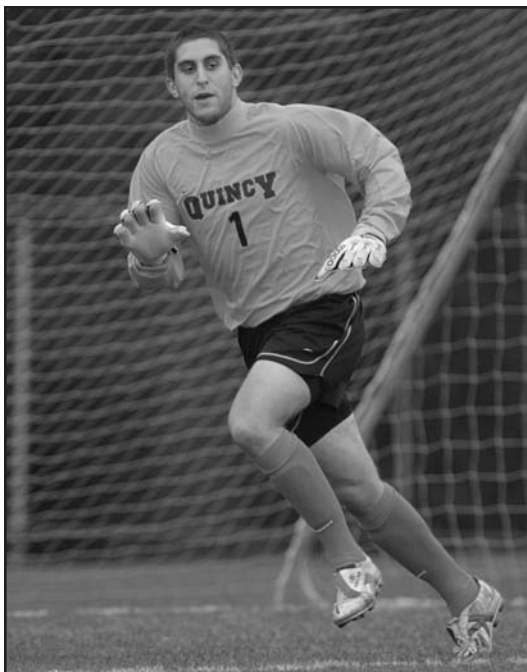

Quincy, Illinois, "The Gem of the Midwest," invites you to discover the heart and soul of the community! Located on the banks of the Mississippi River in West Central Illinois, Quincy is a city that takes pride in its history, enjoying and preserving a rich heritage that brings delight to residents and visitors alike.

Quincy's founder, John Wood-- the first governor of the Prairie State-- came to this area from New York in 1818 and became the first settler in Quincy on what was originally named the "Bluffs." John Wood's "Bluffs" became a community that would undergo tremendous growth, emerging as the second largest city in Illinois by the turn of the 20th century. From the time of the early German immigrants, to the time of Mark Twain, and into the present, Quincy continues to expand both as an economic and industrial hub and as a major cultural resource.

Along with the rich history of the city, Quincians enjoy its unique beauty and charm. It is easy to relax at the Villa Katherine castle overlooking the Mississippi River or actually standing on the riverbank in Clat Adams Park.

Quincy also boasts a rich legacy of historic buildings ranging from early cottages of German immigrants to stately mansions, all of which span over 150 years of architectural design.

Quincy's recreational parks offer community residents a wide variety of leisure opportunities including family outings, cultural and other educational programs, and athletic events and facilities. The Quincy Museum offers the best in America's traveling exhibits; while other Quincy museums furnish a closer look at the community's own heritage including architecture, war history, pharmaceutical history, and even the restored home of John Wood himself! The Quincy Society of Fine Arts, the oldest arts council in America, founded in 1947, provides services for over 40 member organizations.

The City of Quincy hosts diverse community-wide events that draw large groups from the surrounding area and throughout the United States. The Arts/Quincy Riverfest, held annually in early Fall, features entertainment, items by over 100 local and area artists, crafts, folk art, and hands-on art activities. Other major events include the Riverfront Fourth of July fireworks display, Gus Macker 3-on-3 Basketball Tournament, the Dogwood Festival, Pepsi Little People's Golf Championships, and the Quincy Gems, a collegiate summer baseball team.

DR. DAVID SCHACHTSIEK (INTERIM PRESIDENT)

Dr. David Schachtsiek is currently serving as the Interim President for Quincy University.

Schachtsiek was named Interim President in December of 2006. Schachtsiek, a native of Quincy and a 1970 graduate of Quincy University, has over 20 years of experience in higher education administration.

He received his Ph.D. in education administration/higher education from Southern Illinois University-Carbondale.

Dr. Schachtsiek joined Quincy University in 2002 as dean of the school of professional studies and was named vice president for academic affairs in August of 2003.

MARTY BELL Athletic Director

Marty Bell was named Quincy University Athletic Director on June 11, 2007. Bell will also begin his fifth season as the Hawks men's basketball coach later this year.

As head coach of the Hawks men's basketball team he has guided the program to a school record three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and compiled a 71-48 overall record during his tenure.

Prior to coming to Quincy, Bell served on the coaching staff at Drake University. While at Drake he served as the assistant coach 1996-99. Prior to the 1999-2000 season he was named associate head coach. Duties included on-floor coaching and practice organization as well as recruiting and team transportation and travel arrangements.

Bell began his coaching career at Lock Haven University and moved from there to Indiana University (Pa.).

On April 10, 2003 he became the 14th head coach in Quincy University men's basketball history. Since arriving here he has quickly re-established the Hawks as a force, finishing in first place in the Great Lakes Valley Conference West Division during the 2005-06 season.

Bell, a native of Williamsport, Pa., graduated from the University of South Carolina in 1985 with a degree in Business Administration. He completed his master's degree in Education at Penn State University while coaching at Indiana (Pa.).

Bell and his wife, Julie, were married on June 25, 2005. Bell welcomes to the family her two children, Andrew and Amanda.

GREG MCVEY Associate Athletic Director

Greg McVey is entering into a new phase of his career. McVey was named Associate Athletic Director at Quincy University on June 11, 2007. In doing so McVey stepped down as the Hawks head baseball coach, a position he held for six seasons.

During his six seasons at the helm of the Hawks baseball program he compiled a record of 189-142 and guided the Hawks to the NCAA Division II North Central Region Tournament in 2006. The Hawks were ranked in the national poll in each of his six seasons, including a ranking as high as 16th on two separate occasions.

McVey's teams set numerous school records, including marks for stolen bases, fielding percentage, earned-run average and strikeouts. He has had two players drafted in the Major League baseball amateur draft.

Prior to coming to Quincy, McVey served as the head coach at Kentucky Wesleyan College from 2000-01 and at Miami University-Middletown from 1994-96. He also spent time serving as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at Furman University and as an assistant coach at Miami University in Ohio.

McVey, a native of Indianapolis, Ind., earned his bachelor's degree from Saint Joseph's College in 1992 and his master's degree in Sports Management from Miami University in 1993.

McVey and his wife, Erin, have two sons, Avery and Casey, and reside in Quincy, Ill.

JACK MACKENZIE -- Head Coach -- 39th SEASON

Jack Mackenzie has long been associated as the face of the Quincy University men's soccer program.

Mackenzie, entering his 39th season as the head coach of the Hawks, is currently 11th on the all-time coaching wins list with 463. In 2000 Mackenzie became just the ninth coach at any level to reach the 400 win plateau.

He guided the Hawks to nine national championships, including five consecutive titles from 1977-81, and is a four-time NAIA Coach of the Year, winning in 1971, 1975, 1977 and 1981. In addition he was named the Coach of the Year by the National Soccer Coaches Association in 1974 and the Metropolitan Life Insurance's Midwest Region Coach of the Year in 1987.

Mackenzie led the Hawks to a conference championship in 1988, winning both the regular season and conference tournament and being named the Big Central Soccer Conference Coach of the Year.

Mackenzie has seen the growth of the Hawks soccer program as well, leading them through three different levels of competition, from NAIA to NCAA Division I and to their current status of NCAA

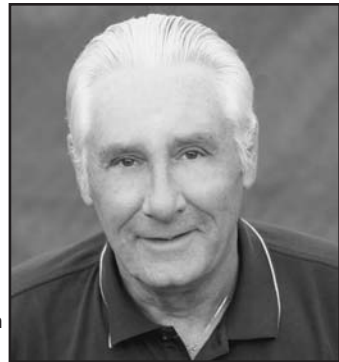
Division II.

Mackenzie, well-known and respected among the soccer world, was inducted into the Quincy University Sports Hall of Fame in 1979. Ten years later, in 1989 he was inducted into the NAIA Hall of Fame and in 1997 he was named to the St. Louis Soccer Hall of Fame.

Maybe the most impressive feat during Mackenzie's tenure has been the consistency of the program. He has led the Hawks to 32 winning seasons in his 38 years, recording double digit wins 26 times.

Not to be forgotten is his emphasis on the classroom. The Hawks had five players make the GLVC Academic All-Conference team last season. In 2005, Hawk Nick Frederickson was awarded the conference's Paragon Award which is given annually to one male and one female athlete that promotes academic excellence, athletic ability and achievement and character and leadership.

Jack and his wife Sharon have six children; Scott, Chirs, Kevin, Beth, Brian and Megan. The Mackenzie's also have eight grandchildren.

CHRIS MACKENZIE -- Assistant Coach

Chris Mackenzie, Jack's second-oldest son, is beginning his eighth season as an assistant coach for the Hawks. As a high school player, Chris enjoyed an excellent playing career as a starter on the Quincy Notre Dame teams that won the Illinois state championship in 1985, were runners-up in '84, and placed third in '86. As a collegian, Chris was a three-year starter at the United States Military Academy at West Point. As team captain in 1990, Chris led the Army Cadets to a 2-1 win over Quincy College.

Chris is the main recruiter for the soccer Hawks and handles many of the technical training sessions with the team. He recently earned his NSCAA National Coaching Course Diploma, passing with honors and distinction. His passion for the game is definitely a real positive influence on all the players.



MIKE CARPENTER -- Assistant Coach

Mike Carpenter is entering his fifth season as a Hawks assistant coach. Prior to joining the coaching ranks, Carpenter was a standout goalkeeper at Quincy Notre Dame, eventually playing collegiate ball here at Quincy.

Carpenter brings plenty of playing experience as well as immense knowledge of the goalkeeper position. His main responsibility includes overseeing the training of current Hawks keepers. In addition "Carp" helps the squad in all aspects of soccer and physical conditioning and assumes many other responsibilities. His love for soccer and his competitive spirit are helpful motivators for the team.



JOHN NATALINI -- Equipment Manager

John Natalini is entering his second year with the Hawks men's soccer program. Natalini is in charge of all the player equipment needs. John, a retired professor at Quincy, also takes pride in the academic progress of each squad member and is always ready to provide academic counseling and support where needed.

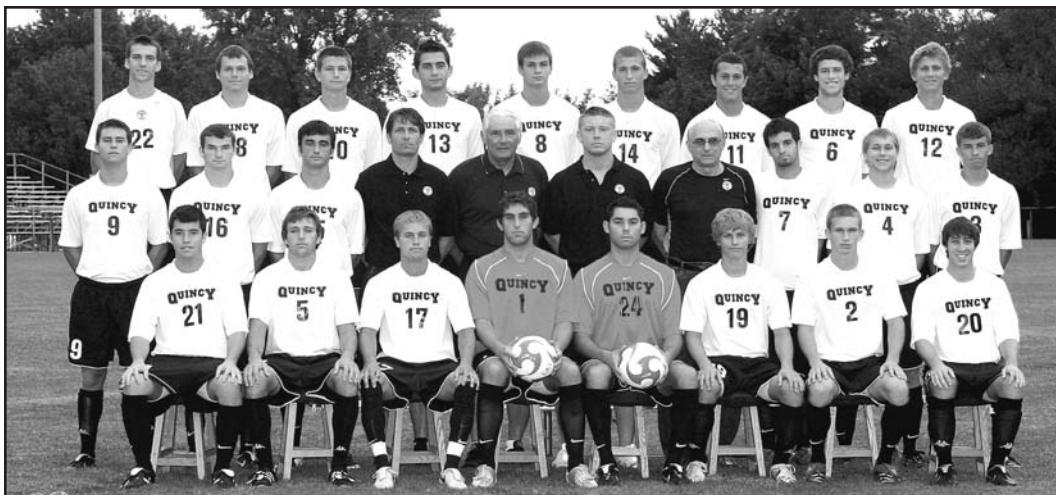
