## Keeping Fit in Bartley Green Ward

Children in all 8 primary schools in Bartley Green Ward can now play golf in school. All schools have been given Tri-golf equipment and 4 schools (Woodgate Primary School; St Peter's Catholic Primary; St Michael's C.E. J&I School; Kitwell Primary School) have their own golf courses, which have been developed, in their own school grounds.

The funding secured has also contributed to training school staff in Tri-golf and schools have benefited from a number of 6 week golf courses ensuring all children have a chance to be Bartley Green's own Tiger Woods!

A former pupil of Woodgate Primary School, Fliss Johnson, became the English Ladies Amateur Golf Champion in May 2005 and won the BBC Midlands Sports Woman of the Year Award so the sky's the limit!

Bartley Green Ward has funded a local karate club, which meets at Shenley Court Leisure Centre and a Judo development project involving all of our primary schools.

Bartley Green Ward has also funded Spring and Summer water sports and after school activities for young people in the Ward; these projects give young people something constructive to do and rewards those who behave well.

A health and fitness programme has also been funded through Bartley Green Leisure Centre and it is hoped this will link with GPs to work in partnership to help people improve their health and quality of life.

Children and young people living in Bartley Green Ward have benefitted from a number of new play developments:

- Multi-user games area and a play area for younger children on Long Nuke Road
- A new play area at Senneleys Park
- A multi-user games area and Youth Shelter on the Balmoral Road, Kitwell Estate
- A play area for younger children at Romsley Road
- Multi-user games area and children's play area on 'Spider', Middle Hill Rise, Woodgate Valley.

Bartley Green Technology College has also received funding to develop a multi use sports pitch - this is an example of partnership working with the school who have match funded this project.

Bartley Green Ward has been working closely with all the local primary schools: examples of projects funded are school security projects at St Peters Catholic Primary and Kitwell Primary, environment projects at Woodcock Hill Primary and Shenley Fields Nursery, ICT development and furnishing a community meeting room at Paganel Primary school, a bird hide development project at Ley Hill Primary and a 'Books for Schools'- parent involvement project at St Michaels Primary.

Bartley Green Ward has also contributed towards funding for the Edgbaston constituency Youth Parliament to enable young people to have a say in local issues that concern them.

Your local Councillors are very aware that there is always more that can be done for the young people of Bartley Green Ward but we feel we have made great improvements to young people's lives and these projects are helping to make Bartley Green Ward a healthier place to live.

## Making Bartley Green Ward a safer place to live

Everybody is worried about crime in the area and your Councillors have been working hard to help make Bartley Green Ward a safer place to live.

Neighbourhood Renewal Funding has been used to install new security lighting to the homes of some of our most vulnerable residents on Wolverley Road and Dettonford Road.

The residents are delighted with the improvement this has made to their personal security. Residents on Bangham Pit estate have seen new secure front doors to their homes, improved street lighting, additional security lighting to council homes and problematic alleyways are to be closed off to prevent antisocial behaviour. There have been further improvements in street lighting including Nailers Close, Kirkwall Road, and Adams Hill.

Your local councillors always work closely with the local police and have allocated funding towards a number of projects.

These include:

- a police support vehicle to take witnesses to court safely and for use in undercover operations to target offenders
- a crime reduction and safety vehicle which can carry out surveillance and video criminal activity and a mobile police station which is able to move location to where need is greatest.
