a game and in offensive rebounds with 87 (average of 2.9 a game) in 2005-06
- Ranked seventh in the ACC in overall rebounding and tied for eighth in offensive rebounding (average of 2.9 a game) in 2005-06

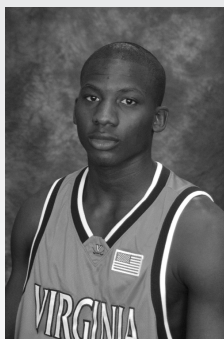

- Scored a career-high 26 points and had a career-high four steals in 35 minutes in the home win over Maryland (1/16/07)
- Scored 25 points, grabbed four rebounds, had two assists and two steals in 28 minutes in the season-opening win over nationally-ranked Arizona (11/12/06)
- Was 8-9 from the field, including 5-6 from three-point range, and made all four of his free throws against Arizona
- His five three-point field goals against Arizona are a career high
- Named the ACC Player of the Week (11/13/06) for his play against Arizona
- Had not scored in double figures in 17 consecutive games before scoring 25 points against Arizona
- Scored in double figures in three consecutive games for the first time in his collegiate career when he scored 10 points at Clemson (1/28/07), 14 points against Duke (2/1/07) and 14 points against Miami (2/3/07)
- Scored 22 points in the victory over Gonzaga (1/3/07) and was 8-13 from the field, including 4-4 from three-point range
- Scored 14 points on 6-8 shooting from the field, including 2-2 from three-point range, in a career-high 39 minutes in the overtime win over Duke (2/1/07)
- Scored 13 points on 5-7 shooting from the field, including 3-4 from three-point range, and had four rebounds in 30 minutes in the victory over Virginia Tech (3/1/07)
- Scored 17 points with three assists and three steals in 38 minutes in the loss at Purdue
- Had the first double-double of his collegiate career with 10 points and a career-high 11 rebounds in the win over Hampton (12/16/06)
- Scored 14 points and had five rebounds in a loss at then top-ranked North Carolina (1/10/07)

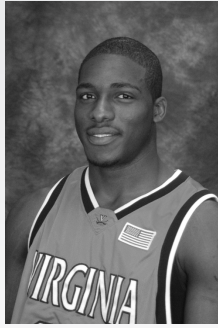

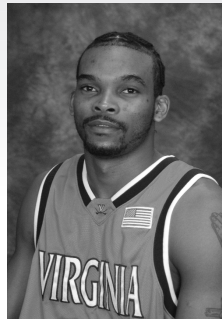
- Played in every game during the 2006-07 season
