


Crimes Against Persons Per 1,000 Population¹














Property Crimes Per 1,000 Population²

- Class II Allegations of misconduct other than Class I.
 - > 10 Complaints
 - > 67% increase over 2005
 - 7 were substantiated
 - 2 were exonerated
 - 1 was unfounded

- Inquiries Questions or concerns regarding a policy, procedure or practice of Department personnel that do not constitute allegations of misconduct.
 - > 14 inquiries were conducted.
 - > 0% increase over 2005.
















Loud Noise Complaints by Time of Day

Racial Profiling Definition

 "A law enforcement-initiated action based on an individual's race, ethnicity, or national origin rather than on the individual's behavior or on information identifying the individual as having engaged in criminal activity."

Article 3.05, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure

Hispanic	0.88	1.09	0.99




Use of Force Used Type of Force Used


