



POOLCOMPS.COM SWISS OPEN 2006

JONNY FULCHER ACHIEVES SENSATIONAL VICTORY

Winner Jonny Fulcher

> A few days after his 32nd birthday, Jonny Fulcher from Great Britain made a dream come true and won the title of the PoolComps.com Swiss Open Champion 2006. In a close title-match against Maltese Tony Drago, he finally secured his by far biggest success yet with a 10-8 win. Fulcher, whose roots are in snooker, has played only nine events on the Euro-Tour before finally succeeding now in Switzerland. Nevertheless, he is far from being a blank sheet in billiards-sports. During his study of Physics in London, Fulcher not only has captained the England University snooker team to

three wins in the Home Nations team championships, in 1999 he became also the British Universities Individual Champion. Indeed, his list of snooker-vicories is still longer than his pool-merites, but with performances like in the PoolComps.com Swiss Open, this will change sooner or later. But Fulcher's win was far from being the only surprise of this tournament. With the semi-finalists Dejan Dabovic from Austria and Spaniard Francesco Diaz, another two players managed to secure their first Top 3 finish on the Euro-Tour, which is an impressive proof of the still increasing level of play. By far worse, players like Oliver Ortmann, Ralf Souguet or Thomas Engert may remember this tournament, they all failed to reach the single-KO stage of the Last 32. Whereas Ortmann's improve in the overall-rankings has been stopped for the time being, Souguet fell out of the Top 20. Even more costly, Engert's 33rd place could turn out. Arrived as defending Champion and current leader of the overall-rankings, the German lost the European Pole Position to Dutch Star Nick van den Berg. And with only one tour-stop to go, the hunt for the No.1 Year-End-Bonus of

€1,500 is re-opened again.

NEW LIVE-SCORING SYSTEM STARTS SUCCESSFUL

Beginning with the Pool-Comps.com Swiss Open 2006, Tour organiser IBPF initiated its new live-scoring system. For this purpose altogether 20 Laptops were acquired which did the work that formerly two or three people had done with their PDA's. From now on, the players enter the respective scores of their matches directly into the system, which displays the entire results simultaneously also on the official tour-website www.eurotour.nu. Both, players and spectators were very excited about this new system and also the internetstatistics recompensed for these efforts through by far more than 12 million clicks from 74 different countries during the tournament. The IBPF wants to thank the players for their co-operation and support of this new feature, which increases the up-todateness of the entire results dramatically.

EUROSPORT OFFERS EUROTOUR-COVERAGE FOR 2007

EUROSPORT, Europe's leading sports broadcaster, is highly interested to prolongue and further more extend its partnership with Euro-Tour organiser IBPF. In a meeting during the PoolComps.com Swiss Open, EUROSPORT expresses the intention to also cover the Euro-Tour season 2007. If a few changes on the part of the IBPF would be made, represantatives of the broadcaster offered the opportunity to cover the upcoming season completely on the main channel EURO-SPORT1. The IBPF will decide upon signing the contract in November.

FIFTH TOURSTOP FOR 2007 - 2009 DETERMINED

According to a press-release from Euro-Tour organiser IBPF, the Island Billiards in Frauenfeld/Switzerland will remain the host of the Swiss Euro-Tour stop for the next three years. That is the result of negotiations both parties held during the PoolComps. com Swiss Open. Whereas IBPF pointed out, that this decision was made easy not least due to the great success of this year's tour-stop, the room-owners of the Island Billiards expressed delight with that decision.




