LIBERTY MEDAL FAST FACTS

The Liberty Medal was established in 1988 by *We the People 200* to heighten recognition of the principles that founded this nation and to serve as a lasting legacy to the 200th anniversary of the U.S. Constitution.

The Liberty Medal annually honors an individual or an organization from anywhere in the world that has "demonstrated leadership and vision in the pursuit of liberty of conscience or freedom from oppression, ignorance, or deprivation."

Six former recipients of the Liberty Medal have subsequently won the Nobel Peace prize.

Past recipients of the Liberty Medal include: former U.S. President Jimmy Carter; the late U.S. Supreme Court Justice Thurgood Marshall, South African Presidents F.W. de Klerk and Nelson Mandela; South Korean President Kim Dae-jung; Doctors James Watson and Francis Crick, co-discoverers of the structure of DNA; United Nations Secretary-General Kofi Annan; United States Secretary of State Colin Powell; U.S. Supreme Court Justice Sandra Day O'Connor; Ukraine President Viktor Yushchenko; and former U.S. Presidents George H.W. Bush and William J. Clinton.

In June 2006, the National Constitution Center reached an agreement with the Philadelphia Foundation to assume all responsibility for the Liberty Medal, which includes the annual presentation of the award and a host of supplemental programs and activities designed to extend the Medal's reach throughout the year.

The Liberty Medal winner is chosen by the National Constitution Center, and approved by the executive committee of the board of trustees.
