32 outstanding teachers named finalists for Golden Apple Awards

(CHICAGO — Jan. 31, 2005) The Golden Apple Foundation today announced the names of 32 Chicago-area finalists for the 2005 Golden Apple Awards for Excellence in Teaching in grades 4 through 8.

A total of 747 teachers from Cook, Lake and DuPage counties were nominated for the award, which was first presented in 1986. Ten Golden Apple Award winners, selected from the 32 finalists, will be announced on March 9 and March 10.

The 32 finalists include

- **15 Chicago public-school teachers** (including two from Boone Elementary School)
- 2 Chicago Catholic-school teachers (from St. Clement Elementary School and Frances Xavier Ward School, Old St. Patrick campus)
- 1 Chicago Jewish-school teacher (from Bernard Zell Anshe Emet Day School)
- 14 suburban public-school teachers (including two from Winnetka)

The suburban schools are located in Arlington Heights, Hoffman Estates, Itasca, Lincolnwood, Lisle, Naperville, Oak Park, Palatine, Rolling Meadows, Wheaton, Wilmette, Winnetka (2), and Zion

For the first time in the 20-year history of the awards, one of the finalists, Carolyn Collins-Maragh, received her teacher preparation through the Golden Apple Scholars of Illinois program, which selects, prepares and mentors outstanding high school and college students to teach the needlest children in classrooms across the state. The Scholars program was conceived and developed by the Golden Apple Academy, which is comprised of previous Golden Apple Award winners.

Collins-Maragh, 30, a 1991 Scholar, teaches 7th and 8th grades at Alcott Elementary School, 2625 N. Orchard St. in Chicago. She is a graduate of Chicago's Von Steuben High School and DePaul University.

A complete list of finalists and their schools is attached.

The finalists will be honored Saturday, February 12 at the Celebration of Excellence in Teaching from 10 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at the House of Blues, 329 N. Dearborn St. in Chicago.

The Awards selection committee is comprised of more than 90 Chicago-area educators. Two committee members will observe each of the 32 finalists in the classroom and interview their principal and selected colleagues, parents and students. The 10 Golden Apple Award winners will be announced on March 9 and March 10. The winners will be honored at a 20th anniversary awards ceremony on May 7 at the Sheraton Chicago Hotel & Towers, which subsequently will be aired as a one-hour prime-time special on WTTW/Channel 11.

Each of the 10 Golden Apple Award winners will receive a tuition-free fall-term sabbatical at Northwestern University, a personal computer from Apple, \$2,500, and induction into the Golden Apple Academy, which now numbers 190 expert teachers who work together to ensure that all children have the excellent teachers they deserve.
