INTRODUCTION

Our chronology looks at the history of Florida newspapers. It begins in 1783 during the last days of British rule and ends with the first year of the 21st century.

Each generation of Florida journalists has reported the news that becomes tomorrow's history, and in the process they have created one of the most innovative newspaper states in the country.

Old yellowed newspapers, rolls of microfilm, and archived web pages not only preserve stories about the history of Florida and the world, but they also give us insight into the people who have managed and worked for the state's newspapers.

This chronology only scratches the surface of a very long and complex story, but hopefully it will serve as a useful reference tool for researchers and journalism historians.

We also hope this chronology serves as a reminder of the important role our state's newspapers have played in preserving the news that becomes the first rough draft of Florida history.

CHRONOLOGY (1783 - 1820)

- September 3, 1783 -- The Treaty of Paris between Britain and the United States ends the Revolutionary War.
- The British return Florida back to Spain.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

The East-Florida Gazette, St. Augustine, 1783-1784

> February 1, 1783 -- Florida's first newspaper, *The East-Florida Gazette*, prints its first issue. The publishers are William and John Wells, former publishers of a pro-British newspaper in South Carolina. *The East-Florida Gazette* is founded in St. Augustine during the last days of British rule in Florida. In their third issue, dated February 22 to March 1, the front page is filled with two official proclamations and five advertisements. With a British coat of arms printed across the top of the page, the reader learns about a new liquor regulation, the quality of local bread, and the "disorders which have happened in this province."

1784

- East Florida Governor: Manuel de Zespedes
- West Florida Governor: Arturo O'Neill
- Many of Florida's British colonists leave the state and move to the British East Indies.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

The East-Florida Gazette, St. Augustine, 1783-1784

> March 22, 1784 -- The East-Florida Gazette prints its final issue.

1785-1816

• There is no record of any newspapers in Florida between the years 1785-1816.

1817

- Gregor MacGregor, soldier of fortune, captures the Florida city of Fernandina on Amelia Island.
- Luis Aury declares Amelia Island annexed to Mexico but American forces soon retake the island.
- U.S. President: James Monroe, 1817-1825
- The First Seminole War begins. It lasts until 1819.

NASSAU COUNTY

El Telegrafo de las Floridas, Fernandina, 1817

> December 1817 -- Florida's second newspaper, *El Telegrafo de las Floridas*, is published in Fernandina. This short lived Spanish language newspaper serves as a partisan supporter of the government of Luis Aury.

1818-1820

• There is no record of any newspapers in Florida between the years 1818-1820.

CHRONOLOGY (1820s)

- July 17, 1821 -- Florida military territorial governor Andrew Jackson, acting on behalf of the United States, formally receives East and West Florida from the Spanish government.
- November 1821 -- Andrew Jackson resigns as military governor and returns to Tennessee.
- Congressional Delegate: Joseph M. Hernandez, 1821-1823

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Floridian, Pensacola, 1821-1824

- > August 18, 1821 -- The Pensacola *Floridian* is established.
- > Cary Nicholas and George Tunstall are the newspaper's publishers. They also serve as the first official printers in the territory of Florida.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Florida Gazette, St. Augustine, 1821

- > July 14, 1821 -- The first territorial newspaper, the *Florida Gazette*, is founded in St. Augustine by Richard W. Edes.
- > October 15, 1821 -- The newspaper stops when Edes dies from yellow fever shortly after he launches the *Gazette*.

1822

- Territorial Governor: William P. Duval, 1822-1834
- March 30, 1822 -- East and West Florida are unified into a single United States territory.
- July 1822 -- The first territorial legislative council meets in Pensacola.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

East Florida Herald / later: Florida Herald, St. Augustine, 1822-1850s

> August 1822 -- Elias B. Gould is the founder of the East Florida Herald in St. Augustine.

1823

- Congressional Delegate: Richard K. Call, 1823-1825
- Tallahassee is selected as the permanent capital of Florida.

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Floridian, Pensacola, 1821-1824

> John Fitzgerald is the new publisher of the Pensacola Floridian.

1824

- The territorial legislature meets in Tallahassee for the first time.
- The Fort Brooke military outpost is established at Tampa Bay.

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Pensacola Gazette, Pensacola, 1824-1860s?

> March 13, 1824 -- The *Pensacola Gazette* is started in the former office of the Pensacola *Floridian*.

West Florida Advertiser, Pensacola, 1824-1860s?

- Congressional Delegate: Joseph M. White, 1825-1837
- U.S. President: John Quincy Adams, 1825-1829
- A United States navy yard is established in Pensacola.

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Pensacola Gazette, Pensacola, 1824-1860s

> Hasell Hunt, like many newspaper editors, is active in state and local politics. He serves as tax assessor of Escambia County, clerk of the superior court of West Florida, Pensacola postmaster, and a member of the Florida legislative council.

LEON COUNTY

The Florida Intelligencer, Tallahassee, 1825-1826?

- > February 19, 1825 -- Tallahassee's first newspaper, *The Florida Intelligencer*, is started by Ambrose Crane and Adam Gordon.
- > The new state capital draws businesses in search of government contracts and the *Intelligencer* obtains a public printing contract. Government publications printed on the newspaper's press includes the imprint: "Tallahassee, Printed at the Office of the *Florida Intelligencer*."

1826

• A small two-story Tallahassee building replaces the log cabin which served as Florida's first capital building. (Another capital is begun in 1839 and completed in 1845 just prior to statehood. A dome is built in 1891 and additional wings are added in 1901, 1921 and 1940. Florida's 22-story capital building is dedicated in 1978.)

LEON COUNTY

The Florida Intelligencer, Tallahassee, 1825-1826?

> The newspaper suspends publication sometime between December 1826 and March 1827.

1827

• Steamboat service begins on the Apalachicola River.

LEON COUNTY

Florida Advocate, Tallahassee, 1827-1829

> Edgar Macon purchases the former office of the *Florida Intelligencer* and starts the *Florida Advocate*.

1828

• The Bank of Florida is chartered in Tallahassee.

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Florida Argus, Pensacola, 1828

- > June 17, 1828 -- Thomas Eastin establishes the *Florida Argus* in Pensacola.
- > November 18, 1828 -- The Florida Argus prints its final issue.

LEON COUNTY

Floridian, Tallahassee, 1828-?

- > October 7, 1828 -- William Wilson establishes the Floridian.
- > The newspaper receives a contract to print government documents.

Magnolia Advertiser, Tallahassee, 1828-1830

> December 12, 1828 -- Augustus Steele establishes the Magnolia Advertiser.

- U.S. President: Andrew Jackson, 1829-1837
- The Chipola Canal Company is chartered to build a canal or railroad across Florida.

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Pensacola Gazette, Pensacola, 1824-1860s

> July 1829 -- William Hasell Hunt sells the *Pensacola Gazette*.

LEON COUNTY

Florida Advocate, Tallahassee, 1827-1829

> August 1829 -- The *Advocate* is sold to the *Floridian*.

MONROE COUNTY

Key West Register, Key West, 1829-1830?

> January 8, 1830 -- Thomas Eastin establishes the Key West Register.

Commercial Advertiser, Key West, 1829-1830?

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

East Florida Herald / later: Florida Herald, St. Augustine, 1822-1850s

> The newspaper's title is shortened to the *Florida Herald*.

CHRONOLOGY (1830s)

- Florida population: 34,730
- The first federal census in Florida takes place.

LEON COUNTY

Florida Courier, Tallahassee, 1830-1832

> December 1830 -- The *Florida Courier* is established in Tallahassee.

Magnolia Advertiser, Tallahassee, 1828-1830

> The Magnolia Advertiser folds during 1830.

MONROE COUNTY

Key West Register, Key West, 1829-1830

- > The Key West Register is discontinued during 1830.
- > The editor, Thomas Eastin, later becomes the U.S. Marshal in Key West.

1831

• Florida's cigar industry begins when W.H. Hall selects a factory site in Key West.

MONROE COUNTY

Key West Gazette, Key West, 1831-1832

> Spring 1831 -- Benjamin B. Strobel and L.M. Stone establish the Key West Gazette.

1832

- March 1832 -- The Treaty of Payne's Landing attempts to relocate Indians from Florida to Arkansas.
- Columbia and Franklin counties are created.

LEON COUNTY

Florida Courier, Tallahassee, 1830-1832

> The *Florida Courier* prints its final issue.

1833

 September 1833 -- President Andrew Jackson orders that government funds be withdrawn from the Second Bank of the United States.

FRANKLIN COUNTY

Advertiser, Apalachicola, 1833-1835

> Apalachicola's first newspaper, the *Advertiser*, is started by R. Dinsmore Westcott.

1834

- Territorial Governor: John H. Eaton, 1834-1836
- Florida's first railroad is established. It runs from Tallahassee to St. Marks.

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Pensacola Gazette, Pensacola, 1824-1860s

- > Benjamin Drake Wright becomes the new owner of the *Pensacola Gazette*.
- > John M'Kinlay is the newspaper's printer and publisher.

MONROE COUNTY

Key West Enquirer, Key West, 1834-1836

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Florida Herald, St. Augustine, 1822-1850s

> James M. Gould succeeds his father, Elias B. Gould, as the publisher of the newspaper.

• December 28, 1835 -- The Second Seminole War begins shortly after Major Francis L. Dade and his force of 112 soldiers are killed by Seminole Indians during a confrontation which has become known as the Dade Massacre. Thousands of soldiers, settlers, and Indians will be killed before the war ends in 1842.

DUVAL COUNTY

Jacksonville Courier. Jacksonville, 1835-1839

- > January 1, 1835 -- The *Jacksonville Courier* is established.
- > Elijah Williams is the editor.

FRANKLIN COUNTY

St. Joseph Telegraph, St. Joseph, 1835-1836

- > October 1835 -- R. Dinsmore Westcott establishes the St. Joseph Telegraph.
- > November 1835 -- Westcott combines the Apalachicola Advertiser with the Telegraph.

LEON COUNTY

Tallahassee Gazette, Tallahassee, 1835

> David Sheffer and John Baldwin publish the *Gazette* during 1835.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Florida Herald, St. Augustine, 1822-1850s

> January 1835 -- A fire destroys the *Herald*'s building and the newspaper closes until April.

1836

- Territorial Governor: Richard K. Call, 1836-1839
- January 1836 -- President Jackson orders General Winfield Scott to take command of U.S. troops in Florida.

DUVAL COUNTY

Jacksonville Courier, Jacksonville, 1835-1839

> Lorenzo Currier sells the paper in 1836.

FRANKLIN COUNTY

Apalachicola Gazette, Apalachicola, 1836-1840

> March 10, 1836 -- Cosam Emir Bartlett establishes the *Apalachicola Gazette*.

St. Joseph Telegraph / later: St. Joseph Times, St. Joseph, 1835-1836

> July 1836 -- The St. Joseph Telegraph becomes the St. Joseph Times.

1837

- Congressional Delegate: Charles Downing, 1837-1841
- U.S. President: Martin Van Buren, 1837-1841
- December 25, 1837 -- Colonel Zachary Taylor's troops fight the Seminoles in the Battle of Okeechobee.
- A destructive frost destroys citrus crops.
- The national financial depression weakens state finances already strained by the Seminole War.

LEON COUNTY

Floridian, Tallahassee, 1828-?

> Samuel Shute Sibley takes over the *Floridian*.

• December 3, 1838 -- A Florida constitutional convention begins in St. Joseph.

DUVAL COUNTY

Jacksonville Courier, Jacksonville, 1835-1839

> The Reverend David Brown becomes the newspaper's editor.

MONROE COUNTY

South Floridian, Key West, 1838-1840

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

News, St. Augustine, 1838-1852

> November 1838 -- Daniel W. Whitehurst establishes the St. Augustine News.

1839

- Territorial Governor: Robert R. Reid, 1839-1841
- January 1839 -- A Florida constitution is adopted.

DUVAL COUNTY

East Florida Advocate, Jacksonville, 1839-1840

> September 1839 -- Aaron Jones, Jr. establishes the East Florida Gazette.

FRANKLIN COUNTY

Apalachicola Courier, Apalachicola, 1839-1840

Apalachicola Gazette, Apalachicola, 1836-1840

- > The weekly *Apalachicola Gazette* becomes a daily.
- > The *Apalachicola Gazette* is the first daily Florida newspaper.

GADSDEN COUNTY

Quincy Sentinel, Quincy, 1839-1841

> November 15, 1839 -- Joshua Knowles establishes the *Quincy Sentinel*.

LEON COUNTY

Tallahassee Star, Tallahassee, 1839-1846

> J.B. Webb establishes the *Tallahassee Star*.

CHRONOLOGY (1840s)

- Florida population: 54,477
- General Zachary Taylor is the commander of U.S. forces in Florida.

FRANKLIN COUNTY

Apalachicola Gazette / later: Florida Journal, Apalachicola, 1840-1843

> The Apalachicola Gazette becomes the Florida Journal.

Apalachicolian, Apalachicola, 1840-1841.

LEON COUNTY

Tallahassee Star, Tallahassee, 1839-1846

- > Cosam Emir Bartlett purchases the *Tallahassee Star*.
- > Bartlett is assisted by his two sons, Washington and Cosam Juliam Bartlett.

(Washington Bartlett later moves to California and becomes the mayor of San Francisco and Governor of California.)

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

News, St. Augustine, 1838-1852

> Thomas T. Russell and Aaron Jones, Jr. become the new publishers of the *News*.

1841

- Territorial Governor: Richard K. Call, 1841-1844
- Congressional Delegate: David Levy Yulee, 1841-1845
- U.S. President: William Henry Harrison, 1841
- U.S. President: John Tyler, 1841-1845
- There is a yellow fever epidemic during 1841.

LEON COUNTY

Florida Sentinel, Tallahassee, 1841-1870s

Floridian, Tallahassee, 1828-?

> Publishers Edward R. Gibson and William M. Smith die during the yellow fever epidemic.

Quincy Sentinel / later: Florida Sentinel, Tallahassee, 1841-1870s

- > Editor Knowles moves the former *Quincy Sentinel* to Tallahassee.
- > The newspaper's name is changed to the Florida Sentinel.

1842

• The Second Seminole War comes to an end.

DUVAL COUNTY

Tropical Plant, Jacksonville, 1842-1845

> December 1845 -- The *Tropical Plant* is established by George M. Grouard in Jacksonville.

1843

• September 1843 -- A devastating storm destroys the town of Port Leon.

FRANKLIN COUNTY

Commercial Advertiser, Apalachicola, 1843?-1858?

Florida Journal / later: Watchman of the Gulf, Apalachicola, 1843

> The Florida Journal becomes the Watchman of the Gulf.

LEON COUNTY

Commercial Gazette, Port Leon, 1843

- > June 1843 -- Albert R. Alexander is the editor of the *Commercial Gazette*.
- > September 1843 -- Editor Alexander moves to Newport after the Port Leon storm.

- Territorial Governor: John Branch, 1844-1845
- Marion County is created.

MONROE COUNTY

Light of the Reef / later: Key West Gazette, Key West, 1844-?

- > Edwin L. Ware and E. B. Scarborough establish the *Light of the Reef*.
- > The newspaper changes its name to the Key West Gazette in 1845.

WAKULLA COUNTY

Newport Patriot, New Port, 1844-?

> Albert R. Alexander establishes the *Newport Patriot*.

1845

- Florida population: 57,951
- March 3, 1845 -- President John Tyler, on the last day of his administration, signs the act granting statehood to Florida.
- Florida becomes the 27th state in the Union.
- The state of Florida is informally divided into three areas:

East Florida, from the Atlantic Ocean to the Suwannee River;

Middle Florida, between the Suwannee and the Apalachicola Rivers;

and West Florida, which extends from the Apalachicola to the Perdido River.

- Governor: William D. Moseley, 1845-1849
- Senators: David Levy Yulee; James D. Westcott, Jr.
- U.S. President: James K. Polk, 1845-1849

DUVAL COUNTY

Florida Whig, Jacksonville, 1845

- > The Florida Whig is created to promote the Whig political party.
- > Thomas T. Russell, formerly of the St. Augustine *News*, publishes the *Florida Whig*.

Florida Statesman, Jacksonville, 1845-1846

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Democrat, Pensacola, 1845-1856

1846

- The first steam locomotive comes to Florida.
- The state's economy is based on agriculture.
- There are six newspapers in Florida. None of the papers are dailies. The total circulation for the state is 5,250.

DUVAL COUNTY

News, St. Augustine / Jacksonville, 1838-1852

> The newspaper is moved from St. Augustine to Jacksonville.

Whig Banner, Palatka, 1846

> George M. Grouard sells the *Florida Statesman* and begins the *Banner* in Palatka.

LEON COUNTY

Southern Journal, Tallahassee, 1846-?

WAKULLA COUNTY

Newport Gazette, Newport, 1846

- Senators: David Levy Yulee; James D. Westcott, Jr.
- Fernandina's Fort Clinch is built.

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Live Oak, Pensacola, 1847

JACKSON COUNTY

Florida Whig, Marianna, 1847-?

LEON COUNTY

Floridian, Tallahassee, 1828-?

- > Charles Edward Dyke serves as the editor of the Tallahassee *Floridian* from 1847-1883.
- > The newspaper is a supporter of the Democratic party.

1848

- Holmes County is created.
- September 1848 -- A hurricane hits the west coast of Florida.

DUVAL COUNTY

Florida Republican, Jacksonville, 1848-?

> Jacksonville's *Florida Republican* is founded with Columbus Drew as editor.

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Neutral, Pensacola, 1848

FRANKLIN COUNTY

Star of the West, Apalachicola, 1848

1849

- Governor: Thomas Brown, 1849-1853
- Senators: David Levy Yulee; Jackson Morton
- U.S. President: Zachary Taylor, 1849-1850

WAKULLA COUNTY

Wakulla Times, Newport, 1849-?

> The publisher is James Baker Carlisle.

CHRONOLOGY (1850s)

- Florida population: 87,445
- U.S. President: Millard Fillmore, 1850-1853
- There are ten newspapers in Florida. None of the papers are dailies. The total circulation for the state is 5,750.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Ancient City, St. Augustine, 1850-?

1851

- Senators: Jackson Morton; Stephen R. Mallory
- The Florida legislature authorizes the building of a plank toll road between Jacksonville and Alligator (later renamed Lake City).
- Dr. John Gorrie of Apalachicola patents a mechanical cooling machine. His invention will evolve into the air conditioner.
- The "Great Storm of 1851"

MARION COUNTY

Marion Star, Ocala, 1851-?

1852

- Steamboat service begins on the St. James River.
- November 2, 1852 -- Franklin Pierce wins the U.S. presidential race.

DUVAL COUNTY

Florida News, Jacksonville, 1852-1859

MARION COUNTY

Tropical Farmer, Ocala, 1852-1853

1853

- Governor: James E. Broome, 1853-1857 (A.K. Allison, acting Governor, 1853)
- Senators: Jackson Morton; Stephen R. Mallory
- U.S. President: Franklin Pierce, 1853-1857
- The East Florida Seminary takes over the Kingsbury Academy in Ocala.

MARION COUNTY

Florida Mirror, Ocala, 1853-?

1854

- Volusia County is created.
- The U.S. Congress passes the Kansas-Nebraska Act.

HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY

Tampa Herald / later: The Florida Peninsular, Tampa, 1854-1872

- > January 10, 1854 -- Tampa first newspaper, the Tampa Herald,
- is started by Whit Smith and the Rev. C.S. Reynolds.
- > November 1854 -- Smith and Reynolds sell the *Tampa Herald* to James Jones.
- > Jones renames the newspaper *The Florida Peninsular*.

NASSAU COUNTY

News-Leader, Fernandina, 1854-Present

1855

- Senators: Stephen R. Mallory; David Levy Yulee
- The Third Seminole War begins in 1855 and ends in 1858.
- State legislators pass the Internal Improvement Act which uses cheap or free public land to interest developers in Florida.

LEON COUNTY

Florida Sentinel, Tallahassee, 1841-1870s

> The Sentinel supports the "Know Nothing" political party.

- Taylor and Lafayette counties are created.
- November 4, 1856 -- James Buchanan wins the U.S. presidential race.

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

West Florida Times, Pensacola, 1856-1857

1857

- Governor: Madison S. Perry, 1857-1861
- Senators: Stephen R. Mallory; David Levy Yulee
- U.S. President: James Buchanan, 1857-1861
- The West Florida Seminary opens in Tallahassee.

ESCAMBIA COUNTY

Observer, Pensacola, 1857-1870

MARION COUNTY

Florida Home Companion, Ocala, 1857-?

1858

- The Third Seminole War ends.
- Clay County is created.

PUTNAM COUNTY_

Palatka News, Palatka, 1858-Present

1859

- Senators: Stephen R. Mallory; David Levy Yulee
- The state's first telegraph office is opened in Tallahassee.
- Yellow fever spreads throughout Tampa. 275 cases are reported and 30 people die.

DUVAL COUNTY

Jacksonville Standard, Jacksonville, 1859?-?

NASSAU COUNTY

East Floridian, Fernandina, 1859-1860s?

CHRONOLOGY (1860s)

- Florida population: 140,424
- The first cross-state railroad connects Fernandina, on the east coast, with Cedar Key on the west.
- There are 22 newspapers in Florida. None of the papers are dailies. The total circulation for the state is 15,500.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY

Examiner, St. Augustine, 1850s?-?

> The *Examiner* prints the following platform: "The secession of the State of Florida -- The dissolution of the Union -- The formation of a Southern Confederacy."

1861

- Governor: John Milton, 1861-1865
- Senators: Florida is not represented in Washington during the Civil War and the beginning of the Reconstruction period, 1861-1867.
- U.S. President: Abraham Lincoln, 1861-1865
- January 10, 1861 -- The ordinance of secession is passed and Florida secedes from the Union.
- February 4, 1861 -- Florida is admitted to the Confederacy.
- April 12, 1861 -- Confederate forces attack Fort Sumter and the Civil War begins.

DUVAL COUNTY

The Southern Confederacy, Jacksonville, 1861-?

HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY

The Florida Peninsular, Tampa, 1854-1872

> May 25, 1861 -- *The Florida Peninsular* suspends publication when publisher William Spencer enlists in the Confederate army. Spencer is killed by typhoid during the war, but his brothers resume publication on April 28, 1866.

Sunny South, Tampa, 1861-?

> January 29, 1861 -- Alfonso DeLaunay starts Tampa's Sunny South newspaper.

1862

- May 1862 -- Union troops occupy Pensacola after the evacuation of Confederate forces.
- President Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation frees slaves in the Confederate states.
- More than 16,000 Floridians serve in the Civil War.

MONROE COUNTY

New Era, Key West, 1862-1863

> The *New Era* prints the following: "...In the limited space allowed us we shall strive to do what we can for the Union."

1863

- The Confederacy relies on Florida to supply salt, cattle and other supplies to the war effort.
- Although there are only a few battles fought on Florida soil, the damage to the state's economy is severe.

NASSAU COUNTY

Peninsula, Fernandina, 1863-1864?

> The *Peninsula* is published while Union troops occupy Fernandina.

- February 20, 1864 -- The Battle of Olustee, the largest Civil War battle fought in Florida, ends with a Confederate victory.
- The Battle of Natural Bridge is won by Confederate troops.

DUVAL COUNTY

Florida Union / later: Florida Times-Union, Jacksonville, 1864-Present

1865

- Governors: There are four Florida governors during 1865: John Milton; Abraham K. Allison, acting; William Marvin, provisional; and David S. Walker who serves until 1868.
- January 31, 1865 -- The U.S. Congress ratifies the 13th Amendment which abolishes slavery.
- April 9, 1865 -- General Robert E. Lee surrenders to General Grant at Appomattox Court House.
