## 1992 Southern League Championship Season

When the 1990s began, the Atlanta Braves organization was the laughing stock of Major League Baseball. There was absolutely no way of knowing the dynasty that was about to be born. The Braves shocked the world by going from worst to first in 1991. That miracle season was the first of 14 consecutive division titles, all of which were fueled by the Braves' outstanding farm system. The 1992 Greenville Braves, which had a roster loaded with future Major League stars, laid the groundwork for what is now known year-in-and-year-out as the best minor league system in baseball.

At the time, you could count on one hand the number of years since the Atlanta Braves were perennially among the worst teams in major-league baseball, if not the absolute worst team. And if that weren't trouble enough, the farm system was traditionally just as bankrupt, creating a nasty, vicious, and apparently never-ending cycle.

My, how times have changed.

In 1992 and for the second straight season, Atlanta proved to be the best team the National League had to offer. And to make the news even better for Braves fans, the best was yet to come.

Two steps down the organizational ladder held the future for Atlanta. With a combination of top prospects and emerging young players, the Greenville Braves pounded the Southern League on their way to becoming the first minor league team to win 100 games in one season since Peoria reached the century mark in 1980. But unlike the low Class-A Chiefs, the talent the G-Braves fielded was on the Double-A level. And considering the domination the team displayed night-in and night-out, they may have been the best team in the minor leagues. Ever.

"You look up and down their lineup and it's basically an All-Star team," said then-Huntsville manager Casey Parsons. "They had at least half a dozen guys who will play in the major leagues, maybe more. It was almost unfair. I can't imagine a more talented team in this day and age."

"The feeling is indescribable," said then-Greenville manager Grady Little. "We knew we were talented coming out of spring training, and we had the normal moves that happened throughout the season. But every time we lost someone to Triple-A, the guys coming up from (Class-A) Durham would pick up where the others left off. We never missed a beat, and in some cases, we bettered ourselves."

A quick glance at the G-Braves' 1992 roster reveals names even the most casual baseball fans recognize. Former first-round draft choices Mike Kelly and Chipper Jones held down the No. 3 and No. 4 spots in the batting order for most of the summer.

Southern League Most Valuable Player Javy Lopez and outfielder Melvin Nieves emerged as top prospects, and even had a taste of big-league life in September when rosters were expanded. In fact, Jones, Nieves, Lopez, and Kelly were rated by *Baseball America* as the Southern League's top four prospects.

Other players were just as productive. Leadoff hitter Tony Tarasco posted a league-best 24-game hitting streak while becoming one of Atlanta's top young players. Mike Bell, the organization's best-fielding first baseman, was third on the team with 64 RBI. On the mound, Nate Minchey won 13 games before going to Boston in the Jeff Reardon

trade. Donnie Elliott, Dennis Burlingame, and Mike Hostetler each had excellent seasons as starters, while Pedro Borbon, Andy Nezelek, and Don Strange were impressive out of the bullpen.

Regardless of whether or not the players had a reputation to protect, the Greenville Braves simply got the job done. The team set 22 franchise records and six individual single-season standards. The G-Braves also rewrote the Southern League record book, setting season records for most wins (100), most shutouts (24), fewest losses to one team (two, to Carolina), and most road wins (50).

Yet even the most talented teams do not always set the world afire, especially in the minor leagues. That's why, to a man, the players say that the manager was the reason for their success.

"Grady was the key," Tarasco said. "Grady's a very good coach. He doesn't have to many rules. And even though this was a young team, he let the players grow up on their own, and it worked." The formula worked from the beginning, when Greenville got off to a 17-3 start on its way to a 49-23 first-half slate, 11 games ahead of second-place Jacksonville. Pitchers Kevin Coffman and Brian Bark won 11 games between them without a loss before moving up to Richmond, while second baseman Ramon Caraballo hit .312 prior to his promotion to Triple-A.

The best was indeed, yet to come. As Little mentioned, players such as Jones, Nieves, and Hostetler were called up from Durham in June and improved the club in all phases of the game. The result was a 51-20 second-half record, a three-game sweep of Charlotte in the divisional playoffs, and a three-games-to-two victory over Chattanooga in the championship series.

"It was so much fun," said Elliott, who joined the team in June after being traded to the Atlanta organization from Philadelphia for major league pitcher Ben Rivera. "There were so many guys there that are going to be playing in the big leagues one day, and when you're all out there together on one team, it's a special feeling. It was the closest team I have ever played on, including high school and college."

One of the players who was in Greenville the entire season was Kelly, the former three-time All-American at Arizona State University and the second pick overall in the 1991 draft. The center fielder led the Southern League with 25 home runs and finished second on the team with 71 RBI. Throw in his 22 stolen bases and you have the first 20/20 man in team history.

"I couldn't imagine having a better experience in my first full year of professional baseball," Kelly said. "The whole season was a lot of fun. When you're on a team that is as talented as we were, it really takes the pressure off of you individually. You never have to feel like you're the guy who has to win the game every time out."

With his powerful stroke, Kelly produced some of the longest home runs ever seen at Greenville Municipal Stadium. His defense was also splendid, while his throwing inches closer to major-league standards. Experience is the only thing that's Mike Kelly out of Atlanta.

"Mike made a lot of adjustments and improvements throughout the year," Little said. "With the way he approaches the game, he'll make himself into an all-around player."

Kelly was part of the team's offensive attack that Little referred to as "Young Thunder." Joining Kelly in this group was Nieves, a switch-hitter who clubbed 18 home runs with 76 RBI after hitting eight homers and driving 32 runners at Durham, and Lopez, the organization's top catching prospect, who was fourth in the league in both batting average (.321) and slugging percentage (.507).

Jones arrived in June and promptly hit .346 with 42 RBI and a franchise-best 11 triples in only 266 at-bats. The first pick overall in the 1990 draft proved his days of riding minor-league buses are quickly coming to an end.

“The kid simply rises to the occasion to meet challenges,” Little said. “Chipper’s going to continue to do that all the way up to the big leagues. He likes pressure. The more pressure he’s under, the better he performs.”

An example of Jones’ abilities under the spotlight came on August 17, when he returned to his hometown of Jacksonville, FL for the first time as a professional. The media was out en masse, and the mayor gave the 20-year-old the key to the city.

Showing his gratitude, Jones went out and hit two balls off the outfield wall in his first two trips to the plate before making a couple of spectacular plays in the field.

“I like to be the guy that’s going to come through for you in the clutch,” Jones said. “The biggest thing for me is that since I was drafted, I’ve developed my confidence. I have the confidence that I’m going to play in the big leagues one day. It’s not cockiness; It’s just I think I have the ability to make the big plays, as well as the consistency.”

In addition to the lumber, the pitching staff was equal to the task, posting a league-best 2.62 ERA. Burlingame, once on of the organization’s top pitching prospects, continued his recovery from elbow surgery and won nine games with a 3.09 ERA. Hostetler, a 21st round draft pick in 1991 out of Georgia Tech had six victories after winning nine in Durham. Strange, meanwhile, paced the Braves’ system with 18 saves, while Borbon, the son of former Reds’ pitcher of the same name, had eight wins and three saves.

“We had a bunch of pitchers who many people did not think much of entering the season,” Little said. “The press didn’t beat down our doors to talk to these guys, but they steadily led the league in pitching all season long. And some of them have a better chance at making it in the big leagues than many people think.”


In 1993, the Richmond team could also be a winner. Many Greenville players will be together in Triple-A next season, including Nieves, Lopez, Kelly, Hostetler, Tarasco, Elliott, Borbon, Taylor, and Burlingame. Jones may make the jump to Atlanta, and all of these players have excellent chances of reaching the bigs within the next couple of seasons.

But as far as the record books are concerned, the question that cannot be answered remains: Were the 1992 Greenville Braves the best minor-league team of all time?

Little remembers going to a game in Charlotte in 1966 and watching Mobile, the Double-A club of the Oakland A’s. The team fielded the core of its three-year dynasty of the 1970s, including Sal Bando, Rick Monday, Reggie Jackson, Rollie Fingers, and Blue Moon Odom, leaving a major impression on the future manager.

“That young Oakland club was the best minor-league team I had ever seen until this year,” Little said. “This Greenville team left a lot of memories in a lot of people’s minds that will last a long time. I can’t say we were the best team ever, but I can say that we should be mentioned in the same breath with any other team that’s given that title.” And if those Greenville players accomplish anything close to what the Mobile players did in Oakland, it may take more than one hand to count the number of pennants for the Braves.

## 1997 Southern League Championship Season

As probable and historic as the Greenville Braves 1992 Southern League Championship was, the 1997 title was equally as improbable. The two teams and the two seasons were polar opposites, but with the same result.

Great things were expected of the Greenville Braves in 1992. Fielding such budding stars as catcher Javy Lopez and infielder Chipper Jones along with a savvy pitching staff, the G-Braves created a stir among the faithful at Greenville Municipal Stadium.

Despite the pressure to succeed, the G-Braves came through with the first Southern League title in team history. Lopez was named the circuit's Most Valuable Player, Jones was voted the loop's top prospect and the pitching staff posted 24 shutouts. It's no wonder the team won 100 games.

Unfortunately, expectations for the 1997 G-Braves team weren't so great. '97's team had nowhere near the star power of the '92 squad, but it still showed the talent and resiliency needed to win a championship. The G-Braves finished below .500 in the first half, but went 40-30 thereafter.

One look at how the team started the season will tell you why hopes weren't so high. The club lost six of its first seven games. There wasn't a month in which the G-Braves pitchers posted lower than a combined 4.48 ERA. Three of the team's best hurlers, Kevin Millwood, Kerry Ligtenberg, and Mike Cather, were gone by early June and in the major leagues by the end of July. Four of Greenville's pitchers in the playoffs had spent the majority of the season hurling at Class-A Durham.

Yet, even with the improbability of the event, Greenville skipper Randy Ingle molded a winner. After concluding the first half of the 1997 slate with a third-

place, 34-36 record, Ingle managed the G-Braves to the second-half Eastern Division crown and the league championship. While many observers will debate the true value of a manager's impact on winning and losing, few of his players would argue that Ingle may have been the team's most valuable performer.

"I'm tickled for Randy," said Paul Snyder, Atlanta's Director of Scouting and Player Development. "He's done a lot more than we thought possible."

Another factor that made the '97 team's success so improbable was the age of the roster. Historically, Atlanta had loaded its Double-A affiliate with young talent. Year after year, the G-Braves would be among the league's youngest and least-experienced teams. The 1997 version, however, was different.

While young prospects such as Damian Moss, Wes Helms, John Rocker, Derrin Ebert, and Marc Lewis made strides in developing into major league players, the roster was dominated by veterans. Familiar Southern League names like Kevin Grijak, Pedro Swann, Mike Warner, Raul Rodarte, Manny Jimenez, and David Toth provided experience and stability in making the G-Braves the unlikely champs.

"A lot of us had been in this league a long time," says Swann, who set career-highs with 24 home runs and 83 RBI. "As a group, we felt we had something to prove."

And they did. The team rallied from a five-game deficit late in the second half to qualify for the playoffs. After beating Knoxville three games-to-one in the first round, the

The hitting star in the last two games – Greenville forced the final game with a 7-3 win the previous night – was centerfielder Marc Lewis, who went 3-8 with eight RBIs. Shortstop Manny Jimenez also provided three RBIs in the final game with a bases-clearing double in the first inning.

“I think it’s a real tribute to those guys,” said Atlanta General Manager John Schuerholz. “With a team that was not viewed as being overly talented ... we’re proud for them and for the organization.”

“These guys fought hard all year, overcame a lot of stuff, and never gave up or never quit,” said Randy Ingle, who was named the Southern League’s Manager of the Year. “They’ve got the biggest hearts you’ll find anywhere. We kept battling. Nobody gave us a chance. But these guys never gave up and this is something nobody can ever take from them. I’m so darn proud of this team. This run has been outstanding.”

Underscoring just how unsung the G-Braves were before their championship, no member of the roster was named to the Southern League All-Star team. This group of unlikely heroes not only won the Southern League Championship, they also set a new team attendance record of 267,000.

G-Braves outlasted heavily favored Huntsville in a nail-biting, five-game championship series.

Another factor that made the run incredible was the roster they faced in the championship series. With players the caliber of Miguel Tejada and Eric Chavez, and a league-best 77-62 record, the deck was stacked against the G-Braves. They trailed the Stars 0-1 and 1-2 in the best-of-five final series but rebounded to win.

Greenville put the final game away soon after the first pitch. The G-Braves jumped all over Huntsville starter Bill King in the first inning, batting around and scoring five runs. They cruised to an 8-4 win.



## All-Time Mississippi Braves' Managers

### Brian Snitker (2002 - 2005)



Brian Snitker managed the Greenville Braves for three years before moving with the team to Pearl, MS in 2005. The Braves first year in Mississippi proved to be a fruitful one thanks in large part to the direction of Snitker.


The '05 team had some of the brightest prospects in the organization and promoted an unprecedented 11 players to Atlanta. With the likes of Jeff Francoeur, Brian McCann, Blaine Boyer, Macay McBride, Chuck James, and Anthony Lerew, the M-Braves were in a position to make a charge in the second half.

That charge never came as the majority of the players that put the team in a position to win were promoted to AAA Richmond or directly to Atlanta. After struggling through most of the first half, the Braves finished two games out of first place in the South Division and a half game out of second. Once the young players got accustomed to AA baseball, the wins started to pile up.

Just as the M-Braves were starting to put it all together, injuries in Atlanta forced the parent club to call up most of its future stars. Atlanta played a total of 17 rookies in '05 and they earned the nickname "The Baby Braves." "The Baby Braves" proved they could play with the big boys as they collectively drove Atlanta to its 14th consecutive division championship.

Snitker led Mississippi to a 64-68 record in its first year, a feat that shouldn't be overlooked with all the team had to deal with. They moved to a new city, most of the team's star players were promoted, and the final eight games of the season were canceled due to Hurricane Katrina.

### Jeff Blausler (2006)



Jeff Blausler took his first managerial position with the Mississippi Braves in 2006. He served as a roving instructor for the Braves' organization for two years before being named the M-Braves skipper in the fall of '05.

Blausler had two of the games' best young players in Jarrod Saltalamacchia and Yunel Escobar and continued the M-Braves knack for promoting players to Atlanta when Martin Prado and Phil Stockman were called up.

Blausler was joined on his staff by player/coach Eddie Perez to give the Braves two former Major Leaguers calling the shots. In a peculiar year where the Braves saw a coach, Jon Williams, become a player (he was activated due to a lack of depth at the catcher position), it was also rewarding the two biggest crowds in Trustmark Park history came out to see Major League star Chipper Jones.

The M-Braves also had Major Leaguers Kyle Davies, Joey Devine, Macay McBride, and John Thomson for extended periods of time. Once again, the M-Braves finished the first half in third place in the South Division, but floundered down the stretch. With all the talent on the roster, the team couldn't find the winning formula as they finished the year 58-80 and in last place in the league.
