## EMPLACEMENT

Vancouver, B.C., Canada

70Ha

Expo'86 was built on the total of 70 Ha (173 acres) of urban waterfront of two downtown Vancouver sites. The largest section of expo'86 (67 ha; 165 acres) wrapped around 4.5 km (2.8 miles) of shoreline along the north and east shores of False Creek. To the north, the Canada Pavilion covered a three-hectare (6 acres) pier reaching three-and-a-half city blocks out into Burrard Inlet.

The False Creek and Canada Pavilion sites were connected by a free dedicated rapid transit link (Skytrain) (for minutes one way); by intersite ferry and hovercraft routes and by a fleet of intersite buses. The distance between the sites was 1.2 km (0.7 miles)
