

Dr. Aribert Heim is strongly suspected of murdering numerous prisoners in Concentration Camp Mauthausen as SS doctor in 1941 by injecting them deadly poison directly to the heart. He is internationally searched for on the basis of an arrest warrant issued by the Linz High Court. For information enabling the Austrian authorities to capture the fugitive a reward of EUR 50,000 (fifty thousand) has been offered. This reward will only be paid to private persons and not to authorities who have the duty to prosecute criminal acts. Any recourse to courts of law is excluded.

Presumably the fugitive has only one eye left and both of his hands are mutilated.

In the rank of SS-Hauptsturmführer, part time commander of the central office for Jewish emigration in Vienna and through his operation in the then occupied areas especially in Greece and Hungary, Alois Brunner is strongly suspected of being significantly involved in the deportation of Jewish persons with the aim of murdering them. He was one of the co-workers of Adolf Eichmann. Moreover he allegedly personally shot the stock-exchange expert Siegmund Bosel.

He is internationally searched for on the basis of an arrest warrant issued by the Vienna High Court for Criminal Matters. For information enabling the Austrian authorities to capture him, a reward of EUR 50,000 (fifty thousand) has been offered. This reward will only be paid to private persons and not to authorities who have the duty to prosecute criminal acts. Any recourse to courts of law is excluded.
