Operation Jedburgh

D-Day and America's First Shadow War

IN 1943, LESS THAN A YEAR before D-Day, nearly three hundred American, British, and French soldiers—shadow warriors—parachuted deep behind enemy lines in France as part of the covert Operation Jedburgh. Working with the beleaguered French Resistance, the "Jeds" launched a stunningly effective guerrila campaign against the Germans in preparation for the Normandy invasion.
