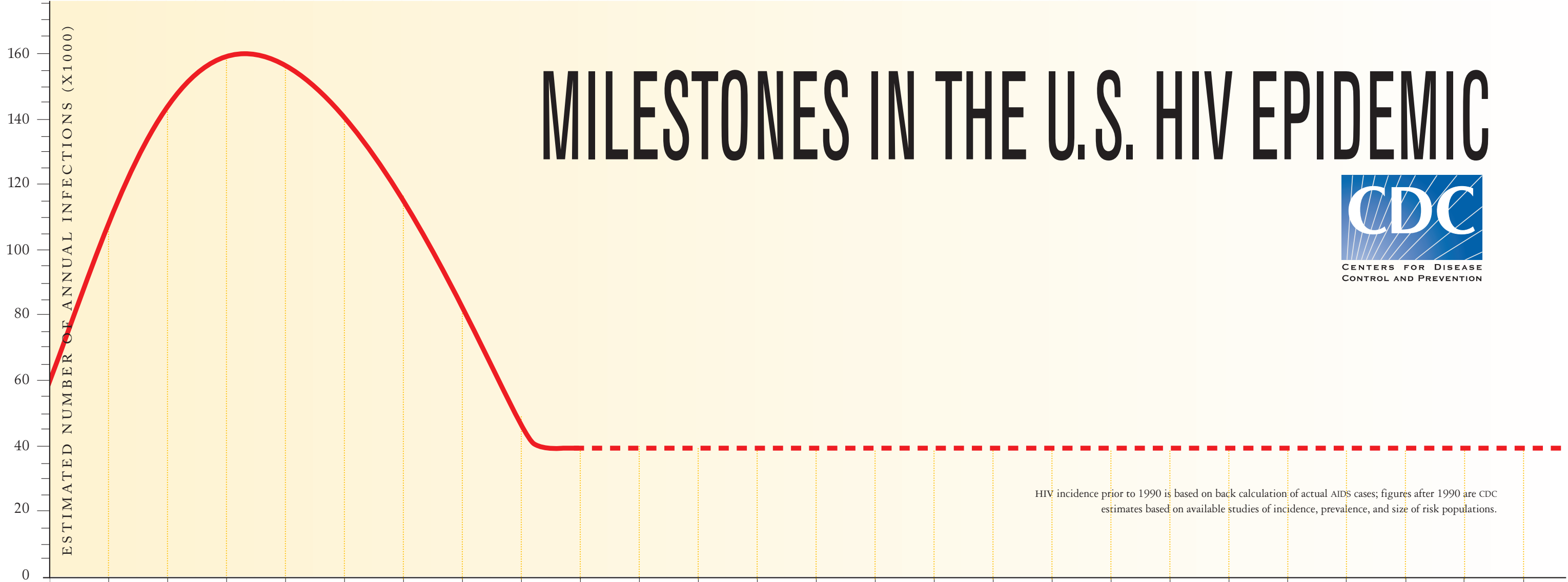


MILESTONES IN THE U.S. HIV EPIDEMIC



HIV incidence prior to 1990 is based on back calculation of actual AIDS cases; figures after 1990 are CDC estimates based on available studies of incidence, prevalence, and size of risk populations.
