Quincy's founder, John Wood-- the first governor of the Prairie State-- came to this area from New York in 1818 and became the first settler in Quincy on what was originally named the "Bluffs." John Wood's "Bluffs" became a community that would undergo tremendous growth, emerging as the second largest city in Illinois by the turn of the 20th century. From the time of the early German immigrants, to the time of Mark Twain, and into the present, Quincy continues to expand both as an economic and industrial hub and as a major cultural resource.

Along with the rich history of the city, Quincyans enjoy its unique beauty and charm. It is easy to relax at the Villa Katherine castle overlooking the Mississippi River or actually standing on the riverbank in Clat Adams Park.

Quincy also boasts a rich legacy of historic buildings ranging from early cottages of German immigrants to stately mansions, all of which span over 150 years of

architectural design.

Quincy's recreational parks offer community residents a wide variety of leisure opportunities including family outings, cultural and other educational programs, and athletic events and facilities. The Quincy Museum offers the best in America's traveling exhibits; while other Quincy museums furnish a closer look at the community's own heritage including architecture, war history, pharmaceutical history, and even the restored home of John Wood himself! The Quincy Society of Fine Arts, the oldest arts council in America, founded in 1947, provides services for over 40 member organizations.

The Arts/Quincy Riverfest, held annually in early Fall, features entertainment, items by over 100 local and area artists, crafts, folk art, and hands-on art activities. **DR. DAVID SCHACHTSIEK**  
Interim President

**D**r. David Schachtsiek is currently serving as the Interim President for Quincy University.

Schachtsiek was named Interim President in December of 2006. Schachtsiek, a native of Quincy and a 1970 graduate of Quincy University, has over 20 years of experience in higher education administration.

He received his Ph.D. in education administration/higher education from Southern Illinois University-Carbondale.

Dr. Schachtsiek joined Quincy University in 2002 as dean of the school of professional studies and was named vice president for academic affairs in August of 2003.

**MARTY BELL**  
Athletic Director

**M**arty Bell was named Quincy University Athletic Director on June 11, 2007. Bell will also begin his fifth season as the Hawks men's basketball coach later this year.

As head coach of the Hawks men's basketball team he has guided the program to a school record three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and compiled a 71-48 overall record during his tenure.

Prior to coming to Quincy, Bell served on the coaching staff at Drake University. While at Drake he served as the assistant coach 1996-99. Prior to the 1999-2000 season he was named associate head coach. Duties included on-floor coaching and practice organization as well as recruiting and team transportation and travel arrangements.

Bell began his coaching career at Lock Haven University and moved from there to Indiana University (Pa.).

On April 10, 2003 he became the 14th head coach in Quincy University men's basketball history. Since arriving here he has quickly re-established the Hawks as a force, finishing in first place in the Great Lakes Valley Conference West Division during the 2005-06 season.

Bell, a native of Williamsport, Pa., graduated from the University of South Carolina in 1985 with a degree in Business Administration. He completed his master's degree in Education at Penn State University while coaching at Indiana (Pa.).

Bell and his wife, Julie, were married on June 25, 2005. Bell welcomes to the family her two children, Andrew and Amanda.

**GREG MCVEY**  
Associate Athletic Director

**G**reg McVey is entering into a new phase of his career. McVey was named Associate Athletic Director at Quincy University on June 11, 2007. In doing so McVey stepped down as the Hawks head baseball coach, a position he held for six seasons.

During his six seasons at the helm of the Hawks baseball program he compiled a record of 189-142 and guided the Hawks to the NCAA Division II North Central Region Tournament in 2006. The Hawks were ranked in the national poll in each of his six seasons, including a ranking as high as 16th on two separate occasions.

McVey's teams set numerous school records, including marks for stolen bases, fielding percentage, earned-run average and strikeouts. He has had two players drafted in the Major League baseball amateur draft.

Prior to coming to Quincy, McVey served as the head coach at Kentucky Wesleyan College from 2000-01 and at Miami University-Middletown from 1994-96. He also spent time serving as the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator at Furman University and as an assistant coach at Miami University in Ohio.

McVey, a native of Indianapolis, Ind., earned his bachelor's degree from Saint Joseph's College in 1992 and his master's degree in Sports Management from Miami University in 1993.

McVey and his wife, Erin, have two sons, Avery and Casey, and reside in Quincy, Ill.

# Bill Terlisner -- HEAD COACH -- EIGHTH SEASON

**B**ill Terlisner is closing in on a decade as head coach of the Quincy University football program. If you include his time at Quincy as a player and assistant coach he has spent nearly two decades as a Hawk.

Last season Terlisner guided the Hawks to their first winning season since 1994. In seven seasons at the helm he has compiled a 27-48 overall record.

Since his arrival he has turned the Hawks offense into a legitimate force. Over seven seasons, the Hawks have averaged 22.4 points per game, including averaging a school record 30 points per contest in 2003.

A well known recruiter, Terlisner has brought in top-notch talent to Quincy. He has coached nine All-Americans, including the Hawks career leaders in rushing and passing. In addition 29 Hawks have been named to the Mid-States Football Association All-Conference teams.

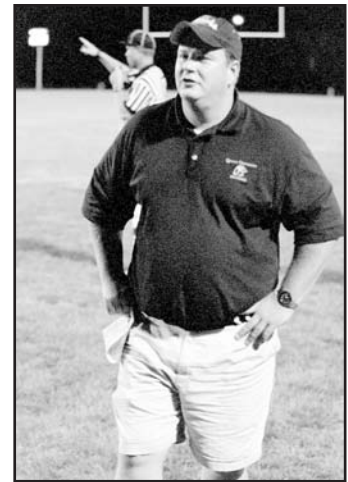
Terlisner first arrived at Quincy in 1987 as an offensive lineman. He spent four

seasons as a starter at offensive tackle and served as team captain as a junior and senior.

He began his coaching career at William Penn College as the offensive and defensive line coach. After one year at William Penn he returned to Quincy as the offensive line coach and offensive coordinator from 1993-95. He then spent two seasons at his alma mater Alton Marquette High School as the team's offensive line coach and strength and conditioning coach.

Terlisner returned once again to Quincy in 1998 to assume the role of offensive coordinator. He stayed in that role until 2000 when he was named the Hawks head coach.

Terlisner, a native of Alton, Ill., earned his B.S. degree in History from Quincy University in 1991.

# COACHING STAFF



## Paul Fuller -- DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Paul Fuller is starting his third season as the defensive coordinator for the Quincy University football team. Last season, just his second year with the Hawks, he helped reduce the opponents yards per game by nearly 70 yards and scoring by nearly 14 points. The Hawks were well represented on the defensive side of the ball with two NAIA All-Americans.

When he arrived at Quincy in 2005, Fuller brought with him a wealth of experience, having spent the previous 13 years as a coach. At Quincy, Fuller's duties include being the teams' assistant head coach, defensive coordinator, defensive line coach and co-linebackers coach. He is also in charge of the team's strength and conditioning programs.

Fuller, a native of Wilton, Conn., played his collegiate ball at the University of Maine. There he was a four-year letterman at offensive line, starting 44 of 45 games and was selected to play in the Martin Luther King Jr. Football Classic, an all-star game featuring Division I-A players against players from Division I-AA, II and III levels. He

served as team captain as a senior and helped Maine to a pair of conference championships and the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

Following his playing career, Fuller signed a free agent contract with the Atlanta Falcons and also played with the Cleveland Browns. Fuller spent time playing with three different teams in the Arena Football League.

After his professional career, Fuller started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Ohio University in 1993. From there, he went on to coach at Western Connecticut State, Bowdoin College, Vanderbilt University, Southern Connecticut State, Bridgeton Academy prep school and Mansfield. Following his coaching duties at Mansfield he spent one year as the director of Fuller Brothers Speed and Strength Training Academy.

Fuller earned a B.S. degree in Health, Physical Education and Recreation from Maine and earned his M.S. degree in Physical Education and Special Education from Ohio and completed work towards a M.S. degree in Secondary Education from Vanderbilt.

Fuller, who is single, resides in Quincy, Ill. and has one daughter McKenna Anne.



## Gary McGraw -- DEFENSIVE BACKS / SPECIAL TEAMS / CO-LINEBACKERS

Gary McGraw is starting his fourth season as an assistant coach with the Quincy University football team. McGraw will serve as the defensive backs, special teams and co-linebackers coach.

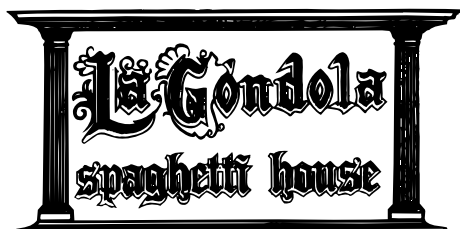
McGraw joined Quincy in 2004 after coaching and playing in Oregon. McGraw was a safety at the University of Oregon from 2000-01, helping the team to back-to-back Pac-10 Championships.

Following his collegiate playing career he was the co-defensive coordinator and special teams coach at Marist (Ore.) High School in 2002 and 2003. While there, Marist compiled a 23-1 record, winning the Oregon state championship in 2003 with a 13-0

record.

McGraw, a native of Fremont, California, attended Chabot Junior College for two seasons, and as a sophomore led the nation in interceptions and setting the school record for interceptions in a season with 13 and in a game with three. He was named the conference defensive player of the year and also earned All-State and All-American honors.

McGraw graduated from Oregon in 2003 with a bachelor's degree in psychology. He is nearing completion on his master's degree in Educational Leadership from Quincy University.

# COACHING STAFF



## MATT BUCHER Defensive Assistant

Matt Bucher begins his first year of coaching following a solid collegiate playing career at Quincy. Bucher was a four-year member of the Hawks, finishing with 991 career rushing yards and five touchdowns. He also served as the team's top kick returner, amassing 728 yards and one touchdown. He is the last Hawk to have a

kickoff return for a touchdown, accomplishing the feat against St. Francis (Ind.) in 2003.

Bucher, a native of Godfrey, Ill., graduated from Alton Marquette High School in 2003 and is currently pursuing his master's degree at Quincy.



## RANDY DICKENS Linebackers

Randy Dickens is in his first season as an assistant coach with the Quincy Hawks football program, but is a familiar face. Dickens was the first head coach of the Hawks football team when it was resurrected in 1986 and served in that role for the next five years. He later became head coach at Quincy High School where he coached the Blue Devils from 2002-2006.

Dickens started his coaching career nearly 30 years ago as a graduate assistant coach at Indiana University. After three years there he moved on to coaching stops at Wabash College and Rose Holman University until reaching Quincy.

Dickens, a native of Bloomington, Indiana, played collegiate ball at the University of Richmond (Va.) until suffering a knee injury and transferring to Indiana University where he earned his B.S. degree in Physical Education in 1976. He earned his M.S. degree in Physical Education from DePauw University.

Dickens also currently serves as a Dean at Quincy High School. Randy and his wife Christy have one son, Tyler, and reside in Quincy, Ill.



## NICK NOVAK Assistant Offensive Line

Nick Novak is entering his first season as an assistant coach with the Hawks football program. Novak has previously served as a coach at Marian Catholic High School in Chicago, Illinois for two seasons.

Novak, a 2005 graduate of Quincy University, was a four-year member of the Hawks football program as a member of the offensive line.

Novak, a native of Chicago, Ill., graduated from Quincy with a degree in Secondary Education and is currently pursuing his master's degree at Quincy.



## CRAIG SMITH Offensive Coordinator / Quarterbacks

Craig Smith is beginning his second season as a member of the Hawks' coaching staff. Smith joined Quincy after serving as the offensive and passing coordinator at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville from 2004-05.

Prior to his time at Platteville, Smith spent three seasons at Southwestern High School in Hazel Green, Wisc. Smith served as the defensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2001 before taking over as head coach for the 2002 and 2003 seasons.

Smith's Southwestern teams set three state records during his stay, setting marks for quarterback completions and yardage in a game as well as a new record for receptions in a game. He also coached quarterback Brian Kopp, who would go on to set a state record for most all-purpose yards in a game.

Smith a native of Clinton, Iowa, graduated from Clinton High School in 1997 after playing football, basketball and soccer. Smith was a linebacker, wide receiver and tight end in high school, earning All-Mississippi Athletic Conference second-team honors as a senior.

After earning an associate's degree in criminal justice from Kirkwood Community College, Smith moved to Wisconsin-Platteville where he played linebacker for two years on the school's football team.

Smith earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees from Wisconsin-Platteville. He earned a Bachelor's of Science degree in public relations in December 2002 and a master's degree in secondary and adult education in December 2005.



## BROCK SOUSA Assistant Offensive Line

Brock Sousa starts his fourth season as a Quincy University assistant football coach.

Sousa, who played for the Hawks from 1999 through 2003, will be coaching the offensive linemen. He also serves as the assistant strength and conditioning coach.

Sousa was a three-year starter on the Hawks' offensive line, after red-shirting the 1999 season. In 2003, Sousa was named to the Mid-States Football Association Mideast Division honorable mention team after leading Quincy to a national ranking of No. 4 in the NAIA in rushing offense at 270.1 yards per game. The Hawks also finished No. 8 in the NAIA in total offense at 423 yards per game.

Sousa also helped Quincy finish second in the MSFA in rushing offense and third in total offense. Sousa was named the 2003 recipient of the Chuck French Memorial Award.

A native of Fort Myers, Florida, Sousa graduated from Quincy in May 2004 with a bachelor's degree in elementary education. He recently completed his master's degree in education administration from Quincy.



## NATE SIBBING Wide Receivers

Nate Sibbing is beginning his first season as a coach with the Quincy University football team. Sibbing, a native of Quincy, Ill., has spent the previous five years as an assistant coach with the Quincy High School football team.

Sibbing, who has served in numerous coaching roles, has also spent one season as an assistant coach at St. Charles High School in St. Charles, Mo. and one season coaching in Baltimore, Md.

Sibbing played his collegiate ball at Lindenwood University from 1998-2001, where he was an outside linebacker for the Lions. As a senior he was named special teams player of the week three times. Following his playing career he completed his degree and earned his teaching certificate at Quincy University in 2004.

In addition to coaching the Hawks wide receivers, Sibbing is a teacher at Quincy Junior High School.

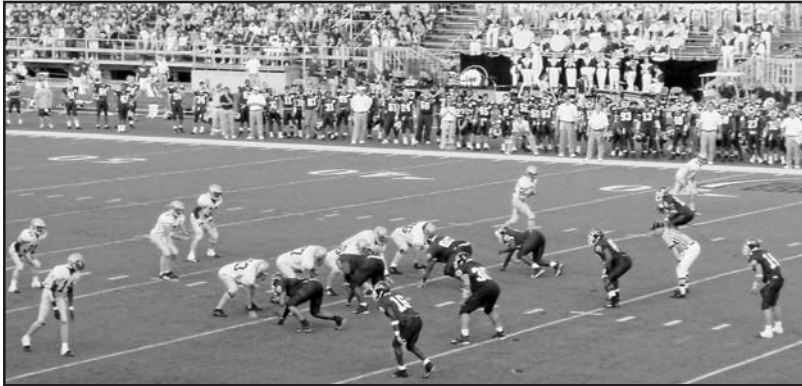

This year marks the 10th consecutive season that the Quincy University football team will travel and compete against an NCAA I-AA foe. The game provides a great experience for Hawks coaches, players and fans. This year the Hawks open the season against I-AA powerhouse Southern Illinois University-Carbondale. Past opponents include Butler, South Dakota and Western Illinois.

“Last year we played in a dome with 7,000 people and 3,000 of which were screaming South Dakota students. It really was an awesome experience that all of us will remember,” said Quincy senior defensive lineman Greg Climan.

# 2007 SEASON PREVIEW

After their first winning season in over a decade the Quincy University football team is looking to take their play to the next level. In 2006 the Hawks picked up big wins over McKendree and Culver-Stockton and enter the 2007 season ranked 33rd in the NAIA preseason poll.

"Last year was a season that we needed. We felt like we have made progress every year and it finally showed. The momentum we gained helped build a positive atmosphere which led to a good recruiting class," said Quincy head coach Bill Terlisner.

At first glance the loss of three-year starting quarterback Matt Wehrle may seem to be a large step back. However the Hawks coaching staff is comfortable with their quarterback situation.

"We are in a much better position this year than last. Last year we didn't know we would have Wehrle until August. Obviously there is no way to replace him but we have three strong candidates and capable players that have been here for a year and know our system," said Terlisner.

The three players Terlisner referred to are junior Craig Moore, who walked out of spring ball as the starter, senior Mike Brouse and freshman Calvin Works.

Easing a new starting quarterback into the game will be helped by the fact that Quincy returns all five starting offensive linemen. Anchoring the line will be seniors and Second-Team All-Conference performers Dan Fahrner and Jeremy Saunders.

"We are very experienced and strong up-front," said Terlisner. "We have two four-year starters and two three-year starters."



The Hawks will have no shortage of firepower with their top four running backs returning and a talented group of wide receivers.

In the backfield, the Hawks return junior Corey Williams, who in his first season at Quincy led the Hawks in rushing with just under 800 yards and three touchdowns. Backing him up will be senior Larry Patterson with Darren Gafford stepping in as the short-yardage and big back role.

Possibly the most talented group of players may be the wide receivers. The Hawks return four of their top five wide-outs while adding to that depth with a group of newcomers.

Chris Jenkins and Mike James were first and third in receiving yardage last season while tying for the team lead in receiving touchdowns with three. Josh Pizer also returns after finishing with 33 catches, good for second on the team. Heading up the list of newcomers is Michael Smith, a 5-10 transfer from Feather River Junior College.

"We have a lot of experience at the wide out position. I think with all of the players we have at each position, that we could have a very powerful offense," said Terlisner.

The defensive side of the ball is dominated by the Hawks linebackers. When speaking of the linebackers you must begin with Jacob Zsuppon. Zsuppon, a junior, has led the Hawks in tackles in each of his first two seasons and was named Don Hansen honorable mention All-American last year.

"Zsuppon is an intelligent player and natural linebacker. He sets up the positioning of our entire defense," said Terlisner.

Joining Zsuppon in the middle of the defense are returnees Robert Perera, Tony Donatucci, Sean Dugan and Nate Toole.

"We have a lot of different keys and types of players to mix and match with at linebacker," said Terlisner.

Up front the Hawks will be led by senior defensive tackle Greg Climan. Climan, a three-year starter, was named honorable mention All-Conference last season.

"Greg is a leader by example. He knows the entire system and has a great work ethic," said Terlisner.

The Hawks will be looking towards returnees Ryan Bronson,



Brad Deany, Drew Hoffman and Ryan Nicholson to step up and contribute on the line.

The biggest change over on the team is in the secondary, where the Hawks lost all four starters from last season. The Hawks will count on returnees John Keevan, John Anderson and Kevin Cotton to fill in the open spots.

"We have a lot of talent in the secondary, they just need game experience," said Terlisner. "There may be some freshman that will even see time in the secondary. We are going to play whoever deserves to play."

The Hawks should be set on with the special teams, with four year starter Eric Broughton handling the kicking duties and the increased depth of the team overall.

"Eric is a solid kicker and any time we get within the 25 yard line we should have an automatic three points," said Terlisner. "As our team continues to get better the overall talent increases which means that there will be players on the special teams that can really make an impact."

The Hawks open up the 2007 season against NCAA Division I-AA opponent Southern Illinois University-Carbondale. Their first home game will be on September 8 against Taylor and they open Mid-States Football Association Midwest League play on September 22 against Walsh.

"With St. Xavier moving over to the east in the conference, there is an opening for someone to step up into the playoff push. I think if we are healthy we can challenge for that spot," said Terlisner.

# THE MART HEINEN CLUB

## HISTORY LESSON OF THE MART HEINEN ATHLETIC BOOSTER CLUB

Gene Autry, Rod Laver, Andre The Giant.

And, oh yes, for 34 years the most prestigious "small college" basketball tournament in the land.

A rundown of the Mart Heinen Club's presentations would fill many pages. Members of the Hawk-crazy booster group are a creative and energetic cross-section of the community.

Synonymous with the steady rise of QU's athletic program to national acclaim has been the matchless input of The Mart Heinen Club -- men and women volunteering in behalf of the Hawks and Lady Hawks.

Not all such support groups are held in such high regard.

Too often those at both major universities and small colleges have allowed their spirit and financial input to run rampant; but words such as "probation" and "suspension" have never been used in referring to sports teams at Quincy College or Quincy University.

It's been 50 years since a corps of perhaps 25-30 men (no women allowed in 1947) pooled their enthusiasm for the brand new Hawks football team and formed The Quincy College Quarterback Club.

Membership grew quickly as The Brown & White grid teams of Coaches Mac Wenskunas, Bron Bacevich and Gene McCarter thrived on their own momentum. The 1949 team under Coach Wenskunas and assistant Ray DeGreeff had the whole town hoppin' with its 8-1 record.

Teams of that post-World War II period were loaded with veterans of military service and it took a very gritty youngster to come out of high school and earn a place in the Hawks' lineup. That '49 team not only knocked off Western Illinois and Eastern Illinois, which were much larger schools, but upended the Leathernecks and Panthers in their own Homecoming games.

Quarterback Club spirit blossomed anew with each victory and each new season. So, what a jolt it was to its members and all of Quincy in 1954 when the administration dropped football as an intercollegiate sport.

Soccer wasn't added to the program until 1964.

Dropping football was not a popular decision among Quarterback Clubbers and other fans; but then the club was so solid it wasn't ready to wither away.

Basketball had been gaining momentum here under Coaches DeGreeff, Fran Willett and Harry Forrester. Harry had just come on the scene and guys in the booster club liked his dedication to the school and to the game.

But "Quarterback" was no longer an appropriate name for the Hawks' booster organization.

The logical name -- and it didn't take 'em long to pick it -- was Mart Heinen Club.

In the summer of 1946, Mart Heinen, QC athletic director and coach of all sports, had lost his life in a fire that ravaged the LaSalle Hotel in downtown Chicago. Heinen was a member of the Quincy City Council as well and had gone to Chicago with Mayor Edward Schneidman and other city officials.

Ironically, meetings they were to attend related to QC and its plans and hopes for welcoming returning military veterans. Launching the new GI Bill and bundles of red tape that went with it was no simple matter.

The number of sports offered grew sharply as the numbers of participants increased, but basketball led the way.

Under its new name, The Mart Heinen Club was anxious to establish an identity, and the decision to sponsor a holiday basketball tournament seemed to be a bold move at the time. But the first one was a tremendous success.

Tournaments were so few at the time that a strong field was booked -- even though the first telephone calls weren't made until October. Less than three months later the title game here between Christmas and New Year's saw Western Illinois topping St. Ambrose (Iowa). Those teams had played a six-overtime game at Macomb earlier in the month.

Other "charter" teams in the event that was to last 33 more years were Eastern Illinois, Northeast Missouri (now Truman State), Illinois Wesleyan, Loras (Iowa), Monmouth and the host Hawks.

A steady and assured cash flow from the tournament provided a boost for QC athletics and made possible such major projects as construction of the Memorial Gym Annex. The Annex, now taken for granted, was built more than a decade after the opening of the gymnasium. In addition to housing Concessions, the Annex serves as a setting for meetings, musical presentations and other activities.

The Holiday Tournament served as a magnet, attracting full-house crowds and a record membership for The Heinen Club. Membership was consistently over 850.

The tourney soon featured teams from schools with enrollments from 400 to 21,000. Future NBA stars Dick Barnett and John Barnhill from Tennessee State, Lucius (Luke) Jackson of Pan American and Jack Sikma of Illinois Wesleyan helped draw capacity turnouts. Charley Vaughn of Southern Illinois-Carbondale, Henry Logan from Western Carolina and Archie Talley of Salem (W. Va.) are still remembered, as were many of the Hawk players coached by Forrester, Pim Goff, John Ortwerth and Sherrill Hanks.

*"Voice of the Hawks"*

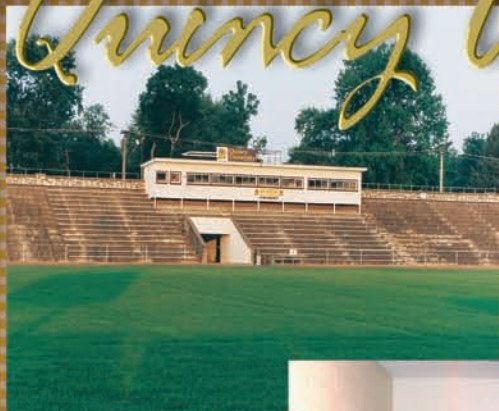
A St. Louis native, Ben Marth begins his seventh year as Quincy's "Voice of the Hawks." Marth graduated from
