





DIVERSITY RULES THE DAY! ECLECTIC COLLECTIVE NOMINATED FOR 21ST ARIA AWARDS

Under total media embargo until 11.00am EST, Wednesday, 19th September, 2007:

The ARIA Awards voting community have nailed it again. Over 1,000 members of the Australian music industry have cast their votes and now ARIA (Australian Recording Industry Association) is proud to announce the much anticipated final five nominations in the 26 categories (*excluding Highest Selling Single and Album) with winners (excluding ARIA Artisan Awards and ARIA Fine Arts Awards recipients) to be announced at the 2007 ARIA Awards, proudly brought to you by Motorola, at Acer Arena in Sydney on Sunday October 28th.

Again showcasing the depth of talent across all genres of the Australian music community, the nominees range from well known icons including Silverchair, Powderfinger, John Butler Trio, Missy Higgins, The Wiggles and Keith Urban, to emerging artists such as Sneaky Sound System, Gotye, Josh Pyke, Kate Miller-Heidke, Operator Please, Architecture in Helsinki, Airbourne and Bindi Irwin.

Dance trio Sneaky Sound System have received 6 ARIA Award nominations for their debut self-titled album (plus 2 Artisan Award nominations) to be the most nominated act for the 2007 ARIA Awards. Their nomination's nods are in the Best Dance Release, Album of the Year, Single of the Year, Best Independent Release, Best Group and Best Breakthrough Artist - Album categories.

The fiercely independent John Butler Trio has been nominated for 5 ARIA Awards for their *Grand National* long player. Currently taking the JBT message to the world, John Butler Trio have been nominated in the categories of Album of the Year, Single of the Year, Best Independent Release, Best Blues and Roots Album, and Best Male Artist (John Butler).

After a lengthy absence from the studio, Silverchair are back with 4 nominations (plus 2 Artisan Award nominations) for their fifth studio album *Young Modern*. They have received nominations in the categories of Best Rock Album, Best Group, Album of the Year and Single of the Year.

Powderfinger are nominated for 4 ARIA Awards (plus 2 Artisan Award nominations) for their smash hit album *Dream Days at the Hotel Existence*. They are also nominated in the categories of Best Rock Album, Best Group, Album of the Year and Single of the Year.

Musician, writer and producer, Gotye, has scored 4 nominations (plus 2 Artisan Award nominations) for his *Mixed Blood* album. Gotye is nominated in the categories of Best Male Artist, Best Independent Release, Best Dance Release and Album of the Year. Another newcomer is the wonderful Kate Miller-Heidke, whose debut album *Little Eve* has landed her 4 nominations (plus 1 Artisan Award nomination) in the categories of Best Female Artist, Breakthrough Artist - Single, Breakthrough Artist - Album and Best Pop Release.

Receiving his maiden ARIA Award nominations is singer / songwriter Josh Pyke who has landed 3 nominations (plus 2 Artisan Award nominations) for his acclaimed debut album *Memories and Dust*. He's acknowledged in the categories of Best Adult Contemporary Album, Breakthrough Artist - Album and Best Male Artist.





















Fresh-faced power pop outfit Operator Please are nominated twice (Best Pop Release and Breakthrough Artist - Single) for the impossibly catchy single *Just A Song About Ping Pong*. They are also nominated for 1 Artisan Award. Missy Higgins' album *On a Clear Night* has garnered her 2 ARIA Award nominations - Best Female Artist and Best Pop Release.

A number of artists are making their first appearance on the ARIA Award nominations roll call. They include Melbourne rockers Airbourne (nominated for Best Rock Album and Breakthrough Artist - Album), Coco's Lunch (nominated for Best World Music Album and Best Children's Album), Architecture in Helsinki (nominated for Single of the Year), Something With Numbers (nominated for Breakthrough Artist - Single and also nominated for 1 Artisan Award), Small Mercies (nominated for Breakthrough Artist - Album), Art of Fighting (nominated for Best Adult Contemporary Album), New Buffalo (nominated for Best Adult Contemporary Album), Damien Leith (nominated for Breakthrough Artist - Single), and the inspirational Choir of Hard Knocks (nominated for Best Original Soundtrack / Cast / Show Album).

Other newcomers include the amazing CW Stoneking (nominated for Best Blues and Roots Album), Foreign Heights, Jackson Jackson and Justice and Kaos (all nominated for Best Urban Release) and Hook'n'Sling & Kid Kenobi and poxyMusic (both nominated in Best Dance Release category). And giving the Best Children's Album category a run for its money this year is first time nominee Bindi Irwin who is nominated for her album *Bindi Kid Fitness with Steve Irwin and The Crocmen*.

For the first time in the history of the ARIA Awards an uncle and nephew are nominated in the same category. Dan Kelly is nominated in the category of Best Male Artist alongside his uncle and band mate Paul Kelly who is also nominated in the Best Adult Contemporary Album category for *Stolen Apples*.

Other 2007 ARIA Award nominees include Keith Urban, David Bridie, The Wiggles, Hi-5, Katie Noonan, Sarah Blasko, Monsieur Camembert, Hilltop Hoods, Kasey Chambers, Grinspoon, Richard Tognetti and Australian Chamber Orchestra, Gina Jeffreys, Xavier Rudd, James Blundell and many, many more. The 2007 ARIA Award ARTISAN WINNERS were also announced today at the nominations event in the categories of Producer of the Year, Engineer of the Year, Best Video and Best Cover Art. ARIA is proud to announce that Wayne Connolly & Josh Pyke have received the ARIA Award in the coveted PRODUCER OF THE YEAR category for Josh's critically acclaimed debut album *Memories and Dust*. The multi skilled Wayne Connolly has also been named ENGINEER OF THE YEAR, again for his work on Josh Pyke's *Memories and Dust*. Highly respected film director Paul Goldman & Alice Bell have taken out the ARIA Award for BEST VIDEO for Silverchair's *Straight Lines* film clip. And Aaron Hayward & David Homer (Debaser) have won their 2nd ARIA Award for BEST COVER ART for Powderfinger's *Dream Days at the Hotel Existence*. ARIA would like to congratulate the winners and all the nominees in the 2007 ARIA Artisan Awards.

Winners of the Best Classical Album, Best Jazz Album, Best World Music Album and Best Original Soundtrack / Cast / Show Recording Album categories will be announced at the ARIA Fine Arts Awards on Monday October 15th.
