THE MATCH-UP

Kansas City will meet Dallas in the 2004 preseason finale for both clubs at Texas Stadium on Thursday. It will mark KC's first preseason meeting with the Cowboys since the Chiefs collected a 32-6 victory in an American Bowl contest in Monterrey, Mexico (8/5/96). Thursday's contest marks Kansas City's first preseason trek to Dallas since Hall of Fame head coach Hank Stram's final season with the Chiefs in '74.

Thursday's contest features the only active pair of NFL head coaches who have taken two different squads to the Super Bowl. In total, Dick Vermeil (Eagles, Rams, Chiefs) and Bill Parcells (Giants, Patriots, Jets, Cowboys) have combined to guide seven different teams to the playoffs. Remarkably, Vermeil and Parcells have met only once in regular season competition as NFL head coaches. That lone meeting came in '98 when Vermeil's Rams claimed a 30-10 win (10/11/98) against a N.Y. Jets squad coached by Parcells that would eventually reach the AFC Championship Game.

Thursday's preseason contest will feature a pair of squads with contrasting styles. Vermeil and asst. head coach/offensive coordinator Al Saunders have developed an offensive powerhouse in Kansas City. The Chiefs led the NFL in scoring for a second consecutive season in 2003, racking up an average of 30.3 ppg. In Dallas, Parcells and defensive coordinator Mike Zimmer have established one of the NFL's top defenses. In 2003, the Cowboys led the league in total defense (253.5 ypg) and tied for second in scoring defense at 16.3 ppg.

Kansas City is 1-2 after registering a 24-7 victory vs. St. Louis (8/23) and suffering a last-second 21-19 loss last week vs. Cleveland (8/28). Dallas owned a 1-1 preseason mark after two games prior to its Monday Night Football contest vs. Tennessee (8/30). The Cowboys got their initial preseason victory with a 21-20 win at Oakland (8/23).

Both teams will get one final look at their personnel on Thursday before the NFL's final cutdown date on Sunday, September 5th. KC opens the 2004 NFL regular season in an ESPN Sunday Night Football contest at Denver (9/12), while Dallas travels to Minnesota (9/12).

THE SERIES

Kansas City is 4-4 in preseason action against Dallas, getting a 32-6 win in an American Bowl outing in the most recent meeting (8/5/96). The last preseason meeting between the two clubs in Kansas City resulted in a 24-14 Cowboys victory (8/3/91). The prior six preseason meetings between the two franchises all took place between '70-'75. KC won the first meeting of any kind between these two franchises, getting a 13-0 preseason win at Dallas (9/5/70).

**At Arrowhead Stadium*

The Chiefs are 3-4 all-time in regular season play vs. Dallas. KC hasn't faced Dallas in the regular season since getting a 20-17 win at Arrowhead (12/13/98). The only team KC has gone longer without facing in the regular season than Dallas is New Orleans, who the Chiefs last played in '97. The Chiefs aren't slated to meet Dallas in the regular season again until 2005. KC's last visit to Dallas resulted in a 24-12 loss on Thanksgiving (11/23/95). KC's lone regular season win at Dallas was a 34-31 triumph on Monday Night Football (11/10/75).

THE BATTLE FOR BIG "D" – TEXANS VS. COWBOYS

After lobbying unsuccessfully in the late '50s for an NFL expansion franchise for Dallas, Lamar Hunt was prompted to form the rival American Football League. Dallas then became centerstage in the AFL-NFL rivalry as both the Texans and the Cowboys called the Cotton Bowl home during their three-year co-existence from '60-'62. The Texans boasted a 15-6 regular season record at the Cotton Bowl and claimed the '62 AFL Championship, while the Cowboys managed just a 4-12-2 regular season home mark over the same span.

But by '63, it was clear that Dallas could not support two pro football teams and despite the superior record of his club, Hunt opted to move his franchise to Kansas City. In '66, a series of clandestine meetings between Hunt and Cowboys President Tex Schramm began, ironically, at Love Field in Dallas. Those secret talks eventually set the stage for the AFL-NFL merger as Hunt and rest of the AFL's "Foolish Club" were officially ushered into the NFL fold for the '70 season.

THE HEAD COACHES

Dick Vermeil was named the ninth head coach in Chiefs history on January 12, 2001 following head coaching stints with Philadelphia ('76-82) and St. Louis ('97-99). He is one of just four coaches in NFL history to lead two different teams to the Super Bowl and has twice been named NFL Coach of the Year.

The Calistoga, California native began his NFL coaching career with the L.A. Rams ('69, '71-73) serving as the team's special teams, RBs, and QBs coach and offensive coordinator. During his tenure as head coach in Philadelphia ('76-82), he compiled a 54-47 record. In '78, Vermeil guided the Eagles to their first playoff appearance in 12 years. He then led the '80 Eagles to a 12-4 record to earn a trip to Super Bowl XV.

Vermeil returned to the sidelines as the head coach of St. Louis for three seasons ('97-99), guiding the Rams to a 13-3 record in '99, concluding the year with a win in Super Bowl XXXIV. A standout quarterback at San Jose State from '63-65, Vermeil served as an assistant at Stanford ('65-68) and UCLA ('70) before taking over the head coaching duties for the Bruins from '74-75. In '75, he led UCLA to a 23-10 victory over #1 ranked Ohio State in the Rose Bowl.

Bill Parcells was named the sixth head coach in Cowboys history on January 3, 2003. In his first year as head coach, Dallas went 10-6 to earn a postseason berth, marking the fourth different club Parcells has guided to the playoffs. He is one of just four coaches in NFL history to lead two different teams to the Super Bowl, claiming wins in Super Bowl XXI and XXV with the N.Y. Giants. Prior to joining the Cowboys, he posted a 29-19 (.604) record as head coach of the N.Y. Jets from '97-99.

Parcells compiled a 32-32 (.500) mark in four seasons with New England from '93-96, guiding that club to a berth in Super Bowl XXXI. He served as head coach of the Giants from '83-90, accumulating a 77-49-1 (.610) regular season mark. He served as an assistant with the Giants ('79, '81-82) and Patriots ('80) after a stint as head coach at Air Force in '78. He entered the collegiate ranks with stints at Hastings College ('64), Wichita State ('65), Army ('66-69), Florida State ('70-72), Vanderbilt ('73-74) and Texas Tech ('75-77).

A collegiate linebacker at Wichita State, Parcells was named the NFL Coach of the Year in both '86 and '89. He was born in Englewood, New Jersey on August 22, 1941.

TRAINING CAMP LOCALES & PLAYOFF BERTHS

The Chiefs and Cowboys both made the playoffs a year ago and both teams boast two of the NFL's training camp locations furthest from their home cities. The Chiefs train in River Falls, WI (approx. 467 miles from KC), while the Cowboys held their 2004 camp in Oxnard, CA (1,481 miles from Dallas).

In 2003, 12 NFL clubs "stayed home" and conducted camp at their own facilities. Three of those 12 clubs (25.0%) made the playoffs – Denver, New England and Tennessee. The remaining 20 clubs used "off-site" locations. Nine of those 20 teams (45.0%) made the postseason a year ago – Kansas City, Dallas, Baltimore, Indianapolis, St. Louis, Seattle, Green Bay, Philadelphia and Carolina.

THE CHIEFS

Kansas City enters its fourth season under head coach Dick Vermeil in 2004. The Chiefs went 13-3 a year ago, claiming their eighth division title in franchise history. Al Saunders returns for his fourth season as Kansas City's assistant head coach/offensive coordinator, marking his 14th season as a KC assistant.

The Chiefs return 10 of 11 offensive starters from last year's squad with the right tackle post previously held by T John Tait (Chicago) serving as the only vacancy in the lineup. In addition to a franchise-record 484 points, the Chiefs also led the NFL with a team-record 348 first downs in 2003, while the club's 32 rushing TDs were the third-highest single-season tally in NFL history. KC was also the NFL's best squad in terms of Red Zone TD pct. (77.8%) a year ago and set a team record with a 63.25% completion percentage. The club had five receivers with 50+ receptions for the first time in team history and permitted just 21.0 sacks, the second-lowest tally in KC annals.

Gunther Cunningham returns to KC as the club's defensive coordinator, a role he previously held from '95-98 before serving as the Chiefs head coach from '99-00. During his initial stint as KC's defensive coordinator from '95-98, the Chiefs allowed an NFL-low 1,050 actual offensive points, a paltry average of just 16.4 ppg. KC returns all of its defensive starters from 2003, including four players who were starters during Cunningham's previous tenure with the club: Pro Bowl S Jerome Woods, DT John Browning, DE Eric Hicks and S Greg Wesley. Notable defensive additions to the squad include DTs Lionel Dalton and Junior Siavii (D2a-04), as well as LB Keyaron Fox (D3-04).

Kansas City's record-setting special teams are highlighted by two-time Pro Bowl return man WR Dante Hall, whose seven kick return scores over the past two seasons are by far the highest total in the league. DE Gary Stills also earned a Pro Bowl berth for his special teams exploits last season when the Chiefs became the first team to lead the NFL in both punt return average (16.42) and kickoff return average (25.44) since Washington in '95. KC's 16.42-yard punt return average broke the previous franchise standard of 15.03 that was established in the franchise's inaugural season in '60. The Chiefs KO return average was the club's finest since registering a 26.59-yard average in '69.

THE COWBOYS

The Cowboys offense is headlined by a pair of former Heisman Trophy winners who are in their initial season with Dallas. QB Vinny Testaverde ('86 Heisman winner at Miami, Fla.) is in his 18th NFL campaign. RB Eddie George ('95 Heisman winner at Ohio State) returns to Texas after beginning his career as a first-round pick of the Houston Oilers in '96. George is the all-time leading rusher in Titans history with 10,009 yards. Eight-time Pro Bowl G Larry Allen (D2-94) anchors the Dallas offensive front. A pair of former '96 first-round draft choices man the WR posts – WR Keyshawn Johnson and WR Terry Glenn. Johnson was tabbed with the first overall pick by the Jets, while Glenn was the seventh overall pick by the Patriots in '96 when Parcells was that club's head coach.

Dallas boasts a host of former first-round picks on defense. That list includes Kansas State product CB Terence Newman (D1-03), S Roy Williams (D1b-02) and DE Greg Ellis (D1-98), who paced the squad with 8.0 sacks a year ago. LB Dat Nguyen (D3-99) led the Cowboys with 140 tackles (93 solo) in 2003. DE Marcellus Wiley joined the club in the off-season after producing 41.0 sacks in seven seasons with the Bills and Chargers, while DT La'Roi Glover has 61.5 career sacks to his credit. LB Dexter Coakley (D3a-97) owns 965 career tackles and has posted at least 100 stops in each of his seven prior NFL campaigns.

Drake product K Billy Cundiff is in his third season handling the kickoff and placement duties. Free agents Mat McBriar and Ryan Flinn are competing for the punting job. WR Zuriel Smith is in his second season handling the punt and kickoff return duties.

The Chiefs throttled the defending Super Bowl champions in Monterrey, Mexico by a 32-6 count as Kansas City's defense held the Cowboys to just five first downs. The Chiefs offense piled up 514 yards of total offense compared to just 214 for the Dallas as the KC helped convert a crowd of partisan Cowboys fans into supporters of the "Jefes de Kansas City" or Kansas City Chiefs.

The contest got off to an ominous start for the Chiefs after QB Steve Bono was picked off by S Darren Woodson on the third play of the game, but the Chiefs defense held Dallas to a 41-yard K Chris Boniol FG, giving the Cowboys a short-lived 3-0 lead. KC then rattled off 13 unanswered points thanks to a pair of FGs and a 23-yard TD toss from QB Rich Gannon to RB Todd McNair on fourth-and-three to give the Chiefs a 13-3 halftime advantage.

Boniol provided a 44-yard FG on Dallas' opening possession of the second half to cut the margin to 13-6. Kansas City answered with FGs of 50 and 48 yards from K Bjorn Nittmo to push the Chiefs advantage to 19-6 after three quarters.

The Chiefs added 13 more points in the fourth quarter as the club constructed a pair of TD drives. Meanwhile, the KC defense continued to rebuke the Cowboys as Dallas was unable to cross the 50-yard line on their final three drives. A three-yard TD catch by FB Derrick Ned made the score 26-6. After the KC defense forced the Cowboys three-and-out, QB Bucky Richardson capped a 14-play, 81-yard scoring march with a 14-yard TD pass to WR Chris Penn. A missed PAT made the final count 32-6 as KC's defense concluded a stellar effort with an INT of QB Jason Garrett on the Cowboys final possession.

Kansas City controlled the clock and the ground game en route to a 20-17 victory over the Cowboys, who would go on to win the NFC East with a 10-6 record. The Chiefs held the ball for 37:20 compared to 22:40 in the time of possession column for Dallas. Kansas City racked up 38 carries for 183 yards, while Dallas managed just 16 carries for 51 yards on the ground. RB Bam Morris was the Chiefs primary workhorse, piling up 27 carries for 137 yards with one TD.

After both clubs traded field goals in the first half to leave the score deadlocked at 3-3 in the first half, Kansas City used a 14-point third quarter to take control of the contest. Morris plowed in from one yard out to give KC a 10-3 advantage, while a nimble nine-yard TD jaunt from QB Rich Gannon put the Chiefs ahead 17-3.

Dallas finally struck paydirt in the fourth quarter when QB Troy Aikman hit WR Patrick Jeffers for a 28-yard TD pass on fourth-and-10, cutting the KC lead to just seven points. KC responded with an eight-play, 43-yard drive that culminated with a 43-yard K Pete Stoyanovich FG that upped the Chiefs edge to two scores. Aikman then guided the Cowboys on a 12-play, 72-yard march that concluded with an eight-yard scoring toss to RB Emmitt Smith with a little over two minutes remaining as the Chiefs clung to a three-point lead. The Cowboys opted to kick off instead of attempting for an onside kick attempt and never saw the ball again. Runs of 11 and 17 yards from Morris gave KC a pair of first downs, allowing the Chiefs to run out the clock.

LONE STAR CHIEFS

Chiefs Founder Lamar Hunt - who resides in Dallas - always has a fondness for native Texans on the club's roster. Currently there are seven KC players who prepped or played collegiately in the state: **T Jordan Black** (Dallas Christian HS in Mesquite), **RB Derrick Baylock** (Atlanta HS, Stephen F. Austin), **S Clint Finley** (Cuero HS), **WR Dante Hall** (Nimitz HS in Houston - Texas A&M), **RB Priest Holmes** (Marshall HS in San Antonio - Univ. of Texas), **G Brian Waters** (Waxahachie HS - North Texas) and **DE Jimmy Wilkerson** (Pewitt HS in Omaha).

MCCLINTON SET FOR KU RING OF HONOR INDUCTION

RB Curtis McClinton, a '95 inductee into the Chiefs Hall of Fame will be added to University of Kansas football Ring of Honor during halftime of KU's season opener vs. Tulsa (9/4). A member of the Jayhawks from '59-61, McClinton starred for the Texans and Chiefs from '62-69.

Eight-time Kansas Broadcaster of the Year, Mitch Holthus, is in his 11th year handling the play-by-play duties, while Hall of Fame QB Len Dawson adds color commentary with sideline reports from Bob Gretz. The KCFX pregame show begins at 5:00 PM (CT).

KCTV-5 will televise the contest in Kansas City. Veteran broadcaster Roger Twibell calls the action, while former Chiefs CB Jayce Pearson ('86-92) and current FOX NFL analyst provides the color commentary on KCTV-5. Danyelle Sargent reports from the sidelines.

POSITION-BY-POSITION NOTES AND CONNECTIONS

QUARTERBACKS

Trent Green earned his first Pro Bowl invite a year ago and won the Derrick Thomas Award as the Chiefs MVP. Green has opened 48 consecutive regular season contests and needs four more starts to bypass Len Dawson (51) for the longest streak by a QB in franchise history. Green completed a career-high 330 of 523 passes for a career-high 4,039 yards with 24 TDs and 12 INTs for a 92.6 rating in 2003. His 92.6 rating ranked second in the AFC and fourth in the NFL while his 24 TD passes tied for third in the AFC. Green's 86.1 passer rating over his 11-year NFL career ranks ninth in league history.

Green's 4,039 passing yards in 2003 ranked as the third-highest single-season total in Chiefs history. He compiled a QB rating of 100.0 or better in a league-high seven games and eclipsed the 300-yard passing mark in five games. Green has led the Chiefs to a franchise-record 13 consecutive regular season victories at Arrowhead. In three seasons in Kansas City, Green has started 48 games, completing 913 of 1,516 passes (60.22%) for 11,512 yards with 67 TDs with 49 INTs. His 85.2 QB rating with KC and his 60.22 completion percentage are the best career marks of any QB in franchise history. His 67 TDs are tied for third in franchise annals with Steve DeBerg, while his yardage total ranks fourth. His 12 300-yard passing games in a KC uniform are second only to Bill Kenney (15). Since joining the Chiefs in a trade with St. Louis in 2001, Green has thrown for 11,512 yards, a total topped only by Indianapolis' Peyton Manning (12,598). Green completed 12 of 22 passes for 167 yards with a 79.2 rating vs. CLE (8/28). He has connected on 29 of 45 passes for 372 yards with a TD and a 97.6 rating in the 2004 preseason.

The Chiefs boast a pair of experienced signal callers working behind Green. Ten-year NFL veteran **Todd Collins** is in his seventh season with the Chiefs and in his fourth year as the club's top backup. In 37 career contests (17 starts) with the Bills and Chiefs he has completed 301 of 541 passes (55.6%) for 3,405 yards with 17 TDs and 19 INTs, good for a 70.5 rating. Collins completed 12 of 14 passes for 145 yards with two TDs vs. CLE (8/28). He has completed 33 of 44 throws for 380 yards with two TDs and a 115.7 rating in the 2004 preseason. Eight-year pro **Damon Huard** signed as a free agent with KC after spending three years in New England. In 38 games (six starts) with the Patriots and Dolphins he has completed 170 of 289 passes (58.8%) for 1,691 yards with nine TDs and eight INTs, good for a 74.3 rating. He saw his first action of the preseason vs. CLE (8/28), completing three of four passes for 19 yards. **Casey Clausen** joined the Chiefs as a rookie free agent from Tennessee.

RUNNING BACKS

Priest Holmes earned his third consecutive trip to the Pro Bowl after posting an NFL-record 27 rushing TDs in 2003. His 27 total TDs were also an NFL single-season record. He became the first running back in Chiefs history to be selected to three consecutive Pro Bowls. In 2003, the consensus All-Pro selection carried the ball 320 times for 1,420 yards (4.4 avg.) with 27 TDs and added 74 receptions for 690 yards (9.3 avg.). He became only the third player in NFL history to score more rushing TDs than every NFL team in a season in 2003. His 162 total points were the highest seasonal total in team history.

Holmes has started 46 games for the Chiefs the last three seasons, rushing 960 times for 4,590 yards (4.8 avg.) with 56 TDs and catching 206 passes for 1,976 yards with five TDs. He ranks second on the club's all-time rushing chart and needs 308 rushing yards in 2004 to move past Christian Okoye (4,897) for first in club history. Holmes ranks first in club history with 56 rushing TDs and 61 total TDs. Over the last three seasons, Holmes leads the NFL with 4,590 rushing yards, 6,566 yards from scrimmage and 56 rushing TDs. Over that same three-year span, Holmes has also registered 1,976 receiving yards, the highest total of any RB in the NFL. In 94 career games (65 starts) with BAL and KC, he has 1,419 carries for 6,692 yards (4.7 avg.) with 66 TDs and 294 catches for 2,561 yards (8.7 avg.) with six TDs. Holmes has rushed 12 times for 63 yards with a TD in the 2004 preseason.

Tony Richardson earned his first Pro Bowl invite in 2003, making him the first Chiefs FB to represent KC since Kimble Anders ('95-'97). In 131 games (64 starts) he has recorded 377 carries for 1,500 yards (4.0 avg.) with 15 TDs and 149 receptions for 1,112 yards (7.5 avg.) with seven TDs. His 1,500 rushing yards rank 18th in Chiefs history and he needs 190 more yards to move into 16th place. Richardson originally entered the NFL as a rookie FA with DAL in '94 and spent that season on the Cowboys practice squad.

Derrick Blaylock (D5b-01) and **Larry Johnson** (D1-03) are vying for playing time behind Holmes. Blaylock played in all 16 games in 2003, rushing 22 times for 112 yards (4.8 avg.) with two TDs and catching 15 passes for 181 yards (12.1 avg.) with a TD. He caught five passes for 106

yards with a TD vs. DET (12/14/03). Johnson has looked solid in camp after seeing action in six games in 2003, posting 20 carries for 85 yards (4.3 avg.) with a TD. FB **Omar Easy** (D4-02) leads the club with 10 catches in the 2004 preseason and works behind Richardson.

WIDE RECEIVERS/TIGHT ENDS

Eddie Kennison caught 56 passes for 853 yards (15.2 avg.) with five TDs in 2003. In three seasons with KC, Kennison has played in 37 games (31 starts), catching 125 passes for 2,081 yards with seven TDs. In 122 career NFL games (99 starts) with STL, NO, CHI, DEN and KC, he has 352 catches for 5,196 yards (14.8 avg.) with 24 TDs and 141 punt returns for 1,413 yards with three touchdowns. He also has 24 KORs for 468 yards. He DNP at NYG (8/13) and vs. STL (8/23) with a wrist injury.

Johnnie Morton started all 16 games at WR a year ago, catching 50 passes for 740 yards (14.8 avg.) with four TDs. In two seasons with the Chiefs he has started 30 contests, recording 79 receptions for 1,137 yards (14.4 avg.) with five TDs. He has appeared in 156 games (134 starts) in 10 seasons with DET and KC, catching 548 passes for 7,636 yards (13.9 avg.) with 40 TDs. He has missed all three preseason games.

Dante Hall (D5a-00) became the Chiefs first kick returner selected to two consecutive Pro Bowls. Hall touched the ball 142 times for a team-record 2,446 yards (17.2 avg.) with five TDs in 2003. He returned a team record 57 kickoffs, while amassing a club single-season record 1,478 yards (23.8 avg.) with two TDs. He also registered 29 punt returns for 472 yards (16.3 avg.) with two TDs. Hall set an NFL record when he returned a kick for a TD in four consecutive games and also became one of only eight players in NFL history to register four kick return TDs in a season. In addition, Hall also added a 92-yard kickoff return TD in the playoffs vs. IND (1/11/04). Hall has seven kick return TDs from 2002-03, three more than PIT's Antwaan Randle El who ranks second in that department.

On offense, Hall had a career-high 40 receptions for 423 yards (10.6 avg.) with a TD and 16 carries for 73 yards (4.6 avg.) in 2003. His 4,159 career kickoff return yards rank second in club annals while his 11.81-yard punt return average ranks atop the club charts.

Former CFL standout **Marc Boerigter** has played in 31 contests for KC, catching 31 passes for 578 yards (18.6 avg.) with eight TDs. He suffered a right knee injury vs. CLE (8/28). **Chris Horn** ranked second in NFL Europe this spring with 593 receiving yards on 34 catches as a member of the Amsterdam Admirals. He also spent seven weeks on KC's 53-man roster in 2003. **Samie Parker** (D4a-04) caught 178 passes for 2,770 yards with 21 TDs during his four-year career at Oregon. **Jeris McIntyre** (D6-04) hauled in 69 passes for 973 yards with four TDs during four seasons at Auburn, but has been slowed by a right hamstring injury. Rookie FA **Richard Smith** from Arkansas has five catches for a team-high 103 yards in the 2004 preseason and has been one of the club's most impressive rookies in camp. Other WRs on the roster include former Mid-America Nazarene QB **John Booth** and rookie FA **Zach Fletcher**.

Five-time Pro Bowl TE **Tony Gonzalez** (D1-97) started all 16 games in 2003, catching 71 passes for 916 yards (12.9 avg.) with 10 TDs. He led all NFL TEs with 71 receptions and 10 TDs, earning All-Pro honors. Gonzalez has caught a pass in 52 consecutive games, the second-longest mark in team history. In 111 games (95 starts) he has caught 468 passes, the highest total of any player in Chiefs history. He is fifth in team history with 5,647 receiving yards. His 47 TDs are tied as the eighth-highest mark by a tight end in NFL history and are fourth in Chiefs annals. He is the third tight end in NFL history to lead his franchise in career receptions, joining Denver's Shannon Sharpe (815) and Cleveland's Ozzie Newsome (662). Eight-year pro **Jason Dunn** is in his fifth season in KC and is regarded as one of the league's top blocking tight ends. **Billy Baber** (D5a-01) suffered a left knee injury on Aug. 6th and has not seen game action in the preseason. Rookie **Kris Wilson** (D2b-04) is expected to play multiple positions after a standout career at Pitt. He has six catches for 59 yards in the 2004 preseason. **Aaron Golliday** will also see time at TE.

OFFENSIVE LINE

Nine-time Pro Bowl RG **Will Shields** (D3-93) leads KC's offensive line. He has started a club record 175 consecutive games, the second-longest starting streak in the NFL behind Green Bay QB Brett Favre (189). Shields became the fourth Chiefs player to earn the league's most prestigious accolade when he was named the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year in 2003. Nine-time Pro Bowl LT **Willie Roaf** has compiled two straight Pro Bowl appearances with the Chiefs after joining the club in a trade with New Orleans in 2002. Roaf has started 163 NFL contests and pairs with Shields to give KC a guard-tackle combination with 18 combined Pro Bowl appearances, the highest active duo in the league.

C Casey Wiegmann earned All-Joe Team honors from *USA Today* for the second straight year in 2003 and has started 47 consecutive games for KC. He has started 99 regular season contests during his nine-year pro career with KC, CHI, NYJ and IND. LG **Brian Waters** is one of the NFL's finest young offensive linemen. He has started 39 straight contests at left guard for KC. Waters entered the NFL as a rookie FA with Dallas in '99 after playing TE, DE and FB at North Texas.

John Welbourn has started the club's first three preseason games at RT after being acquired in a 2004 Draft Day trade from PHI. Welbourn started 56 contests with the Eagles and opened in three straight NFC Championship Games for that club. UFA **Chris Bober** and **Brett Williams** (D4-03) also work at RT. In addition, Bober is also KC's top backup at center. Notre Dame product **Jordan Black** (D5-03) works behind Roaf at LT. **Darnell Alford** is the club's top backup at RG. Alford spent part of the 2002 season with DAL. **Kevin Sampson** (D7-04) will see time at LT and local prep product **Ryan Lilja** will play at LG. Former Panther **Tim Stuber** works at RG, while **Thomas Barnett** works at RT. Versatile G **Donald Willis** has been sidelined with a back injury and has been unable to practice thus far in 2004.

DEFENSIVE LINE

Left DE **Eric Hicks** entered the league as a rookie FA in '98. He led the DL and ranked fourth on the squad in 2003 with a career-high 118 tackles (52 solo) while ranking second on the team with 15 QB pressures. He also added 5.0 sacks and three PDs. He ranks sixth in team history with 35.5 sacks and needs 6.0 more to bypass Bill Maas (40.0) for fifth all-time in KC history. He enjoyed his most productive pro season in 2000 when he racked up 14.0 sacks under Gunther Cunningham, who has returned to KC as the club's defensive coordinator.

DE **Vonnie Holliday** was the starter at right DE in 2003, producing 80 stops, 5.5 sacks, seven QB pressures, three PDs and a FF. He recorded 3.0 sacks vs. SD (9/7/03) in his first game with the Chiefs. In 82 career games (79 starts) with KC and GB he has registered 340 tackles, 37.5 sacks, 85 QB pressures, 25 PDs, six FRs, six FF and two INTs. DT **John Browning** (D3-96) mans the left DT position after opening all 16 games a year ago, recording a career-high 92 tackles with 17 QB pressures. He has played in 89 games (77 starts), producing 372 tackles (218 solo), 21.0 sacks, 114 QB pressures, five passes defensed, four fumble recoveries and a forced fumble. Browning started at right DE vs. CLE (8/28). DT **Ryan Sims** (D1-02) opens at RT. The sixth overall selection in the 2002 NFL Draft, Sims started all 16 games in 2003, producing 83 stops, 3.0 sacks and seven QB pressures.

Special teams Pro Bowler DE **Gary Stills** (D3a-99) works behind Hicks. Stills is the first player in Kansas City history to earn a Pro Bowl invite for special teams other than a kick returner. He ranks second in Chiefs history with 98 special teams tackles. **Jimmy Wilkerson** (D6-03) plays behind Holliday with **R-Kal Truluck**. DE **Jared Allen** (D4b-03) has been impressive in the preseason, racking up a team-high 2.0 sacks. Allen is also challenging for time as a long snapper. NFLEL product **Robert Flickinger** also works at defensive end.

Lional Dalton and **Junior Siavii** (D2a-04) will play behind Sims. Dalton joined the Chiefs after previous pro stints with BAL, DEN and WAS. Dalton started at right DT vs. CLE (8/28). Syracuse product **Eric Downing** (D3a-01), **Eddie Freeman** (D2-02) and **Montique Sharpe** (D7a-03) will all see time behind Browning.

LINEBACKERS

Mike Maslowski started the first 10 games of the 2003 season at MLB before suffering a left knee injury which sidelined him for the remainder of the season. He finished with 79 tackles and five PDs. He amassed a Chiefs single-season best 162 tackles in 2002. He has missed the entire preseason schedule with a knee injury. Second-year player **Kawika Mitchell** (D2-03) is battling Maslowski for the starting job at MLB. He opened the final six games of the 2003 season and the club's playoff outing vs. Indianapolis (1/11/04). He recorded 25 tackles and an INT in 2003. Mitchell DNP play vs. CLE (8/28) with a left ankle injury suffered vs. STL (8/23). Rookie MLB **Rich Scanlon** also plays at MLB.

Shawn Barber returns to the starting ROLB position. He started all 16 games at that spot a year ago, finishing second on the team with 141 tackles and a career-high 5.0 sacks. He joined the Chiefs as an UFA from PHI in 2003. In 81 games (66 starts) with PHI and KC, he has 541 tackles, 9.0 sacks, 18 QB pressures, 26 PDs and six INTs. **Keyaron Fox** (D3-04) works behind Barber at ROLB. He recorded 376 tackles, 9.0 sacks and 14 PDs during his four-year career at Georgia Tech. Former Steelers second-round pick **Scott Shields** is making the transition from safety to linebacker in 2004. **Quinton Caver** also works at ROLB for KC.

Third-year LB **Scott Fujita** (D5-02) led the club in 2003 with 151 tackles, eight QB pressures, six PDs and an INT. In 32 career games (25 starts) he has produced 214 tackles, 5.0 sacks and 12 PDs. Versatile LB

Monty Beisel (D4a-01) started at MLB vs. CLE (8/28) due to injuries. He is expected to work behind Fujita at ROLB and has enjoyed a solid camp. He owns 53 career special teams tackles. **Fred Jones** and **Isaac White** also work at LOLB for the Chiefs.

CORNERBACKS

Nebraska product **Eric Warfield** (D7a-98) mans the left CB position for the fourth consecutive season. He had 77 tackles (62 solo), nine PDs and four INTs a year ago. In 88 games (51 starts) he has recorded 272 tackles, 48 PDs and 15 INTs with a TD. CB **Julian Battle** (D3-03) is making a push for playing time and should also contribute on special teams. He DNP vs. CLE (8/28) with a left hamstring injury. **Willie Ford** adds depth in the CB corps behind Warfield and Battle.

Eight-year veteran **Dexter McCleon** recorded 64 tackles and a team-high six INTs a year ago as the club's starter at right CB. In 107 games (73 starts) with the Rams and Chiefs, McCleon has 323 tackles (259 solo), 4.5 sacks, 78 PDs, 26 INTs, five FRs and a FF. **William Bartee** (D2-00) also provides experience in the secondary. In 57 games (22 starts) he has 176 tackles (140 solo), 2.0 sacks and 22 PDs. UFA acquisition **Cliff Crosby** and rookie FA **Benny Sapp** provide depth at right CB. Crosby racked up 67 special teams tackles over the past four seasons with IND.

SAFETIES

Hard-hitting FS **Jerome Woods** (D1-96) earned his initial invite to the Pro Bowl a year ago. He opened all 16 games at FS in 2003, recording 99 tackles, nine PDs and three INTs, two of which he returned for TDs. He returned INTs for TDs vs. PIT (9/14/03) and at GB (10/12/03). In 111 games (95 starts), he has 661 tackles (447 solo) to rank seventh on the club's all-time tackle chart. He also has 48 PDs, 28 QB pressures, 15 INTs, 11 FFs, four FRs and 4.0 sacks. He has missed all three games in the preseason. **Clint Finley** and **Willie Pile** provide depth.

SS **Greg Wesley** (D3-00) enters his fifth season as a starter after amassing 121 tackles (82 solo), six INTs, 10 PDs, one FF and 2.0 sacks in 2003. In 61 starts, he has 430 tackles (296 solo) and 16 INTs. Third-year pro **Shaunard Harts** (D7a-01) played in 16 games a year ago after posting 11 starts in 2002. In 35 games (11 starts) with KC he has 105 tackles (70 solo) and two INTs with one TD. He has opened all three preseason games at FS in place of Woods. Veteran **Lyle West** has played in 51 games (one start) with the NYG and KC, recording 19 tackles and 45 special teams stops. Rookie **Scott Connot** provides depth at SS.

SPECIALISTS

K **Morten Andersen** has appeared in 338 games, the second-highest total in NFL history behind George Blanda (340). Andersen has converted 502 of 636 field goals (.789) and 753 of 763 PATs for 2,259 career points, the highest active total in the league and the second-highest scoring tally in NFL history. Only Gary Anderson (2,346) has more points in league annals. Andersen is also in the top five in NFL history in numerous categories including most NFL seasons (22), most games played (338), most consecutive games played (248) and most PATs made (753). K **Lawrence Tynes** is in his third camp with the Chiefs after spending two record-breaking seasons in the CFL with Ottawa.

Jason Baker punted in 16 games for the Chiefs in 2003 and also kicked off. He produced a career-high 80 punts for 3,156 yards (39.5 gross, 33.2 net) with 21 inside the 20-yard line. TE **Kendall Gammon** has appeared in 192 consecutive NFL games as a long snapper.

Cowboys def. coord. **MIKE ZIMMER** coached at Missouri ('79-80) ...
