#### The Series

▶ The Golden Eagles are 0-4 against Tennessee, making their fifth trip to Knoxville and first to Neyland Stadium since the 2000 season. Southern Miss lost in that 2000 contest, 19-16.

The series dates back to the 1950 season and was renewed with games during the 1995 and 1997 seasons.

The 2000 meeting was the closest in the series as Tennessee has averaged 40.3 points in the four previous games between the two schools while the Golden Eagles have collected an average of 9.0 points per game.

#### The Last Time Out

#### Southern Miss 35, Tennessee-Martin 13 Sept. 1, 2007

▶ HATTIESBURG -- Southern Miss rushed for the most yards since the 2002 season by tallying 310 on the ground in a 35-13 season-opening victory over Tennessee-Martin.

With the win, the Golden Eagles marked their first season-opening victory since a 21-17 win at Nebraska on Sept. 3, 2004, as they opened at home for the first time since 2002.

The game marked the first time Southern Miss had rushed for over 300 yards since 2004 (with 305 against Tulane on Sept. 25), and the most rushing yards since the Golden Eagles tallied 356 on Sept. 14, 2002 against Memphis.

Southern Miss, though, fell behind early, 6-0, after UTM's Tom Hansen booted a pair of field goals - a 42-yarder in the first quarter and a 25-yarder at the beginning of the second.

Senior quarterback Jeremy Young, who threw 115 yards on 11 of 26 attempts and added 55 yards rushing, put the Golden Eagles up for good, 7-6, with a one-yard touchdown midway through the second quarter.

Chris Johnson added to the lead later in the period with the first of his two touchdowns, going 14 yards on a reverse to put the Golden Eagles up 14-6. Johnson finished the Eagles' scoring in the final quarter on a 3-yard pass from Young.

Damion Fletcher, who went over the 1,500-yard mark for his career with 156 yards on 19 carries, extended the advantage to 21-6 in the third quarter, rushing four yards up the middle. For Fletcher, it was his eighth career 100-yard game and the fourth time in the last six that he has reached that plateau.

Senior Marcus Raines, who had not tallied a carry since high school, recorded his first career touchdown to improve the score to 28-6, scoring from one-vard out.

The Skyhawks closed the gap late in the contest on a three-yard run from Marcus Dawson.

Still, the Golden Eagle defense limited UTM to 72 yards rushing and OVC Offensive Player of the Year Don Chapman to 20 yards on 12 carries.

Redshirt freshman Torris Magee led the Golden Eagles in receiving with five catches for 56 yards, followed by Johnson, who tallied two catches for 36 yards.

#### The Last Time Versus Tennessee

#### Tennessee 19, Southern Miss 16 Sept. 2, 2000

▶ KNOXVILLE, Tenn. – Jeff Kelly orchestrated two fourth-quarter scoring drives, but it was too late to rally Southern Miss as they dropped a 19-16 decision to No. 12 Tennessee at Neyland Stadium.

The Golden Eagles got on the board first as they converted a UT first-quarter turnover, an interception by Leo Barnes, into a 36-yard field goal by Brant Hanna.

UT then fought back with a long scoring drive as Joey Mathews found Cedrick Wilson for a five-yard scoring strike to make the score 7-3 late in the opening quarter.

The score remained that way until the third period when Tennessee reeled off 12-straight points in the quarter. Alex Walls opened the scoring with a 32-yard field goal. After a UT punt on their next possession that put the visitors deep in their own end, the Vols garnered a safety to push the cushion to 12-3.

UT then finished its scoring in the quarter with a 51-yard scoring pass from A.J. Suggs to Donte Stallworth.

The Golden Eagles then rallied in the fourth quarter.

In the Eagles' first drive of the final quarter, Southern Miss marched 83 yards to cut the scoring gap. Bobby Garner caught a Kelly pass that was deflected and went untouched for a 17-yard touchdown. The two-point conversion failed and the Golden Eagles trailed by nine points.

The Vols then chewed up the clock on their next possession with a 5:37 drive before a short punt into the Golden Eagle end that was downed at the USM 4.

Kelly then completed seven of his next 11 pass attemps, the last being a 7-yard scoring strike to Shawn Mills. Hanna converted the PAT to cut the deficit to three.

Southern Miss tried an onside kick on the ensuing kickoff, but UT covered up the ball, ending the fourth-quarter comeback bid.

#### Head Coach Jeff Bower - Conference USA Coach of the Decade



First as a record-setting quarterback, then as a successful assistant coach, and in his 17th season as head coach, Jeff Bower has played a role second to none in the school's athletic history, and it has been appropriate that Bower has been at the helm of the program at his alma mater when it was a founding member of Conference USA, and now during a time when it is enjoying unprecedented success.

In his 17th season as head coach and in his 29th overall year at Southern Miss, Bower has been associated with the Golden Eagles' program for almost one-third of its entire 91-year-long football history.

In 2006, Southern Miss finished with a 9-5 overall record and posted a 6-2 league record en route to winning the East Division and making an appearance in the Conference USA Championship game. The Golden Eagles are the only school in the conference to finish with a winning record in the league every year since it started in 1996. The winning-season streak is the second-longest for a Southern Miss football coach, second only to Thad "Pie" Vann's school-record 17-straight winning seasons. The Golden Eagles also were postseason eligible once again, earning a berth in the 2007 GMAC Bowl, marking the fifth bowl game in as many years.

The season also produced 12 All-Conference USA selections – four selected to the first team, offensive linemen George Batiste and Travis Cooley, tight end Shawn Nelson and running back Damion Fletcher. Batiste and Cooley were named to separate All-American teams and Fletcher was named to three different Freshman All-American teams, as well as being a finalist for the Conerly Trophy, given to the state's top collegiate player.

Bower continues to be one of the marquee coaches in Conference USA, and Southern Miss remains one of the top-tier programs in the league. In fact, Bower's and Southern Miss' success in C-USA has set standards other coaches in the league seek to emulate. In the recently announced Conference USA Team of the Decade, the Golden Eagles landed eight on the respective offensive and defensive squads, and Bower took home the highest honor by being named the C-USA Coach of the Decade.

Under Bower, the Golden Eagles have posted an impressive 113-77-1 record, making him the second-winningest coach in school history. In the C-USA era, his teams have posted a 58-19 league record, ranking among the Top-10 list nationally for conference victories over the same period. He is the dean of conference coaches, with his teams winning four Conference USA championships (1996, 1997, 1999, 2003).

Following the team's perfect league season in 2003, Bower was selected as the Conference USA Coach of the Year for an unprecedented third time, adding to his awards in 1997 and 1999. His 190 games coached also make him only the second Southern Miss coach ever to coach more than 185 games with Vann (200 games) being the other.

Bower also has compiled that enviable record, while playing only 77 of those 191 games at home. His teams have posted a 62-15 record in those 77 games, including a 46-10 mark over the last 12 seasons. Of the 191 games he has coached, 105 of them have been played at the opponent's field, that is 54.9 percent, which is the most of all the coaches that have been a collegiate coach during that time.

#### **How Good is That?**

▶ Bower continues to post impressive numbers at his alma mater. The 2000 Eagles became the first Southern Miss team that has ever been to four-straight bowl games and finished with a four-year record of 33-15, tying the 1999 senior class for the most victories under Bower.

The 2005 and 2006 classes also matched the 2000 class as the second and third classes that have reached four-straight bowl games. The 2006 class also matched the 2000 class as the second class to finish with three bowl wins in four appearances.

The school record for a four-year period is 34 wins from 1952 through 1955. The current group of Eagles has collected 24 wins throughout their careers. Bower's teams also have been impressive at home.

#### **Bower in Elite Southern Miss Company**

▶ Southern Miss' game against Tennessee-Martin was Jeff Bower's 191st game as head coach of the Golden Eagles. Thad "Pie" Vann is the only other Southern Miss coach to have led the program in at least 190 games for Southern Miss. In Bower's 191 games as a head coach, 36 of them have been against ranked teams and only seven of those games have been at home.

Twelve of those 36 opponents have been in the top 10, and eight have been in the top five.

#### **Against the SEC**

▶ The Golden Eagles, who have played at least one member of the Southeastern Conference every season since 1964, are 34-95-3 all-time against the league's members. Jeff Bower, who has played SEC teams 26 times -- all on the road and in which 18 opponents were nationlly ranked -- has a 4-22 record. The last Golden Eagle victory over an SEC opponent came on Sept. 16, 2000, when they shutout Alabama 21-0 in Birmingham. Ole Miss and Mississippi State are the only SEC schools to have ever played in Hattiesburg, and Georgia is the only other SEC school to travel to Mississippi to play the Golden Eagles. Southern Miss won that game in Jackson, 14-0, in Nov. 21, 1953.

#### **Tennessee Tidbits**

▶ The Tennessee preseason roster shows four players from the state of Mississippi, including sophomore center Josh McNeil of Collins. In his 16th season at the helm of the UT program, Fulmer and the Volunteers have posted eight 10-or-more win seasons including a national championship for the 1998 season. Three Tennessee assistant coaches have ties to the state of Mississippi. Assistant head coach/quarterback coach/offensive coordinator David Cutcliffe is a former head coach at Ole Miss (1999-2004), while defensive end coach Steve Caldwell worked at Northwest Mississippi Community College (1981-84) and Ole Miss (1994-95), and tight ends/offensive line/recruiting coordinator Matt Luke, a Gulfport native, is a former center for Ole Miss who later served on the Rebel coaching staff (1999, 2002-05).

#### September's Record

▶ Under the direction of Jeff Bower, Southern Miss has posted a 34-21 record in the month of September, 22-4 at home, 12-13 on the road and 0-4 at neutral locations. Overall, the Golden Eagles are 111-81 in the month of September, 66-13 at home, 35-50 on the road and 10-18 at neutral sites.

#### **Games on this Date**

▶ Southern Miss is 1-2 in games played on Sept. 8, in its history. The Golden Eagles dropped a 17-14 decision at Florida State in Tallahassee in 1979 and lost a 26-19 decision at Georgia in 1984. The Golden Eagles' lone win came in 1990 when they defeated Alabama 27-24 in Gene Stallings debut for the Crimson Tide in Birmingham. Southern Miss also defeated Auburn later in that same season.

#### Opened at Home for First Time Since 2002

▶ The Golden Eagles opened at home for the first time since the 2002 season. when they defeated Tennessee-Martin 35-13 last weekend. The Golden Eagles, in their 91st season of football, are 60-30 in season openers (there is no score for the 1916 opener).

#### School Breaks Total Offense Record

▶ The Golden Eagles established a school mark for total offense in 2006 by notching 4,635 yards during their 9-5 campaign. The yardage total eclipsed the previous school-best mark of 4,575, established in 1952. The 888 plays ties the 2003 season as the most total offense plays in a year. Under offensive coordinator Jay Johnson, the Golden Eagles have collected the

#### Offensive Line Nationally Rated for Fewest Sacks

▶ The offensive line, dubbed "The Hawgs," ranked among the nation's leaders in 2006 in fewest sacks allowed. The Golden Eagles, ranked 18th in the category, allowed just a total of 19 sacks. Southern Miss ranked No. 3 among C-USA schools, behind Memphis (No. 10) and Tulsa (Tied No. 12). The unit featured two All-Americans, George Batiste and Travis Cooley, which were the first two Southern Miss offensive linemen to win All-America honors since Don Owens – a tackle on both sides of the ball – collected a first-team Little All-America honor by the Helms Foundation in 1958.

#### 2,000 Yards on the Ground in 2006

Behind a veteran offensive line and in the hands of two true freshmen runners, Damion Fletcher and Tory Harrison, the Golden Eagles tallied their first 2,000 rushing season in 19 years during the 2006 campaign. Southern Miss, which collected 2,033 yards on the ground in 1987 in the last time breaking this plateau, tallied 2,378 yards on the ground in 2006.

## Dave Wommack Outside Linebackers (Bio Not in Media Guide)

Dave Wommack returns to Southern Miss this season for his second stint with the Golden Eagles. He worked on the staff from 1994-2000, working as a defensive back assistant coach from 19994-99 and then as the inside linebackers coach in 2000. Wommack also served as the defensive coordinator the final two years during that stretch

Wommack enters his 28th season as a collegiate coach, having served as a defensive coordinator in 14 of those seasons. His last stop was at South Carolina, where he oversaw the secondary for a year and the outside linebackers for a year.

During his first campaign in Columbia, Wommack helped safety Ko Simpson earn All-America accolades, while both Johnathan Joseph (first round) and Simpson (fourth round) were selected in the NFL draft.

Prior to his arrival at USC, Wommack was the defensive coordinator at Arkansas where he coached four seasons. During his time with the Razorbacks, he also coached the secondary, free safeties and cornerbacks and inside linebackers.

Prior to his stay at Arkansas, Wommack worked his first stretch with the Golden Eagles. In addition to his defensive coordinator duties his final two seasons, he was also the assistant head coach in 2000. Wommack helped lead the Golden Eagles to winning seasons in each of those seven seasons at the school and bowl appearances in each of the final four seasons.

Wommack is a native of Kimberling City, Mo. He began his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant strength coach at Arkansas in 1979 and was promoted to a fulltime assistant strength position in 1980. He made his way onto the field in a part-time coaching position role on Lou Holtz's 1981 and '82 Razorback coaching staffs. In 1983, he became a graduate assistant defensive line coach at Missouri, where he spent two seasons. His first full-time assistant coaching job came as the defensive coordinator at Bemidji (Minn.) State in 1985, before he took over the reigns as defensive coordinator at Southwest Missouri State in 1986, a post he held through the 1991 season.

During his time at SMS (now Missouri State), the Bears won consecutive conference championships and appeared in two straight NCAA 1-AA playoff rounds, setting a school record for victories (10) in 1989. In 1992, Wommack took over as the defensive coordinator at UNLV. Following a two-year stint with the Runnin' Rebels, he joined the staff at Southern Miss.

A 1974 graduate of Reeds Springs (Mo.) High School, Wommack was a three-year letterman (center) during his collegiate playing career at Missouri Southern. He earned his bachelor's degree from Missouri Southern in 1978 and his master's degree from Arkansas in 1979. He, and hiw wife, Leslie, have two children, Kane and Hayley.

#### Golden Eagles Rush For Over 300 Yards in Opener

▶ The Golden Eagle offense netted 310 yards rushing in the seasonopening victory over Tennessee-Martin, a barrier which hasn't been crossed by the Southern Miss offense since a 305-yard performance against Tulane on Sept. 2, 2004. The rushing output is the largest for the school since notching 356 yards against Memphis on Sept. 14, 2002. Southern Miss is ranked No. 11 nationally in the NCAA statistics in rushing offense.

#### **Prolific Sophomore Rusher**

▶ With a 38-yard carry in the second quarter against UTM, sophomore running back Damion Fletcher went over the 1,500-yard mark for rushing yardage in just his 14th game as a Golden Eagle. That carry also marked his

longest career rush, beating his previousbest of 36 yards against Houston in the C-USA Championship.

Fletcher also recorded his eighth 100yard rushing game with his 156-yard performance against the Skyhawks.

The Biloxi, Miss., product became the all-time freshman rushing leader at Southern Miss and Conference USA after tallying 1,388 yards on 276 carries, an average of 5.0 yards per carry and scored 11 touchdowns. He finished No. 2 in Conference USA in rushing and No. 7 in all-purpose yardage. Nationally, he completed the year No. 11 in the nation in rushing and No. 35 in all-purpose yardage.

Fletcher became only the second freshman at Southern Miss to rush for over 1,000 yards and the first player to accomplish the feat since 2002, when Derrick Nix rushed for 1,194 yards. He ran for 100 yards or more in a freshman-record seven games, including a season-high 177 yards on 28 carries against NC State.

He completed the year as the No. 2 rusher in a season in school history finishing behind Sam DeJarnette, who tallied 1,545 yards in 1982.

Fletcher became the first Golden Eagle running back to rush for over 100 yards in four-consecutive games since Derrick Nix accomplished it for the final three games of the 1998 season. Also, he became the first Golden Eagle runner to run for four-consecutive 100-yard performances in a season since Sam DeJarnette in 1982.

#### Floyd Impressive in Debut

▶ Freshman V.J. Floyd showed depth on the running back chart in his first career performance against Tennessee-Martin. The true freshman from Orlando, Fla., and the son of former Florida State running back Victor Floyd, recorded 43 yards on nine carries in his debut.

#### Johnson Lands in Endzone by Any Means Possible

▶ Senior wide receiver Chris Johnson recorded two touchdowns in the contest against Tennessee-Martin, scoring both a rushing and receiving touchdown. The Rosedale, Miss., native landed his first score of the season on a 14-yard reverse in the third quarter, followed by a 3-yard reception from Jeremy Young in the fourth.

The last time a Golden Eagle scored via both on a rushing and receiving touchdown came from Johnson against Memphis on Nov. 5, 2006.

#### Raines Crosses Two Career Plateaus Against Tennessee-Martin

▶ Senior running back Marcus Raines will remember Sept. 1 for two reasons. His two-yard carry in the first quarter, which gave Southern Miss a first down, marked his first carry since his days at Littlerock High School in Antelope, Calif. He notched his first career touchdown on his second rush, a one-yarder. Raines recorded a total of eight yards on three carries.

#### Young Contributing to the Running Game

Senior quarterback Jeremy Young proved his ability to contribute to the Golden Eagles' running game, after recording 55 yards on eight carries against UTM. Among the attempts was a one-yard rushing score, marking his fifth career rushing touchdown.

Young has rushed for 258 yards on 74 career carries.

#### **Rhoden Notches First Career Reception**

▶ Senior wide receiver Chris Rhoden notched his first career reception, a seven-yarder, in the victory over Tennessee-Martin. The MacClenny, Fla., native, who has battled injuries for much of his career, recorded a seven-yard rushing attempt against Tulane on Sept. 25, 2004.

#### The Golden Eagle Defensive Tradition Continues

▶ The Southern Miss defense was among the defensive leaders in Conference USA last season, continuing its "Nasty Bunch" tradition. The defense gave up 18.6 points a game, which ranked No. 1 in Conference USA and No. 28 in the nation. In 2005, the Golden Eagles gave up 22.7 points a game, finishing at No. 1 in C-USA and in the No. 33 spot nationally. The defense has had top 25 finishes in scoring defense in seven of the last nine years. Since Conference USA's inception in 1996, Southern Miss has finished No. 1 in scoring defense every year except in 1996 and 2004.

The Golden Eagles were conference leaders in other conference categories, including No. 1 in pass defense efficiency, No. 2 in total defense and No. 2 in turnover margin.

#### The Points Just Don't Come from the Offense

▶ Southern Miss tallied seven non-offensive touchdowns during 2006. tallying five scores in the final seven games of the season. The seven nonoffensive touchdowns are a record during the Jeff Bower era. During the year, Southern Miss scored four touchdowns via interception, one on a blocked punt that was recovered in the end zone, and two fumble recoveries that were picked up and returned for scores.

The Golden Eagles limited Ohio to 47 yards rushing in the GMAC Bowl on Jan. 7, 2007, one of five games they accomplished that feat during 2006 and surrendered just 72 yards to the Skyhawks last week.

#### Hicks Lands First Pick of the Season

▶ Sophomore defensive back Eddie Hicks captured the Golden Eagles' lone turnover against Tennessee-Martin by intercepting quarterback Dexter Anoka in the fourth quarter. It was Hicks' second career pick. His other interception came last season against East Carolina, in which he returned it a school-record 87 yards for a touchdown.

▶ Redshirt sophomore Gerald McRath is setting a pace for his tackling numbers in the 2007 season, and he's starting in the double-digits. The linebacker notched 11 total tackles against Tennessee-Martin, including five solo stops and a tackle for loss. The performance marked his third consecutive game with 10 or more stops, as well as the fourth of the past five and six of the last eight. Last season, the Freshman All-American tallied six games with 10 or more stops, finishing with a season-high 15 tackles against Houston.

#### **Barefoot Boots Off to Good Start**

▶ Junior kicker Britt Barefoot got off to a good start last Saturday against UTM with a 46.5 punting average over four punts.

The Laurel, Miss., native landed his seventh career 50-plus yard punt with a 55-yarder in the third quarter. His longest career punt came in the form of a 68-yard boot in the 2007 GMAC Bowl against Ohio.

#### **Harrison Shines on Kickoff Returns**

▶ Sophomore running back Tory Harrison showed signs of success on special teams, returning two kickoffs for a total of 73 yards. The 51-yard return set up the Golden Eagles' first touchdown of the second half.

#### At Least Seven Wins Nine Times In The Past 10 Years

▶ Last season's 9-5 record gave Southern Miss seven or more wins in nine of the past 10 years (Golden Eagles finished with six wins in 2001). Southern Miss is one of 10 teams in the nation to collect seven or more wins in at least nine of the past 10 years, Florida, Florida State, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Michigan, Nebraska, Ohio State, **Southern Miss**, Tennessee and Texas.

#### First 14-Game Season

▶ When the Golden Eagles took the field against Ohio in the GMAC Bowl on Jan. 7, it marked the longest season in Southern Miss history. The GMAC Bowl marked the 14th game played last season for Southern Miss. The Golden Eagles played 12 games, 12 times and 13 games twice in 2002 and 2003. Following the completion of the GMAC Bowl, the season came to a sum of 151 days which equals to five months and four days.

#### Nine Bowl Games In the Last 10 Years

▶ The 2007 GMAC Bowl appearance marked the ninth bowl game in the last 10 years. The Golden Eagles are one of 15 teams who have been to nine bowl games in the past 10 years, Florida, Florida State, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Louisville, Miami, Fla., Michigan, Nebraska, Ohio State, Oregon, Purdue, Southern Miss, Texas, Texas Tech and Virginia Tech.

#### **Five-Straight Bowl Games**

▶ The 2007 GMAC Bowl appearance marked the fifth-straight bowl game for Southern Miss. The Golden Eagles are one of 20 teams who have been to five-straight bowl games, Auburn, Boise State, Florida, Florida State, Georgia, Georgia Tech, Iowa, Louisville, LSU, Miami, Fla., Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Southern Cal, Texas, Texas Tech, Southern Miss, Virginia Tech and West Virginia.

▶ Under the direction of Jeff Bower, Southern Miss has posted a 61-16 record (.792) in home games at M. M. Roberts Stadium, also known as the "The Rock." Overall, the Golden Eagles are 113-36 (.758) in home games since the stadium was dedicated as M.M. Roberts Stadium on September 25, 1976.

### From Southern Miss Assistant To Collegiate Head Coach

▶ A number of Southern Miss assistants paid their dues to become eventual head coaches at a college program. In all, 12 former assistants have gone on to become head coaches at one point in time, with five of them becoming the head coach at USM.

The list of former Southern Miss assistants turned head coach include: Reed Green (USM), Jim Carmody (USM), Thad "Pie" Vann (USM), P.W. Underwood (USM), Jeff Bower (USM), Mack Brown (Texas), Doug Barfield (Auburn), Mike DuBose (Alabama), John Thompson (ECU), Maxie Lambright (Louisiana Tech), Norman Joseph (Belhaven) and Mike Williams (Jacksonville State).

#### **Conference Tradition**

▶ Southern Miss is in its 17th year of conference football affiliation in this the program's 91st year. The Golden Eagles were members of the Gulf States Conference from 1948-51 and were a founding member of Conference USA in 1996.

In the 16 previous years of conference affiliation, Southern Miss has won seven conference championships, three in the Gulf States Conference and four in C-USA. Southern Miss won the Gulf States Championship in 1948, 1950 and 1951 and Conference USA in 1996 (shared), 1997, 1999 and 2003.

#### **Top Crowds at The Rock**

▶ The Southern Miss - Nebraska game in 2003 broke the single-game attendance record at The Rock when 36,152 fans attended the game. That mark broke the old record set in 2002, when 35,169 fans attended the Jackson State game. The previous largest crowd under Jeff Bower was 33,233 against Texas A&M on Sept. 19, 1998. Southern Miss had its 11th largest crowd ever in Hattiesburg against Houston on Oct. 14, for homecoming with 32,317 in attendance for the game.

#### Southern Miss on Television

▶ Southern Miss made 10 television appearances during the 2006 season (on either the ESPN family of networks or CSTV), marking the most times Southern Miss has been featured on television.

The previous best for Southern Miss was eight television appearances during the 2000 season, which tied the 1997 season for the most times in a season that the Golden Eagles were televised. Since Southern Miss joined Conference USA in 1996, the Golden Eagles have appeared on television 77 times. Over that time period, USM has played in 135 games, marking 57.0 percent of its games. Overall, the Golden Eagles are 54-37 in televised games. For a complete list of Southern Miss TV games please check page 180 of the media guide.

#### Everyone's All-American

▶ For 10-straight years, Southern Miss has produced at least one All-American as four Golden Eagles received that honor in 2006. Offensive lineman George Batiste was named third-team offensive lineman by CollegeFootballNews.com and offensive lineman Travis Cooley was named an honorable-mention selection by SI.com.

Fletcher was named second-team Freshman All-American by The Sporting News, CollegeFootballNews.com, rivals.com and scout.com. McRath was named first-team Freshman All-American by The Sporting News and second team by CollegeFootballNews.com.

#### Freshman All-American

▶ With the addition of Damion Fletcher (2nd team - The Sporting News, Scout.com, rivals.com and CollegeFootballNews.com) and Gerald McRath (1st team - The Sporting News, 2nd team - CollegeFootballnews.com) to various Freshman All-American teams, Southern Miss has now had nine freshman All-Americans named in the last 11 years.

#### **Overtime Anyone?**

▶ Southern Miss has been involved in six overtime games since the rule went into effect before the 1996 season - two of which have come against Houston.

The latest was a 20-17 loss to East Carolina, Oct. 28, 2006, at Roberts Stadium. The last victory in OT came in a 27-24 contest versus Marshall on Nov. 8, 2005. Before that, the Golden Eagles had a 35-29 overtime victory over Houston on Oct. 7, 2004. Southern Miss also dropped a 20-17 double overtime contest to Louisville on Nov. 15, 2002, and defeated UAB, 33-30, in double overtime in 2000.

The first overtime game was a 56-49 overtime loss at Houston in 1996. The Golden Eagles' record in overtime games is 3-3.
