## National Provisional Results from the 30 June 2007 Parliamentary Elections

On Saturday 30 June 2007, Timor-Leste conducted its first parliamentary elections since the proclamation of the restoration of independence in 2002. Voting took place in a total of 708 polling stations spread across Timor-Leste to select 65 deputies for the National Parliament, who will then form a government to rule our beloved nations for the next five years.

For nine hours, between 07.00 am and 16.00 pm , the voters lined up at their respective polling centers to exercise their right to vote. After voting was completed, the confidential materials were transported, under the supervision of UNPOL/PNTL, by car, helicopter and porter to district centers to be handed over to the respective District Tabulation Centers (AAD). On Sunday 1 July, AAD commenced counting and tabulation at the district level, in accordance with Article 46, Law No. 06/2006, as amended by the $1^{\text {st }}$ Amendment to Law No. 6/2006, Law No. $06 / 2007$, Article 8 , which states that counting shall be conducted in each district.

The district counting and tabulation process conducted by AAD commenced on $1^{\text {st }}$ July whereby counting took place between 07.00 am and 22.00 pm (a total of fifteen hours per day), which took an average of three days; counting in Oecussi was completed in just two days, whereas in the final District of Dili, counting took five days and was completed on Thursday 5 July.


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$\overline{\text { Therefore at } 18.34 \mathrm{pm} \text { on Thursday the } 5^{\text {th }} \text { July, the results of the counting and tabulation process }}$ for all districts were received at the CNE headquarters in Dili.

At 11.20am on Friday 6 July 2007, CNE commenced tabulating the national provisional results of the Parliamentary Election at the CNE headquarters in Dili. With utmost caution, CNE evaluated, analyzed and verified the minutes of each district and issued a final decision on the number of invalid votes, contested votes, and numerical discrepancies from the 13 districts. From a total number of 10,232 invalid and contested votes received from the 13 districts, the national tabulation process established that 2,925 votes ( $28.59 \%$ ) were valid and 7,307 votes (71.41 \%), spread unevenly across the political parties, were confirmed as invalid votes.

The process of verifying and determining invalid and contested votes was carried out 16 hours per day, between the hours of 8 am and 12 midnight, and was completed at 12 midnight on 7 July. Therefore CNE needed a total of 36 hours, 40 minutes to complete the counting and tabulation of invalid and contested votes.

CNE then entered the following information from the respective districts into a parliamentary election database: total number of registered voters, total number of valid votes for each political party and coalition, total number of invalid votes and total number of blank votes. Thereafter CNE consolidated the national results and prepared the final minutes for both district and national results. CNE completed this task yesterday morning, Sunday 8 July 2007.

The national tabulation process for the parliamentary elections also included activities such as the calculation of the electoral threshold for political parties and coalitions, by applying the d'Hondt formula to the number of valid votes received for each political party and coalition, allocating seats based on the names of deputy candidates who appeared on the respective lists of each party and coalition.


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$\overline{\text { CNE converted the total number of valid votes received by each party and coalition into }}$ allocated seats pursuant to the $1^{\text {st }}$ Amendment of Law No. 6/2006, Law No. 06/2007, Article 2, which prescribes the application of the proportional representation system in accordance with the d'Hondt method.

Therefore, at 11.20am on this day, Monday 9 July 2007, CNE announced the following provisional national tabulation results for the Parliamentary Election together with the distribution of seats in the National Parliament for each respective political party and coalition.

## Voter Turnout

From the total number of 529,198 voters registered on the electoral roll, 426,210 exercised their right to vote in the parliamentary election. This indicates a voter turnout of $80.5 \%$. From the total number of votes cast by the voters on the day of the election, the political parties and coalitions received 415,604 (97.51 \%) valid votes; 2,636 (0.62 \%) blank votes and 7,970 (1.87 \%) invalid votes.

The following table displays the number of valid votes received by each political party and coalition.

## Calculating the $\mathbf{3} \%$ electoral threshold for valid votes

In order for valid votes to be converted into seats, a political party or coalition must meet a threshold of at least $3 \%$ of the total number of valid votes received $(415,604)$. Therefore, any political party or coalition that received less than 12,468 valid votes (the electoral threshold), shall not be entitled to the distribution of seats, pursuant to Article 13, Law No. 06/2006 as amended by the $1^{\text {st }}$ Amendment to Law No. 6/2006, Law No. 6/2007, Article 2, which prescribes that "candidates who obtain less than $3 \%$ of the total number of valid votes, excluding blank votes, shall not be entitled to the allocation of seats." According to the aforementioned calculations, the following political parties did not meet the $3 \%$ threshold:

1. Partidu Republikanu (PR);
2. Partidu Demokrata Republika Timor (PDRT) ;
3. Partidu Demokratiku Cristao (PDC);
4. Uniao Democratica Timorense (UDT);
5. Partido Mileniumj Demokratiku (PMD);
6. Partidu Sosialista Timorense; and


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7. Partido Nacionalista Timor (PNT).

The following political parties or coalitions exceeded the electoral threshold:

1. UNDERTIM;
2. CNRT;
3. PD;
4. ASDT-PSD Coalition;
5. AD-KOTA-PPT Coalition;
6. FRETILIN; and
7. PUN.

## Allocation of seats in accordance with the candidate lists of each political party and coalition

The table below shows the total number of seats allocated to each political party and coalition in accordance with Article 14.1, Law No. 6/2006, which states that, "Within each list, seats shall be attributed to candidates in accordance with the order of precedence indicated in item 2 of Article 12". FRETILIN obtained 21 (twenty one) seats; CNRT obtained 18 (eighteen) seats; ASDT/PSD Coalition obtained 11 (eleven) seats; PD obtained 8 (eight) seats; PUN obtained 3 (three) seats; AD KOTA/PPT obtained 2 (two) seats; and UNDERTIM obtained 2 (two) seats.

## Participation of Women

From the total number of voters, $47 \%$ were women and $53 \%$ were men. After converting voting results into the allocation of seats, it is evident that 18 female candidates from the candidate lists of political parties and coalitions, in varying numbers, succeeded in obtaining seats as deputies in the National Parliament. In other words, $27.69 \%$ from a total number of 65 seats were allocated to women.

## Complaints received

During the entire parliamentary process, as of 5pm on 8 July, CNE had received a total of 83 (eighty three) complaints. After completing the analysis of the complaints, it was decided that 29 complaints will be sent to the Office of the Public Prosecutor. The majority of complaints were submitted by political parties against other political parties in relation to acts of provocation and intimidation.

According to Electoral Law No. 6 /2006, CNE earlier today sent a copy of the final minutes of the tabulation of national results to STAE and the Media. CNE also sent copies of the provisional tabulation of the national results to the Court of Appeal.

According to Article 49 of Electoral Law No. 6/2006, as amended by the $1^{\text {st }}$ Amendment to Law No. 06/2006, Law No. 6/2007, Article 10, any party may file an appeal to the Court of Appeal


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against the provisional tabulation of the national results published by CNE within 48 hours of their posting. After any existing appeals have been decided, CNE shall send the final tabulation results to the Court of Appeal together with the district tabulation minutes, as well as the minutes on the conversion of votes to the allocation of seats by applying the proportional representation system in accordance with the d'Hondt method.

Last of all, on behalf of CNE, I would like to congratulate all citizens of Timor Leste, both male and female, old and young, for the intelligence, political maturity and sense of civic duty that you have demonstrated prior to and during the parliamentary election. This election will be recorded in history as a success thanks to you and each and every citizen who has strengthened the democratic institutions in this independent and sovereign nation of Timor Leste. On behalf of CNE, I would also like to congratulate STAE together with all of its staff and electoral officials and officers, for the work, responsibility and dedication that they have taken on to ensure the success of this election, as well as the National Police of Timor Leste (PNTL), the United Nations Police (UNPOL) and the International Stabilization Forces (ISF) for providing security during the electoral process as well as protecting all electoral materials. We must not forget to extend our gratitude to the assistance provided by the UN, especially the provision of personnel from the electoral unit who have worked together with the existing electoral organs. Last of all, we extend our gratitude to the donors, the media and observers for their presence and participation in the electoral process which has made a major contribution to the development and strengthening of democratic institutions in Timor Leste. Thank you, and may God bless us all. Amen
