



How Con Artists Defraud The Insurance Industry

Mishchief makers falling deliberately in front of your car so that they can extract some compensation from the motorist is a practice that we associate with the urban areas of the underdeveloped countries. Not so, it seems. According to a finding by the Insurance Bureau of Canada, the practice thrives even here in apna Canada!

Canada's home, car and business insurers released this week their annual Top Ten Insurance Crimes list, highlighting some of the strangest and most audacious insurance frauds and auto theft cases uncovered by insurance investigators this year. This year's list includes the usual line up of con artists who try to make a fast buck by duping both innocent bystanders and insurance companies.

The list is intended to raise awareness of the most

ridiculous crimes concocted by insurance criminals.

"It never fails to amaze me the extent to which people will go to defraud the system," says Rick Dubin Vice-President of Investigations, Insurance Bureau of Canada (IBC). "Insurance crime is serious and costly and makes victims of us all.

A conservative estimate is that insurance crime costs Continued on page 3



To make it easier for Canadians to report auto theft, insurance fraud, staged auto collisions and other crimes related to insurance, Canada's home, car and business insurers have launched a national insurance crime TIPS line. Anyone with information about a possible insurance crime can call the toll-free TIPS line at 1-877-IBC-TIPS (422-8477) or submit a tip on-line at www.ibc.ca. All tips are kept confidential. Take the time and report insurance crime.

Insurance Bureau of Canada is the national trade association of the private property and casualty insurance industry. It represents the companies that provide more than 90% of the non-government home, car and business insurance in Canada.

The following are some of the 'highlights' from this year's Rogues Gallery:

1. Too Many Encores

His acting was quite good, and he also doubled as his own stuntman, but eventually his performance would earn him a very bad review. The man's act was simple and convincing. He would hang out in a parking lot until he spotted a woman or a senior backing out of a space. He would then step behind the car, bang the trunk with his fist and fall to the ground in apparent pain. At first, various insurers would settle his

claim, so he gave a repeat performance every two weeks. He put on a total of eleven shows until a sharpeyed adjuster gave him the thumbs down. After an investigation, his next appearance was in court, where he received a bad review and was ordered to repay his victims. His acting career is over.

2. Pirate Shipping

Stolen cars are one of Canada's fastest growing exports. Every year, an estimated 20,000 of them are loaded into shipping containers and sent

One crook thought he'd try to cash in on both ends of this illicit trade. First, he arranged to export his brand new high-end vehicle to his home country in Europe. Ninety days later, he filed an insurance claim in Canada saying his car had been stolen. Problem was, his car had already been seized at a port in Belgium along with two other stolen Canadian cars found in the same container.

Investigators were naturally suspicious of a theft report concerning a vehicle that had already spent weeks impounded in Belgium. They wondered why it had taken him so long to realize it was missing. So did the insurer. Claim denied.

3. Fender Bender Fraud

The man thought the damage to his car looked relatively minor. He'd accidentally scraped the left front quarter panel as he was pulling out of a parking space. So he was shocked to see the enormous bill and list of replacement parts - including a new front grill and cooling system - that the body shop was sending to the insurance company. The insurer agreed something seemed amiss. During the investigation, a sharpeyed appraiser recognized that the damaged parts that the body shop employees claimed had been removed from the man's car were actually from another vehicle. Fooling around with somebody else's parts can backfire. The body shop is currently being investigated by

4. The Chop Shop King

He was a very wealthy man, and when insurance investigators and police looked into his car dealership and body shop operations it was easy to see why. He ran two bustling chop shops - illegal garages where stolen cars are stripped for parts - and he had a significant side business that altered vehicle identification numbers. When police moved in, they seized 40 stolen vehicles with a cash Continued on page 4

value totalling \$1 million. In fact, the case was so big that the trial took 119 days and involved 190 witnesses. When the gavel came down, the Chop Shop King was

removed from his throne, sent to jail to serve a six-year sentence and ordered to pay a \$774,000 fine. As he pronounced the sentence, the judge referred to an IBCcommissioned study that

highlighted the social costs of car theft and said, in effect, that it's a crime that costs all Canadians.

5. Field of Schemes

It began as a routine auto theft claim. The man reported that his high-end pickup truck had been stolen, and he collected \$68,000 from his insurer. Months later, insurance investigators received a tip that led them to a farm owned by the

man's mother. There, in the middle of a field, they spotted the truck - what was

left of it. The man was selling it off piece by piece. The wheels were already gone along with a range of other parts. The investigators seized what remained, the insurer launched a lawsuit, and the man was charged with public mischief, fraud and obstructing a police officer.

6. Phantom Injuries



The "victims" weren't even in the car when it crashed, but they filed injury claims totalling over \$200,000. Turns out the fraudsters had received some expert coaching. A paralegal had recruited them and led them down a crooked trail. They were sent to a clinic - also a partner in the crime - for assessments and treatment of injuries that didn't exist, and the claims

were sent in. The whole scam was working fine until one of the "victims" revealed the truth. In the end, the only thing that really crashed was a conspiracy of greed.

7. Too Good To Be True

It looked like a bargain to the car owners wanting a deal on insurance.

Salespeople at a few car dealerships and other businesses were offering an insurance special. They were charging \$500 - a "finder's" or "consulting" fee - to arrange insurance with a broker they claimed would save the car owners lots of money on premiums. The scam artists were intentionally putting bogus information on the applications so that customers would be put into a cheaper rate group. However, because the policies were purchased under false pretenses, they were invalid. IBC received a tip that led to the discovery and dismantling of this scam, which involved hundreds of policies and finder's fees amounting to about \$1 million. The insurance company has since offered new policies, based on the correct information, to the duped customers.

8. Persistence Doesn't Pay

The ringleader didn't have to go far from home to find recruits to join her gang of crooks. At first she persuaded friends and family to join her in staging car accidents and filing false claims. Business was good, so she decided to expand by signing up her neighbours. Some of them took her up on her offer to make a quick, crooked buck, but she got greedier and greedier and needed more and more recruits. Eventually, she got so desperate that she began repeatedly pestering neighbours who had already turned her down. Finally, someone became annoyed enough to secretly record her pitch. It wasn't long before she was singing a different tune to police and Crown attor-

9. The Invisible Workers

Investigators noticed that the employees of one particular firm seemed to be very unlucky. A great many of them were getting involved in car accidents and filing injury claims. That was news to the company's owner and, when he was shown the long list of his unfortunate workers, the scam began to unravel. The owner scanned the names and said none of the people had ever worked for him.

In fact, he had never even heard of them. It turned out that a rogue paralegal was the driving force behind a staged accident ring and, to boost the compensation claims of his "victims," he had forged their employment forms.

The paralegal's out of work now, too.

10. Very Bad Advice

A man injured in a collision decided to get some cheap legal advice and assistance from a paralegal. He certainly got what he paid for. The paralegal had the man sign a pile of legal forms without explaining what they meant and, all the while, assured him that he would look after him. The paralegal went on to negotiate on the man's behalf with the insurance company without telling his client, then forged the man's signature on the resulting cheque and cashed it.

When confronted by his client, the paralegal shamelessly denied any wrongdoing. He continued to deny it during his trial and even after he was convicted. \square



Canadian wireless telephone companies to implement wireless number portability (WNP) by March 14, 2007, in most of Canada. The decision follows a public notice issued on September 16, 2005, in which the Commission invited comments on several issues related to the implementation of WNP.

"This decision establishes the earliest feasible date for wireless number portability consistent with a smooth and reliable transition for wireless customers," says Charles Dalfen, Chairman of the CRTC. "Consumers should be given the widest possible choice of service providers and should be able to switch telephone companies without unwarranted cost or inconven-

By March 14, 2007 Bell Mobility, Rogers Wireless and the mobility division of TELUS Communications Inc. will be required to provide WNP to their customers in British Columbia, Alberta, Ontario and Québec. This means that customers in any of these provinces will be able to switch to any service provider in that province (wireline or wireless) and keep their phone number.

Throughout Canada, all wireless carriers will, by the same date, be required to release a phone number to another carrier (port-out customers) and by no later than September 12, 2007, to accept a phone number from another carrier (port-in customers).

While WNP will remove a significant barrier to changing wireless service providers, consumers should bear in mind that handsets may not function on different wireless carriers networks due to different network technologies; customers may have binding long term service contracts with early termination fees; long distance services may not be transferable from one carrier to another; and not all the services that a customer has with one service provider will be supported or provided by another service provider.


In the February budget of 2005, the Government of Canada requested the Commission move expeditiously to implement WNP. In a 2005 Decima survey conducted for the CRTC 70% of wireless consumers surveyed indicated that keeping their telephone number when changing wireless service important. providers was Comments from individuals during the Commission's proceeding were unanimously in favour of WNP and asked that it be implemented as

soon as possible.

Despite the CRTC ruling, not many consumer groups expect to see the decision being implemented without a fight. Used as they are to doing business with no real competition, the phone companies have already said it's going to be a challenge to meet the deadline.

Britain's Virgin Mobile boss Richard Branson who has been in the forefront of criticizing Canada's system stated, "We're not pleased with the deadline of early 2007 for implementation of number portability set out in the CRTC's decision as we firmly believe it can and should happen next year."



was shot in guerrilla style as the marriages were held at secret locations since the practice is banned by law.

"After living for years in the United States, the Indian summer heat and dust was gruelling," Neeraj said. I travelled on a motorcycle, day and night, up and down Rajasthan and Haryana. On the way, I met many fascinating people. I passed by crumbling, neglected monuments that have stood the test of time for thousands of years.

"One night, while sleeping in a courtyard I was bitten by an alley dog. That village had no doctors, so I had to resort to cleaning my wounds with wet wipes. Worst of all, after that incident, the dog slept right next to my cot," Neeraj added.

Nonetheless, he said he had a "great time" making the documentary and hoped his message will reach far and wide.

Neeraj is now working on two projects related to India, it's environs and society.

OPEC building and fired a number of shots, killing three people. They took 62 people hostage including 11 oil ministers.

The dead were an Iraqi security official, a Viennese police officer, and a Libyan delegate whose body was only found 21 hours later after the terrorists had withdrawn with their hostages.

During the siege, the commando forced the Austrian authorities to have a statement by a so-called "Arm of the Arab Revolution" read out on radio every two hours.

They also demanded conditions including a getaway plane, and threatened that otherwise they would kill one hostage every 15 minutes.


After releasing Austrian hostages, and then hostages resident in Austria, the terrorists were allowed to depart from Vienna Airport and fly to Algiers with their remaining 33 captives on the morning of December 22.

In Algeria the remaining hostages were eventually released, and the terrorists temporarily detained before being allowed to depart for Libya.

In later years, some of the terrorists were brought to justice. "Carlos" was finally captured in Sudan by a French commando force in 1994, nearly 20 years after the OPEC attack. He was brought to France, and three years later sentenced to life imprisonment for other terrorist attacks on French targets.

Presently, aged 56, he is being held in a high-security jail near

the gang, Gabriele Tiedemann, was arrested at the Swiss border in December 1977 after shooting and wounding two Swiss customs men. After ten years in jail she was extradited to her native Germany.

There she was charged with double murder and hostage-taking connected with the OPEC raid, but acquitted due to insufficient evidence. In 1995, Tiedemann died of cancer aged

A notorious German terrorist, Hans-Joachim Klein, was seriously wounded by a police bullet during the attack, but managed to escape with the others. He renounced terrorism soon after the OPEC attack, and for years went into hiding.


In September 1998, after 23 years on the run, he was finally captured in Normandy, extradited to Germany, and in 2001 sentenced to nine years' jail for his part in the OPEC raid. In December 2003, at the age of 55, he was pardoned and released.

The identities of the other three terrorists - presumably Palestinians - were never made known. Equally unclear was who was directly responsible for the three murders. Each of the arrested terrorists accused the others, and experts were unable to match bullets with individual weapons.

In the intervening years after the OPEC attack, Libya was gradually marked down as the organiser. Klein said during his trial that weapons and information about OPEC security had been given to the terrorists via the Libyan embassy.

Libyan revolutionary leader Muammar Gaddafi was directly accused in a 2002 book by German journalist Oliver Schroem "In the Shadow of the

Three decades after the OPEC attack, Gaddafi is now internationally accepted and has regular business relations with the outside world. He has renounced terrorism and compensated some of the victims with large sums of

Mississauga-Erindale Riding Grapples With An 'Islamic' Issue

In a press release issued on December 20, the Liberal Party of Canada called on the Canadian Coalition for Democracies to apologize for issuing what they have described as "a blatantly false, politically-motivated news release targeting Mississauga-Erindale candidate Omar Alghabra".

The CCD release, issued on Dec.19, alleged Mr. Alghabra said in his nomination victory speech on December 1, 2005: "This is a victory for Islam! Islam won! Islam Won! ... Islamic power is extending into Canadian politics."

Mr. Alghabra has denied ever saying it. He said:"I categorically deny making this statement, and anyone who says otherwise is lying. I challenge anyone to produce proof that I linked politics and religion."

The Liberal press release quote reporters who were present for the speech, including reporters for Rogers Television, as saying that they did not hear the statements in question. The Liberal party is asking everyone to views the Rogers community channel tape of Alghabra's

speech to verify the facts.

The Liberal party has questioned the motives of the CCD. The release states: "The organization who issued the release is the Canadian Coalition Democracies. The executive director is Naresh Raghubeer, a former executive assistant of former Conservative MPP, Mississauga-Streetsville Conservative candidate, Raminder Gill. The group's board of directors include Michael Mostyn, the Conservative candidate in York Centre, and Georgeanne Burke, the Conservative Party's regional organizer in Toronto."

"My reputation has been tarnished, and I am demanding an immediate apology from this organization and from all those who have published this falsehood," said Mr. Alghabra.

Alghabra is a former president of the Canadian Arab Federation, and he is also a former member of the Toronto Star's community editorial board and a board member for the Canadian International Peace Project, a multi-faith effort to promote peace and understand-

ing in the Middle East.

"This release does not withstand the most basic test of scrutiny, and legitimate news organizations have rejected this story quickly," said Mr. Alghabra, "but the damage has been done on the internet and in blogs. I am seeking an immediate retraction to ensure smear campaigns such as this do not become the norm in Canadian politics."

Reacting to the Liberal press release, Naresh Raghubeer, clarifies, "My name has been unnecessarily dragged into it. I have been on a leave of absence from the organization and I cannot comment on it now." But he is sure that the CCD acted In good faith after receiving reports from others who claim to have heard similar Pro-Islam sentiments expressed at the meeting.

In a report on Dec. 22, the Mississauga News has quoted former MP from the riding Carolyn Parrish as saying that the Pro-Islamic sentiments expressed at the meeting didn't come from Omar Aghabra. But she did tell the News that there were others who expressed similar sentiment as

though it was an Islamic victory, which she found to be "inappropriate".

Commenting on the Mississauga Erindale situation, Tarek Fatah of Muslim Canadian Congress, wrote: "Carolyn Parrish is the Canadian Liberal politician who is known for her infamous stomping on a George Bush doll and referring to Americans as 'bastards.'

"In addition, she has been the most vocal supporter of the Palestinian cause in the Canadian parliament, having led a parliamentary delegation to the occupied territories and publishing a revelaing account of Israel's mistreatement of the Palestinians.

"In the current election, she stepped aside and the resulting nomination battle to fill her Liberal seat has now led Carolyn Parrish to implicitly support the Conservatve Party.

"My feeling is that she is getting back at some of our community leaders, who, I am told, said "F*** Off" to her during the Liberal nomination meeting where she was supporting Charles Sousa against Omar Alghabra, who won the nomination hands down, and is now the Liberal Party candidate.

"The incident of hundreds of Muslims chanting "Allah Akbar" inside an Egyptian Coptic Church at the conclusion of the nomination meeting, also must have left a bad taste. She is now telling her consituents that it is ok to vote for the Conservatives against her own Liberal Party.

"How could the Muslim community end up on the wrong side of such a prominent supporter of the Palestinians?"

Court Changes Norm On 'Decency'

Two Montreal clubs that cater to group sex do not breach standards of decency, Canada's Supreme Court has ruled. Wednesday's ruling, written by Chief Justice Beverley McLachlin, said group sex among like-minded adults in private does not meet the test of indecency.

The decision might make it easier for "swinger" clubs or gay bath houses to operate without the threat

of police intervention or arrest.

The ruling dealt with two Montreal cases in which swinger club operators were charged with keeping a bawdy house.

Canada's criminal code defines a bawdy house as a location that is kept for prostitution or indecent acts.

James Kouri and Jean-Paul Labaye were both convicted, but the unsettled state of the law was demonstrated clearly when separate Court of Appeal rulings upheld Labaye's conviction and overturned Kouri's.

The high court threw out Labaye's conviction and affirmed the Kouri decision.

"Entry to the club and participation in the activities were voluntary. No one was forced to do anything or watch anything. No one was paid for sex," McLachlin wrote in reference to the Labaye case.

Over \$100 Political Donations To Be Made Public

New Legislation that will strengthen Ontario's democracy by setting scheduled election dates, providing for real-time disclosure of political contributions, and protecting 11 ridings in the North has come into effect the Minister Responsible

for Democratic Renewal Marie Bountrogianni announced this week.

"With the passage of this legislation, we've taken a bold step forward in improving accountability and transparency in Ontario," said Bountrogianni.

"We've amended the province's election laws because citizens should know when elections will be held. They should know how political parties are financed. And they should be fairly represented in the legislature."

The new legislation:

- Sets scheduled election dates so they take place every four years. The next election will be held on October 4, 2007.

- Provides for real-time public disclosure of donations to political parties and leadership candidates, retroactive to January 1, 2004.

All contributions of over \$100 have to be reported to Elections Ontario within 10 business days. The public will be able to access th information on Elections Ontario's website within 10 business daysafter it is reported.

- Preserves 11 northern ridings and increases the number of southern ridings from 92 to 96, securing strong representation for all Ontarians in the legislature. "With these measures, we've taken the next step in the most ambitious democratic renewal initiative in this province's history," said Bountrogianni.

"I believe that the democracy that we're building together through this process will be rich, vital

and strong."

The real-time disclosure of political Contributions applies to political parties and leadership candidates in both election and non-election periods. It is the first system of its kind in Canada, and allows the public to track contributions through the Internet.

The new system applies to contributions over \$100. A political party or leadership campaign is required to report contributions over \$100 to the Chief

Election Officer within 10 business days of their being deposited into a bank account. Failure to file the report is an offence that, upon conviction, could result in a fine for a party of up to double the amount of the unreported contribution.

The Chief Election Officer is required to post contribution reports on the Internet within 10 business days of receiving a report.

The proposed system requires all such contributions dating back to January 1, 2004, to be disclosed if they have not already been reported.



I became a Permanent Resident of Canada six months ago and now I would be going back to India to get married in January 2006. What are the necessary steps, which need to be taken so that when I sponsor my wife there is no problem in her getting a visa?

Since you have decided to get married it is imperative to take care of all the necessary formalities both before and after the marriage.

When a person is getting married outside Canada he/she should ensure that the marriage would be valid as per the laws of the country where it is going to take place and as per Canadian laws.

As you are a Canadian immigrant you need to be in Canada to sponsor your spouse, but had you been a Canadian citizen you could have sponsored your wife while you were outside Canada.

In order to be eligible to sponsor your wife you should:

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Sign an undertaking promising to reimburse the Government of every benefit provided as social assistance to your wife from the date she becomes a permanent resident until three years.
- Not be in the process of being removed from Canada.
- Not be detained in any penitentiary, jail, reformatory or prison.

- Not have been convicted for certain type of criminal offences
- Not be in default of any undertaking that you signed or any support payment obligations ordered by a court
- Not be in default in respect of the repayment of certain type of debts payable to Her Majesty in right of Canada.
- Not be an un-discharged bankrupt You should submit the following supporting documents with your case when you sponsor your wife:
- A marriage certificates duly registered by the registering authority in India.
- Proof of engagement- engagement photographs and video
- Proof of marriage wedding photographs and video, photographs and video of reception.
- Bills of the clothing, jewelry and gifts bought for the wedding.
- Bills of expenses incurred for the wedding such as the banquet hall for reception etc.
- Proof that you stayed with your wife after the wedding honeymoon

pictures, hotel bills etc.

- Proof that you have stayed in touch with your wife after the wedding – telephone bills, emails and/or letters exchanged, cards etc.
- Proof of any gifts exchanged after the wedding.
- Proof of your income employment records etc.- but you can sponsor your wife even if are not earning anything.

Over all you and your wife have to prove that the marriage is genuine and was not entered into primarily for the purpose of her gaining admission into Canada

Canada Wants India's Cirus Reactor Opened To Inspection

Canada has urged India to allow nuclear inspectors access to a Canadian-supplied reactor where experts say the country produces a significant amount of its weapons-grade plu-

Lack of independent access to the CIRUS reactor, located north of Mumbai, is one of the issues slowing implementation of a nuclear cooperation deal that the US announced with India on July 18.

The deal has come under fire from the US Congress and from non-proliferation experts who say the case of the 40mw reactor raises questions about India's trustworthiness.

Canada said on Monday it has urged US and Indian officials to designate the reactor a civilian facility open to inspection by the International Atomic Energy Agency.

The US is directly affected because it supplied CIRUS with "heavy water", which is used in some reactors to moderate nuclear fission.

India-US talks on nuclear issue today

India and the US are expected to spell out the steps taken by them on implementation of Civil Nuclear deal when Foreign Secretary, Shyam Saran, and his American counterpart, Nicholas Burns, have finished their talks in Washington this week.

Foreign Secretary Shyam Saran in press meet challenged the critics including the the nonproliferation lobby on the Indian nuclear plants to be listed as civilian or military.

In a question and answer session that followed his speech on 'Transforming India-US Relations: Building a Strategic Partnership,' at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, Saran, said, "There will be as many wish lists and as many separation plans as there are experts.

"[But] it is not our intention to negotiate this through the media or the think-tanks. We will be addressing the separation plan on the basis that this has to be an efficient, credible one ... It should not - at least as far as we are concerned - impact adversely on our strategic program."

He did not respond immediately to questions about the nuclear nonproliferation lobby's statements about India having diverted plutonium from its Canadian-supplied CIRUS reactor, meant for peaceful purposes only, over to its nuclear weapons program. This was prompted Canada to urge New Delhi and Washington to "place the CIRUS reactor on the civilian side of the fuel cycle and under IAEA [International Atomic Energy Agency] safeguards."

Saran said these issues would be addressed at the appropriate time, asserting that India had "not departed from any of our international commitments."

When asked why India would not put a moratorium on

Missing Indian Doctor's **Body Found In Car**

The body of an Indian-American doctor in San Jose, California, missing for over a month, has been recovered from inside a car pulled out from the estuary off a boat ramp at Alameda.

The police on Wednesday confirmed that the body was that of 55-year-old paediatrician Zehra Attari, missing since November 7, the day she disappeared after leaving her Oakland office, presumably to attend a medical conference.

Police divers began searching the area after a tip on Sunday from a woman, who reported seeing her on that day. The tipster said she had seen Attari driving in Alameda as if she were lost.

On Tuesday night, police divers found her 2001 Grey Honda Accord buried deep in the water's muddy bottom about 30 to 50 feet off the end of the boat ramp.

Though the police have not ruled out foul play, family friends and relatives believe it might have been an accident. San Jose community activist and family friend Annie Dandavati told reporters that the road ends in an incline, which Attari may have thought was a ramp to a bridge. She said there was no way of knowing the road led directly into

"I think it's shameful that there is no barrier," said Ruby Ali, one of Attari's children. The victim's family had offered a \$20,000 reward for information leading to her safe return. A spokesperson for the Alameda County Coroners office said the coroner was awaiting lab reports to determine the cause of death. \Box

fissile material production as other major nuclear weapons states have done, Saran argued these were issues not covered by the US-India Joint Statement that specifically dealt only with the issue of civilian nuclear cooperation between the US and

"The important thing to remember here is that the July 18 statement is not about India's strategic program. It is an agreement about civilian nuclear energy cooperation between India and the United States," he told the audience.

"Pursuing that civilian nuclear cooperation with the United States, what India is willing to do is to give assurances to its partners that whatever is coming as technology cooperation from partners will not be diverted to India's strategic program and will not be diverted to third countries," he said.

As far as the Fissile Material Cut-off Treaty is concerned, Saran said, "We are committed to the negotiation of a multilateral, certifiable Fissile Material Cut-off Treaty in the Conference of Disarmament."

On the issue of full-scope safeguards on India's civilian nuclear reactors once the separation was completed and agreed to by the US, Saran said India had absolutely no problem with that, as long as "there is a guarantee or assurance of lifetime supply of fuel. Then we would not have a problem with lifetime safe-

"Bringing India into the fold," he said, "is not only a gain for international nonproliferation efforts but indispensable for the emergence of a new global consensus on nonproliferation in response to current challenges." He added, "Any objective assessment of efforts to counter WMD proliferation would surely put a high value on Indian participation.'

He added: "One may as well suggest that the US should only reward those who stray from nonproliferation norms, not those who observe them! I might add, particularly for the benefit of those who are partial to this line of reasoning, that by strengthening its export control regime and committing to non-transfer of reprocessing and enrichment technologies and to international efforts to limit their spread, India has actually undertaken additional commitments that place it in an 'NPT plus' category."

Saran argued that "if India's past record and current policies are not recognized, and, worse still, if it is to be equated with those whose record in this respect is more than suspect, then our nonproliferation objectives may enjoy the comfort of noble intentions but not the efficacy of practical action."

Saran said, "Indo-US relations are at a crossroads. We have two clear choices before us. One is the road that we have traveled before - one that will maintain the status quo and the distance between our two democracies."

"The other," he said, "not without its challenges, recognizes the enormous changes of the last decade, appreciates the resulting opportunities, and is prepared to depart from established positions to realize a genuine strategic partnership."

Honda Civic Tops Canada's **Most Stolen Vehicles**

Canada's car insurers announced that the 1999 and 2000 Honda Civics SiR 2-door hold the dubious distinction of topping this year's most stolen vehicles list. The two models also had the highest theft claims cost per vehicle. In addition, the Honda Civic 1994, 1995, and 1993 models are also found in the 4th,6th and 10th spots respectively on the list of most frequently stolen vehicles.

The Top Ten Stolen Vehicles are: 1 2000 Honda Civic SiR 2-door

- 2 1999 Honda Civic SiR 2-door

Of particular note, none of the vehicles making the top ten most frequently stolen vehicles list had an Insurance Bureau of Canadaapproved immobilizer system.

"Now that IBC-approved theft deterrent systems or immobilizers are commonly in place in newer

vehicles, auto thieves have been turning increasingly to older vehicles," says Rick Dubin, Vice-President, Investigations, IBC.



"We've seen this trend developing for several years, and these results confirm it," adds Dubin.

Electronic immobilizers are systems that prevent a vehicle from starting unless a specific electronic code is used. IBC, along with vehicle manufacturers, after-market manufacturers, and other interested stakeholders, developed a Canadian standard for automobile theft-deterrent systems that was approved by the Standards Council of Canada in 1998. Many insurance companies provide premium discounts on automobile policies to customers whose vehicles are equipped with an IBC-approved, factory-installed or aftermarket immobilizer system.

"Immobilizers are highly effective at deterring car thieves. In terms of this year's stats, you have to go down the list to the 81st most-frequently stolen spot to find a vehicle, the 2001 Audi Quattro 4-door, that registered thefts despite the fact that it is protected by an immobilizer. It just underlines the reality that theft is much more likely when a vehicle is not equipped with an immobilizer," Dubin adds.

In contrast, vehicles that were least stolen last year included models that featured immobilizer systems. Those vehicles that were best insurance bets as far as auto theft is concerned included the following:

1998 Lincoln Continental 2001 Pontiac Bonneville 2002 Oldsmobile Silhouette



Harper Vows To End Corruption In High Places

March Of Dimes Peel To Have New Police Chief



Delhi blocks Nigeria oil deal

A plan by India's state-run oil company ONGC to acquire a stake in a Nigerian oil field has been blocked by cabinet. The decision comes after ONGC had won an auction for Akpo, a planned oil and gas field outside Nigeria.

An offer of between \$1bn (£565m) and \$2bn won the auction for ONGC, an official said in New Delhi. "We had consulted the government at every stage. We were expecting an approval," the official said. "It is a huge embarrassment."

India is currently reviewing its strategy for acquisitions of energy assets abroad, and as part of the process the Nigeria investment was deemed too risky, officials told Reuters. "It has not been approved," said finance minister Palaniappan Chidambaram. "Nigeria is a very risky country to invest in, especially for state-owned companies like ONGC," said Jaspreet Singh, a senior analyst with Prabhudas Lilladher. \square



AP Court strikes at illegal constructions

The Andhra Pradesh High Court on Wednesday struck in a big way at illegal constructions in the twin cities. It directed the government and municipal corporation not to regularise any illegal construction whether by administrative action or otherwise. It also set up a mechanism to speedily deal with all pending cases on illegal constructions.

The bench comprising Chief Justice Ganpath Singh Singhvi and Justice R. Subash Reddy was dealing with an appeal filed by M.V. Srinivas seeking the court's intervention to stop illegal construction on a vacant site abutting Manasa Apartment at Begumpet.

There are believed to be over 30,000 unauthorised constructions in the city. In 1998, the MCH received 20,000 applications for its Building Regularisation Scheme (BRS) and cleared 4,000 of them, turning down the remaining 16,000. The High Court halted the scheme in 1998. The number of illegal structures have doubled since then. The MCH standing committee recently passed a resolution recommending that the government restart the BRS.

The court issued a series of directions to

curb illegal constructions. It directed the MCH to provide by December 26, the list of cases challenging its action on illegal constructions that are pending adjudication before the civil courts. The list is also to be given to the chief judge of the city civil court who will transfer all the cases, including those filed by MCH and those filed against the MCH, to two judicial officers.

The bench directed the judges who would be assigned with the task to dispose of the cases within 60 days on merits. It directed the chief judge to report within six weeks about the pendency and disposal of such cases and file a compliance report.

The bench felt that it would be appropriate to restrain MCH authorities and the State government and officials concerned from regularise illegal construction whether by any administrative action or otherwise. When the matter came up for hearing the bench wanted to know from MCH standing counsel Jyothi Kiran regarding the action taken by the authorities against the officer who was responsible for the illegal constructions. \square

Venkaiah drops out of BJP presidential race

BJP vice-president M. Venkaiah Naidu has opted out of the race for party president's post. Mr Naidu told the party that he was "not willing" to replace Mr L.K. Advani, who will relinquish his post on December 31. Also, a section of the RSS is against Mr Naidu taking over as the BJP chief since he was being regarded as a "proxy candidate" for Mr Advani.

The RSS, which has been insisting on getting a man steeped in the Sangh ideology, was keen on Dr Murli Manohar Joshi. Former prime minister Atal Behari Vajpayee has indicated that he would agree to the Sangh choice, a senior party functionary disclosed.

However, most of the second generation leaders were trying to block Dr Joshi's candidature. Following Mr Naidu's reluctance, they are trying to persuade Mr Vajpayee to back BJP general secretary Rajnath Singh for the post. According to sources, after the latest sting operations in which the BJP was on the top of the corruption meter, the RSS was insisting on a person with clean record and committed to the Sangh. The Sangh using reports of Mr Naidu's relatives' involvement in a Rs 22-crores scam against his selection. For a majority in the Sangh, Dr Joshi has emerged as the leading candidate. Although BJP general secretary Pramod Mahajan indicated that the Sangh was "not playing a proactive role," sources disclosed that the RSS would have a major say in the choice of the party president. The RSS and other Sangh outfits were of the view that during the past few years "the BJP not only digressed from its ideological plank, but also lost its credibility." The Sangh is waiting for Mr Vajpayee's reaction as he "is known for his flip flop," said an RSS functionary.

Aid group warns of harsh winter in quake areas

The British aid group Oxfam warned on Wednesday that the harsh winter could cause a new wave of casualties in quake-hit northern Pakistan unless international donors honour pledges for millions of homeless survivors.

"With the onset of winter, thousands of people remain vulnerable," Oxfam Director Barbara Stocking said at the start of a two-day tour of camps in Muzaffarabad, the capital of Pakistan Kashmir, where a large number of about 3.5 million survivors have been living

"The international community has still not

responded with urgently needed resources," she said in a statement.

The 7.6-magnitude quake on October 8 killed about 87,000 people and left about 3.5 million homeless.

Uprooted survivors have been mostly relying on donated food, clothes, blankets and other essential items as aid workers worried about the onset of snow and rains.

Oxfam has urged the world community to continue providing money so UN aid agencies can continue flying helicopters to ferry aid to survivors living on the highlands. \square

Students battle bandits in Waziristan

At least seven people have been killed in what officials say was a battle between Islamic students and bandits in Pakistan's northwestern tribal region. Reports say five bandits and two students were killed in the village of Shawal in North Waziristan, along the border with Afghanistan.

Earlier this month, at least 15 people were killed in similar clashes.

North and South Waziristan have been at the centre of the hunt for Taleban and al-Qaeda militants. Hundreds of militants and more than 250 Pakistani soldiers have died in the tribal areas along the border with

Afghanistan in the past two years. The identities of those taking on the bandits is not clear. Some reports have describe them as Islamic students.

Others say they are members of the Taleban that governed neighbouring Afghanistan until toppled by the United States. In the clashes earlier this month, the bodies of two bandits were hung from an electricity pylon near the main town of North Waziristan, Miranshah.

One was beheaded and his head stuck on top of a bamboo pole. The clashes are said to have taken place after the suspected bandits tried to extort money at a roadblock.

Huge aircraft deal 'transparent' says minister

Union Civil Aviation Minister Praful Patel on Wednesday defended the proposed Rs 48,000 crore aircraft deal for Indian Airlines and Air India and assured the Rajya Sabha that the entire process was transparent and properly negotiated.

He also said the two airlines would raise money for these deals through market borrowings and the Government would back the airlines with sovereign guarantees. Moreover, efforts were on to achieve more synergy between the two airlines, the minister informed the Elders and ruled out any merger of the two entities.

Replying to a question posed by JD (U) member Sharad Yadav, Mr. Patel said the process of acquiring new aircraft for the two airlines had already taken 16 years and there was complete transparency in the deal which was in final stages of negotia-

Mr Yadav, a former civil aviation minister, asked the Government to reconsider the decision on purchase of aircraft saying this would impose a burden on the exchequer. He said the Government should opt for wet leasing of planes as there was immense technogical manpower available in the country and planes were available from the west.

The civil aviation minister, however, differed with Mr Yadav and said that the JD(U) probably meant dry lease and not wet lease and said the Government was committed to strengthening the fleet strength of national carriers.

He informed the House the deal for purchase of 43 Airbuses for the Indian Airlines would cost Rs 9,888 crore as against Rs 10,237 crore. As regards acquisition of aircraft by Air India and Air India Charters Limited, the Public Investment Board had approved a proposal for acquisition of 50 aircraft by Air India at an estimated cost of Rs 33,198 crore and 18 B 737-80 aircraft at an estimated cost of Rs 4,952 crore. □





Hitler's Art On eBay

Original watercolor paintings by Adolf Hitler are going for a few thousand euros on the Austrian page of the auction website eBay, press reports said Wednesday.

A painting titled "Muenchen," (Munich) bearing the signature of the former Nazi dictator and described by the seller as a "rarity", was put up for auction on Monday at an asking price of 2,100 euros (2,495 dollars) on eBay.at.

Another watercolor by Hitler, titled "Bad Gastein," received at least 25 bids before selling for more than 4,500 euros (5,340 dollars) on Tuesday, according to the daily Der Standard.

Austrian-born Hitler famously had ambitions to become an artist and was turned down by the Vienna Academy of Fine Arts, before leading the Nazi Party to power in Germany in 1933.

His production of paintings and sketches was prolific but experts see little artistic merit in them and major auction-houses shy away from them because of their author's bloodstained career.

A slick of chemicals from a toxic river spill in China has reached the Russian city of Khabarovsk after weeks of anxious waiting for residents.

Officials say the levels of the deadly benzene toxins were at acceptable levels and water supplies, which are being filtered, will not be cut.

The benzene spill into the Amur river was caused by an explosion at a Chinese chemical factory last month.

Khabarovsk residents have been stocking up with drinking water for weeks.

Charcoal filters and dams of sandbags have been used to prevent toxins entering Khabarovsk's

water supplies. The authorities say samples from the river are being constantly assessed.

The contamination is estimated to cover 190km of river, and will take several days to pass through

Rumsfeld Hints at Cutting Forces in Iraq

Defense Secretary Donald H. Rumsfeld, on an unannounced holiday season visit to Baghdad, hinted on Thursday that the U.S. military soon will begin a modest, additional reduction in troop levels by canceling the scheduled deployment of two Army brigades.

The decision would be the first Pentagon move to drop the American troop presence below the 138,000 level that had been considered a baseline prior to the temporary addition of about 20,000 troops to provide extra security during the Oct. 15 referendum and the Dec. 15 election. Rumsfeld had previously said those 20,000 would be leaving

But in an interview with reporters traveling with him on an Air Force cargo plane to Baghdad, Rumsfeld hinted that a preliminary decision had been made to go below the 138,000 baseline by not deploying a brigade of the 1st Infantry Division from Fort Riley, Kan., and a 1st Armored Division brigade now in Kuwait. Other officials have said small parts of each brigade were likely to go anyway.

Asked whether he'd made the decision to hold back those two brigades, Rumsfeld made a distinction between his decisions as defense secretary and final announcements by the U.S. government.

"Until it's announced, the government's decision hasn't been announced. Therefore it's not final," he said.Rumsfeld also said he hoped that the Iraqis who will be putting together a full-term national government in coming weeks will take into account the risk of losing international support if they stumble.

"It's a big, big, enormous thing for them to try to accomplish in a relatively short period of time," he said, referring to the job of selecting a president, a prime minister and cabinet ministries.

"We also can't ignore the fact that the world ~ the rest of the world ~ has a vote," he said, referring figuratively to other countries' choices about the extent of their future support for Iraq. "The degree of support will be, to some extent, a function of the critically important decisions they (the Iraqis) make during this peri-

Rumsfeld said he hopes the government leaders who emerge are "people who are going to pull that country together toward the center and not pull it apart ~ people who are competent and capable of leading a government, a wartime government.

It was the second such surprise visit in less than a week. Vice President Dick Cheney appeared here last Sunday. Earlier, Rumsfeld said that while the administration is planning troop reductions in Afghanistan, removing forces too quickly would impede the long-term hunt for terrorists.

"If we were to withdraw from Afghanistan precipitously, or from Iraq, the terrorists would attack us first somewhere else and then they would attack us at home, let there be no doubt," Rumsfeld said at Bagram Air Base.

In a holiday season pep talk, Rumsfeld spoke to several hundred soldiers in a heated tent at Bagram that serves as the main airfield for U.S. forces in Afghanistan. "The momentous changes here could not have happened without your service," he said.


On Wednesday, Rumsfeld reassured the Afghan government that planned cuts in the number of U.S. troops will not weaken the U.S. campaign to capture and kill Taliban fighters and al-Qaida terrorists. \square


Japanese minister calls China a 'threat'

New York transit strikers threatened with jail-time

A New York judge on Wednesday threatened the leaders of a two-dayold transport strike with jail, as hundreds of thousands of commuters braved low temperatures and mindnumbing gridlock to simply get to work and back home.

Judge Theodore Jones ordered union leaders to appear before him on Thursday and said jail was a serious possibility if they did not order the end of the stoppage, a city official said. The Transport Workers Union is already being fined one million dollars for each day of the action, and the city has threatened to deduct three days of pay for each day a worker is

City authorities estimate that the strike cost \$400 million on the first day, and believe New York could lose \$1.6 billion in Christmas business if the strike lasts one week.

New York Mayor Michael Bloomberg, who joined the throngs hiking across the Brooklyn Bridge to get to work, said that more people than on the first day walked, rode bikes or crammed into cars to struggle to their Manhattan offices.

"The people of this city are dealing with a situation that is intolerable," Bloomberg fumed at a press conference, as he blasted the union workers for "shamefully and illegally" ignoring the law. The city's nearly 34,000 subway and bus workers started the city's first mass transport strike in 25 years over demands by city authorities for a higher retirement age and greater contributions toward health costs.

Bloomberg said there could be no

negotiations until the strike ended. In final negotiations late Monday, the Transportation Metropolitan Authority improved its wage offer and dropped a demand to increase the retirement age from 55, but insisted that workers contribute more toward their pensions.

The proposal would save the MTA less than \$20 million over the next three years. In a Tuesday press conference, TWU leader Roger Toussaint said that the subway workers would be back on the job "provided the pensions come off the table. That would be a basis for us to go back to work and continue the negotiations."

Toussaint also lashed out at Bloomberg, describing his criticism as a "lack of respect for the transit workers." "We're not thugs," he said, reminding him of the key role union members played in rescue operations following the September 11, 2001 terror attacks.

The strike has forced the New York Blood Center, the biggest US blood bank, to declare a "state of emergency" because of shortages of blood and platelets for transfusions. The city streets choked with cars, despite Bloomberg's emergency order that any vehicle entering Manhattan must carry at least four people.

In the afternoon commute home, vehicles jammed the bridge exits as a flood of bundled up pedestrians marched by, shivering in the cold as they made their way home. More than 400 subway stations were locked up as the daily commuter army jostled to share cab rides or crowd onto

Long Island Rail Road and Metro North trains, two of the rare lines not on strike.

Volunteers stood on street corners handing out cups of hot chocolate to commuters in the freezing tempera-

"It's not pleasant, but that's life in a big city," said Michael Padden, a federal lawyer who endured a two-hour commute by regional rail and on foot to get to the courthouse in Brooklyn.

"Once in a while, something like that happens. All this luxury mustn't be taken for granted. You have to adapt. We've had 9/11, the blackout — we've been through much worse."

The White House urged the two sides to "resolve their differences so that the people in New York can get to where they need to go." While the federal government cannot intervene in transit strikes, spokesman Scott McClellan acknowledged that it could offer help in mediating talks. Resourceful New Yorkers walked and used everything from bikes to skates and skateboards to make their commutes into and around Manhattan. The previous transport strike, which lasted 11 days in 1980, cost the city's public and private sectors an estimated 1.1 billion dollars.

"This strike is crazy," said student Mirna Sodre, 17, who took two hours to get to her school on bicycle. "I don't know if they could do it in another way that wouldn't affect people this way."





'Big Brother' will soon watch over all British roads

Every car journey in Britain will be monitored from next year under a nationwide scheme covering all motorways, main roads, towns, cities, ports and petrol stations, a report said in London on Thursday.

The surveillance system, which will use a network of cameras able to read number plates, will store data for up to two years, allowing the police and security services to better target criminals, including would-be terrorists.

The massive database of 35 million number plates per day will be installed in Hendon, north London, by March 2006 with plans already afoot to increase the storage period to five years, the newspaper said.

"Every time you make a car journey already you'll be on CCTV somewhere," said Frank Whiteley,



from the Association of Chief Police Officers, which is behind the Automatic Numberplate Recognition (ANPR) scheme. "The difference is that, in future, the car's index (number) plates will be read as well."

Whiteley told reporters the system would be used for everything from tracking mobile burglars and even car tax or insurance dodgers but was also likely to be of use to Britain's internal security service MI5.

"Clearly there are values for this in counter-terrorism. The security services will use it for purposes that I frankly don't have access to," he explained. "It's part of public protection. If the security services didn't have access to this, we'd be negligent."

The ANPR scheme - which has government backing and follows its gradual introduction over the last two years - was likely to attract opposition from civil liberties campaigners.

Human rights organisations have already voiced strong opposition about the proposed introduction of identity cards in Britain. Research was already under way to create cameras capable of automatically recognising human faces, raising the prospect of "Orwellian street surveillance", the paper added. \square

'Tehran has 12 potential Nuclear missiles'

Iran has obtained 12 cruise missiles that can be fitted with nuclear warheads, the head of Israeli army intelligence told a parliamentary committee in Jerusalaem on Wednesday.

The missiles were obtained in "an unorthodox" way from a shipment of 18 missiles from Ukraine to Russia, Maj Gen Aharon Zeevi-Farkash told the Foreign Affairs and Defence Committeey, parliament spokesman Giora Pordes said.

Twelve of the missiles, with a range of 3,000 km, ended up in Iran and six in China, Pordes cited Zeevi-Farkash as saying. The missiles in Iran are within striking distance of Israel.

Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad recently called for Israel to be "wiped off the map". Israel, like the US, accuses

Iran of working to build nuclear weapons, though Tehran denies such plans. Israeli officials have said Iran's nuclear programme can be crippled in a military strike, but insist it has no plan to stand in the vanguard of such an attack. 🗖



US warns of terrorist attacks in Indonesia

The threat of terrorist attacks targeting Westerners in Indonesia over the Christmas and New Year holidays is very high, the US embassy in Jakarta said on Thursday, warning of possible kidnappings, shootings or suicide bombings.

Maps and explosives obtained in a police raid on a terrorist's hideout last month indicated the Al Qaedalinked militant group Jemaah Islamiyah was in the advanced stages of planning attacks, the embassy said in an e-mailed message to citi-

Indonesian authorities also warned recently that extremists may be planning to kidnap foreigners over the holidays, and a recently discovered Web site provided step-bystep instructions on how to gun down Westerners in the streets of Jakarta.

"The embassy reminds Americans that in recent years terrorist attacks have occurred in

Indonesia during the Christmas and New Year's holiday season," the US message said, calling on citizens to remain vigilant and to vary the routes and times of their daily activ-


"The possibility of terrorist attacks appears even higher this year." Indonesian military chief Gen. Endriartono Sutarto said on Thursday thousands of troops would join police in providing security over the two-week holiday.

Additional guards and patrols also were being deployed to protect high-ranking officials, diplomats and foreigners from potential kidnappings, said police deputy spokesman Anton Bachrul Alam.

The US embassy said terrorists appear to be changing their tactics.

"They are likely now planning to attack Westerners riding in cars or walking on streets, sidewalks or pedestrian overpasses in Jakarta." 🗖

Australia finds footprints dating back 20,000 years

A mosaic of human footprints showing adults and children running and walking across a flat area some 20,000 years ago has been hailed by scientists as the oldest in Australia and largest of its kind in the world.

The more than 450 remarkably preserved footprints have provided a unique glimpse into the lives of Australia's original inhabitants at the time of the last ice age, researchers said in Sydney. "It brings these people to life in a way no other archaeological evidence can. You can see how the mud squelched between their toes," said Professor Steve Webb of Australia's Bond University.

Some people appeared to be hunting, with one tall man judged to have been running at around 20 kilometres an hour (12.5 miles an hour), while other footprints showed family groups walking together. The first of the footprints was spotted two years ago, Webb's team said in an online posting

ahead of print publication in the Journal of Human Evolution.

"It's a little snapshot in time," said another team member, archaeologist Matthew Cupper of the University of Melbourne. "The possibilities are endless in terms of getting a window into past Aboriginal society." The footprints were found in the Willandra Lakes World Heritage Area of New South Wales state in eastern Australia.

They were preserved for so many thousands of years because they were made in silty clay containing calcium carbonate that hardened like concrete as it dried out. The dried prints were then covered by a further crust of clay and finally by metres of sand from shifting dunes, which had since blown away.

A young woman, Mary Pappin Jnr of the Mutthi Mutthi people, and Webb found them in August 2003 while exploring the area as part of a project to educate young Aboriginal people in archaeology. "They found a clay pan area up in the dunes near one of the lakes and found the first of what's turned out to be about 450 footprints over 700 square metres (7,500 square feet) or so," Cupper said. The footprints provided an insight into the height, age, gender and behaviour of the people who left them.

The group likely included men up to 1.8 metres tall (five foot 11) running as well as young children, ambling along at three to five kilometres an hour. "They're possibly a little band of people moving around the site and they may have only walked across it once or twice before the area was covered and preserved, Cupper said.

The prints are between 19,000 and 23,000-years-old, dating from the height of the last glacial period. "It's quite remarkable. We haven't found any footprints from the Pleistocene (geological epoch) in Australia before," Cupper said. \square

Mexicans oppose US proposal for border wall

Mexico has called a US proposal to extend walls along the US border unacceptable and is seeking the international community's support to block the measure.

Mexico raised the stakes in the battle against the Bill, approved by the House of Representatives last week, by hiring a US public relations firm and encouraging a separate US lobbying campaign against it.

"Mexico is not going to bear, it is not going to permit and it will not allow a stupid thing like this wall," Foreign Relations Secretary Luis Ernesto Derbez said on Wednesday.

He added the government will do "whatever is needed" to stop the Bill, which would also criminalise undocumented migrants. He has already received some support from the international community.

"What has to be done is to raise a storm of criticism, as is already happening, against this," he said.

Amnesty International's Mexico office said a border wall would be "a historic setback for human rights" and "will multiply the loss of life" by



making border crossings more dan-

More than 10 million Mexican citizens are believed to be living in the United States. US authorities believe that about half of them do not have papers.

Mexico is also encouraging US church, community and business groups to oppose the US proposal, and has hired Allyn & Company, a public relations company, to help improve the country's image and stem the immigration backlash.


