This form should be used only for applications relating to England and the territorial waters thereof.

The Conservation of Seals Act 1970 prohibits the killing or taking of seals by certain methods and during specified close seasons. The Conservation of Seals (England) Order 1999 extends this protection to any time of year for the counties of England bordering the North Sea, from Northumberland to East Sussex, and adjacent territorial waters.

Close seasons for seals (outside the area covered by the 1999 Order) are:

- Common/Harbour Seals (Phoca vitulina) 1 June to 31 August inclusive
- Grey Seals (Halichoerus grypus) 1 September to 31 December inclusive

Exceptions provided by the legislation, which do not require a licence, include the killing or attempted killing of any seal to prevent it causing damage to a fishing net or fishing tackle, or to fish held in a net, provided it was in the vicinity of the net or tackle at the time.

Under Section 10(1) of the 1970 Act, Natural England, under powers conferred by the Secretary of State, has authority to grant licences to permit:

the killing or taking of any seal during the close season or within the area covered by the 1999 Order

for the following purposes:

- science or education;
- any zoological gardens or collection;
- prevention of damage to fisheries;
- reduction of a population surplus of seals for management purposes;
- the use of a population surplus of seals as a resource; or
- the protection of flora or fauna in certain designated conservation areas.

Where the action proposed involves the use of **prohibited methods** of killing or taking seals a licence may also be required under The Conservation (Natural Habitats &c) Regulations 1994. Where appropriate, this application will also be considered to be an application under those Regulations.

Licences to prevent damage will normally only be issued where:

- the seals are causing or are likely to cause sufficiently serious damage to justify a licence;
- other methods of control have been shown to be ineffective or impractical and not just difficult to implement;
 and
- the licensed activity is likely to be successful in solving the problem being caused.

It is your responsibility to ensure that you have the appropriate permissions to carry out the licensed activity; this especially applies to the use of firearms.

No-one under the age of 18 may be authorised to use firearms by the licensee without specific written permission from Natural England. The licensee and anyone acting under the licence are responsible for their actions and for complying with the licence conditions.

- Natural England or the Secretary of State can revoke at any time any licence that may be issued but this
 will not be done unless there are good reasons for doing so. Any licence that is issued is likely to be
 revoked immediately if it is discovered that false information had been provided which resulted in the
 issue of a licence.
- Where a licence is issued to permit the killing or taking of seals that would otherwise be an offence under the Conservation of Seals Act 1970 or the Conservation (Natural Habitats &c) Regulations 1994 any person who in order to obtain such a licence knowingly or recklessly makes a statement or representation, or furnishes a document or information which is false in a material particular, shall be guilty of an offence and may be liable to criminal prosecution. Any person found guilty of such an offence may be liable to a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale (currently £5000).

What happens now?

If you requested an acknowledgement for your application (see page 2 of this form) you will receive this within 5 working days of receipt by Natural England. Your acknowledgement will provide information on the time that Natural England will take to process your application and provide you with a decision.

If this is your first application to kill/take seals you will also be contacted by a Natural England Wildlife Adviser. The Adviser will discuss your application with you and, if necessary to determine your application, will arrange to visit you at a mutually convenient time. The purpose of the visit is to enable the Adviser to assess the situation on site and provide you with the most appropriate advice on the options available. If you have held a licence for the same purpose, species and method in the previous year and your situation has not changed, a site visit will not normally be made prior to determining your application.

Natural England will notify you of the outcome of your application normally within 30 working days of receiving this application. You will receive either a licence or a letter explaining why a licence will not be issued.

The Licence

All licences will state:

- The species of seal that you are permitted to kill/take
- The method(s) that may be employed to kill/take the seals
- The maximum number of seals which may be killed/taken
- The location where the licensed action may be taken
- The period of validity of the licence

Activities carried out under licence are subject to a number of legally binding conditions. These are stated clearly on the licence, and **must be adhered to or the licence will no longer be valid**.

Monitoring

A monitoring telephone call or a pre-arranged site visit may be made by a Natural England Wildlife Adviser during the licence period. Natural England reserves the right to visit whenever it is considered necessary.

Licence Returns

A report of the action taken under licence, including nil returns, must be sent to Natural England within two weeks (14 days) of the expiry of the licence.

Information on the number of mammals killed, taken or disturbed under licence is required under European legislation. Continued failure to provide a return may result in the revocation of that licence and refusal to grant a licence in future.
