## Clinton leads in SC, while Republican race narrows

Raleigh, N.C. - The latest Public Policy Polling (PPP) survey of likely South Carolina primary voters finds that Hillary Clinton has a narrow lead over Barack Obama in the Democratic Presidential race. Thirty-six percent of Democratic primary voters said they support Clinton, while 33\% backed Obama. John Edwards received support from $12 \%$. In PPP’s previous South Carolina poll, released in June, Obama had lead Clinton by three percent.

On the Republican side Fred Thompson is leading the race with $22 \%$, followed by Rudy Giuliani (18\%), Mitt Romney (17\%), John McCain (11\%) and Mike Huckabee (7\%). Thompson's lead has shrunk in the last two months. In June he led the next closest candidate by eleven percent, and overall his percentage has fallen five percent. In those two months Giuliani has seen his support increase by four percent, McCain's has dropped four percent, and Huckabee's rose four percent.

The survey finds that both Republicans and Democrats say that the War in Iraq is the most important issue, but their opinions are dramatically different on what should be done about it.

Eighty-two percent of Democratic primary voters say Congress should be doing more to end the War in Iraq, while $9 \%$ say Congress is doing a good job on the war. Meanwhile, $77 \%$ of Republican primary voters say Republicans in Congress should support the President's plans for Iraq, and 19\% say they should push for a change in policy.

PPP surveyed 1186 likely primary voters in South Carolina. 749 said they would vote in the Republican primary and 437 in the Democratic primary. The surveys have margins of error of $\pm 3.6 \%$ and $\pm 4.7 \%$ respectively. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
