#### An Introduction to Peru State College

Peru State College was founded in 1867 as Nebraska's first college and was the third teacher education institution established west of the Missouri River. For more than a century, thousands of young people have crossed the "Campus of a Thousand Oaks" to become teachers and leaders in Nebraska and throughout the nation.

The people of Nebraska have made the facilities of the College available to students at a minimal personal cost. The taxpayers of the state bear the major portion of the cost of educating the College's students.

Peru State College admits all graduates of accredited Nebraska high schools and qualified out-of-state and international students. The philosophy of the College is that each person is entitled to the opportunity to succeed at the collegiate level. All who have the ability and the willingness to work will have an excellent chance to succeed at Peru State College.

The College believes in academic excellence, in opportunities for personal growth, and in student self-determination consistent with the principles of a democratic society. Administrative intent is to involve students in decisions that affect them. The College's educational experience is designed to enable students to learn, to equip themselves for meaningful careers, and to have the opportunity to know their instructors well and to be working partners with the staff and other students. Living and working with others offer many opportunities for friendship, growth and personal development.

#### History

In 1867, the same year that Nebraska became a state, the new state's legislature established a training school for teachers at Peru. The school actually began on December 2, 1865, when its predecessor, Mount Vernon College, was organized by a group of early settlers who resolved to place the school under the "care and management of the Methodist Episcopal Church."

Colonel T.J. Majors, a leader during the Civil War and a state legislator, proposed that the school be made into a state university. Although the offer was rejected, the state legislature, on June 20, 1867, did accept the school as a "normal school" several months before the state university was established. For the next 38 years, the Peru school was the only teacher education institution in the state.

As Nebraska's population increased, the legislature extended the normal schools from two-year to four-year institutions and authorized them to grant the degrees of Bachelor of Arts in Educa-

tion, Bachelor of Science in Education, and Bachelor of Fine Arts in Education. At the same time, the name of the school was changed from State Normal School to State Teachers College.

When the United States entered World War II, the College trained officers for the armed forces. The first of an eventual 500 men in the Navy's V-12 program arrived on campus July 1, 1943. The College operated an accelerated program for both civilian students and naval trainees.

In 1963, the College's name was changed to Peru State College. The Bachelor of Science degree was authorized in 1965. Emerging from its role as a singlepurpose teachers college, the College is now a regionally accredited state college offering a wide variety of programs to meet the changing needs of southeast Nebraska and beyond.





#### The Newcomers

Walker is very excited about his first full recruiting class. "It was a major goal to increase our skill levels at all positions and I feel confident that we accomplished that. The new recruits add a lot of skill to go along with our returning players."

Four juniors highlight the incoming class. Joe Mews (Faribault, MN- Vermilion CC) is a 6'2 wing "That can flat out shoot the basketball," says Walker. "Joe has remarkable range and a quick release. To go along with that he is a solid ball handler and plays very hard on the defensive end of the floor." Mews averaged 16.8 ppg last year at VCC and was named to the Minnesota Community College All-State Squad in 2005-06. Also coming in as an experienced collegiate guard is Dante Bogard a 6'3 combo guard from Ridgewater (MN) CC. Dante, a product of Omaha North H.S. had a solid two year career at RCC and was also named to the Southern Division All-State squad last year after averaging 16.1 ppg. "Dante is athletic and can play any perimeter spot for us," said Walker. "He can hit the three effectively but is also a very good mid-range shooter." Mews and Bogard combined for over 160 threes last year. "We only made 144 as a team last year so our shooting abilities have definitely improved."

Font line help was a major goal in Walker's recruiting and a pair of transfers will help fill that void. 6'6 Ruot Chuol (SE Nebraska CC) and 6'5 Herman Van Den Brandt (Iowa Lakes CC) are newcomers that will also make an immediate impact. "Ruot is very athletic and can play inside or out," said Walker. "He shoots the ball very well with range and also can play around the rim inside. We will need him to be an aggressive rebounder for us as well." Chuol played on a talented NECC squad for two seasons and brings solid collegiate experience. Van Den Brandt is a "hard hat and lunch pail" guy according to Walker. "Herman's collegiate coach called him the hardest working player he has ever coached. He has shown those same qualities every day for us also. He bangs, defends and rebounds with a passion. It's hard not to like that kind of player!" Van Den Brandt can also move to the perimeter if needed.

Two freshman round out the list of new Bobcats and include 5'9 Courtney Kidd and 6'4 Beau Harris (Aurora, CO).



### 2006-07 Men's Basketball Season Preview

After a tough stretch on the road to begin the 05-06 season (17 of the first 18 games), Bobcats head coach Dave Walker saw a great deal of improvement during the second half and especially in MCAC play. "It took us a long time to recover from the horrendous start," said Walker. "Confidence was down and the guys had to suck it up and move upward. It was a slow process." The Bobcats recovered enough to make a playoff push until the season's final weekend and finished 6-24 after a 2-18 start.

With a season under the belt, both the returning players and Coach Walker are better prepared for the 2006-07 campaign. Seven Bobcats return and Walker hit the recruiting trails and added nine more players to the mix. "The returnees made good use of the weight room in the off-season and that was a major goal: to improve strength levels. All of the veterans made the grade and the extra strength should help hasten the improvement process."

Heading the list of returning letter-winners are seniors Brandon Barrett (6-3, Wichita, KS) and Marlis Lovelace (6-3, Omaha). Both had impact seasons in 2005-06 and were also recognized by the league coaches by being named the All-MCAC squad. Barrett (14.6 ppg) was a unanimous selection while Lovelace (12 ppg, 6.5 rpg) was an Honorable Mention pick.

"Brandon became an explosive offensive player and we really looked for him to bring that every night which he did. However, he was also a very under-rated defensive performer. I usually gave him the toughest perimeter assignment each night which is an unusual role for a scorer to be in." Barrett will be looked upon heavily to provide on-court leadership as well.

"Marlis had a break-out year and was asked to do a little bit of everything. He played inside as much as out and became our leading rebounder although undersized," added Walker. Lovelace had a strong off-season adding strength and quickness to an already solid frame and appears ready for an all-league type of year again.

Two other seniors, Crif Scheideler (Wymore) and David Glenn (Beatrice) will be competing for more minutes in the rotation. Scheideler, a 6' guard, suffered a knee injury early last season and missed 13 games. He is able to play either guard position and is an excellent spot shooter. "Crif played very well early last year before getting injured. He is a very intelligent player and I am expecting him to step up this season." Glenn came to Peru State via Southeast (NE) Community College but played sparingly in 05-06. The versatile 6'3 wing adds athleticism to the perimeter and Walker hopes that Glenn also will step his game up this year. "David has some good

skills but needs to just let loose in game action. He played very tentatively last season. He has had a good fall camp and he could be a very pleasant surprise for us," added Walker.

Junior point guard Jesse Haynes (5'10, Omaha) returns after starting a majority of the games last year at that position. He is also able to move over to the off-guard position. Haynes (7 ppg) is a solid defender and led the team with 46 steals. He has worked hard to improve his long range shooting and Walker has been pleased with his progress. "Jesse got thrown into the fire last year as our point guard and like everyone had his ups and downs. He has worked very hard in the off-season and is much improved over a year ago," said Walker. "Jesse just needs to be consistent doing all of the little things that need to be done on the court. He is definitely a catalyst for us on the defensive end."

Also returning to the lineup is 6'7 sophomore Brett Spiker (Chariton, IA). Spiker averaged 14 minutes as a true freshman and also suffered some growing pains according to his coach. "Brett started the year on the perimeter but he has very good hands and goes after the ball on the boards very well. No doubt he was our most improved player and became a very competent low post player by season's end." Spiker averaged 5 ppg and 4.1 rpg, second to only Lovelace in that category. Walker expects Spiker to compete for major minutes at both interior positions and improve his numbers as well.

Rounding out the returnees is 6'2 sophomore wing Matt Ryan (Plattsmouth). "Matt showed marked improvement throughout the year but got in a log-jam for minutes at a very congested position," said Walker. "Matt has excellent body strength and hopefully can bump over to the "3" this year. He is a solid long range threat that should do fine with some early game experience." (continued on p. 25)

He directed his teams to two NAIA II National Tournaments and a pair of DAC-10 titles.

After his stop at Black Hills State, Dobbs ventured east to West Virginia Tech where he spent one season as the Head Assistant Women's Basketball Coach / Recruiting Coordinator. Dobbs is single and resides in Peru.

#### Coach Dobbs comments on...

**7.6. Bolecats...** The Bobcats - We have a very young team, will play a plethora of freshman and will have to learn how to compete. I think the nucleus is there, however the experience is not so we'll have to grow up quickly in order to compete with the GPAC teams on our pre-conference schedule. Our goal is to use the pre-conference schedule to toughen us up for what matters which is conference play.

His Paleosophy... Everything is predicated upon one thing....character. A person's character is defined by how they treat people they will never benefit from knowing. Everyone treats those well that are in a position above them, but how do you treat those people who aren't as fortunate as you. We want players that treat people right. Every other philosophy comes second to that concept.

**What he looks for in a player...** Grit, toughness, a player who can make a play when things aren't going well. Every player that's ever played is a great team player when the team is winning and functioning well. But I want those kids that grit their teeth when things are stacked against them. Those are that can win you games and be difference makers.

# 2006-07 Women's Basketball Season Preview

The 2005-06 campaign saw a team that compiled a 4-24 record and struggled to compete throughout the year. The Bobcats lost some close games and also lost several games by large margins. However, they rebounded to win three conference games and ended up tied for 6th place in the MCAC.

With a new coach (Kevin Dobbs) and new philosophy, it may take this team some time to adjust to the up-tempo style of play and the large amount of new players on the roster. However, the Bobcats do return some players with good experience and might surprise some teams early on. "We have enough veterans that I am hoping to be competitive early," said Dobbs. "But Rome wasn't built in a day, so we'll have to learn patience and learn to stay the course."

#### The Veterans...

The corp of veterans is led by two seniors, Jennifer Epting (5'8" Senior - North Platte, NE) and Kara Lally (5'4" Senior - Sandy Creek, NE). The Bobcats also return Alison Hill (5'4" Junior - Lincoln), Ashley Grant (5'7" Sophomore-Wahoo), Leisha Tennal (5'8" Junior-Morrill, KS), Jenna Rempe (5'8" Junior - Wymore), Brandi Olberding (6'1" Sophomore-Falls City) and

Rachel Williams (6'1" Sophomore - Greeley, NE).

"We have some players with pretty good past statistics, led by Epting, Tennal and Hill. We are going to have to rely on their experience to guide our new players into the season. If their leadership is there, and our new players follow their lead, we believe that the ingredients are there to have a much more successful campaign."

#### The Newcomers...

The majority of the roster are 1st year players and will have to be ready to step up to the plate at an early stage. "It's funny, many high school players have the belief that the NAIA level of basketball is comparable to the 13th grade and they will be ready to step on the floor and be a factor. However, they find out quickly that the college level is an immense step up, in speed, intensity, effort and desire. So we'll see which freshman can step up and compete without the recommended experience."

Leading the impressive group of freshman are Alyssa Mangum (5'9" - Nebraska City), Rachel Bridges (5'9" - Fairmont), twins Lindsey and Laurie Carlson (5'6" - Hooper), P.J. Miller (5'9" - Omaha), Keri Ann Shimerdla (5'6" - Omaha), Ashley Kassik (5'8" - Milligan) and Lindsey Dannelly (5'6" - Howells).

"The freshman have already shown that they have a toughness that this program has needed and we hope they are ready to transfer that toughness to the floor. We will make our early season mistakes due to inexperience, but feel like by the time conference season rolls around, we will have a chance to really do some quality things and cause people some problems. We couldn't be more pleased with the nucleus of young players on this team and if they can find their niche, will cause many headaches for opponents in years to come."

#### The Outlook...

"We feel like the desire is there, the want to learn and get better already exists...however we need to find out if the desire is true. We don't promote making noise with your mouth, rather noise with your effort and performance, so if we can buckle down and walk the walk rather then talk the talk, we have a chance to be successful." said Dobbs. "I feel that Peru State is the perfect place to be for me at this point in my career and we have a few things to prove to people who think that we are the perennial doormat in NAIA basketball. Our doormat should not say 'welcome' as it has in the past....it should say 'beware' and that is what we are trying to get through to our players. We are not a staff that looks to build for next year, we want to work towards being competitive right now."





# Head Coach Dave Walker





Dave Walker begins his second year as the head men's basketball coach at Peru State. He also serves as Peru State's Sports Information Director and teaches in the Physical Education department. Walker, a native of Villard, MN, brings 26 years of coaching experience to Peru State including nineteen years at the high school level, six years as a college assistant and one year at the professional level.

Walker's high school experience includes stops at Karval, CO; Amboy, MN and Mapleton, MN. From 1988-1995, Walker's teams went 153-27 including a Minnesota Class A State Championship in 1993 and a return trip to the "Final 8" in 1994 when he also garnered Minnesota Class A "Coach of the Year "honors.

After a one year stint with the Minnesota Rockin' Rollers of the International Basketball Association (IBA) in 1996, where he served as General Manager/Coach, Walker entered graduate school at Minnesota State University-Mankato where he worked under successful head coach Dan McCarrell for two seasons. Walker then accepted the assistant basketball coaching position at Dakota State University in Madison, SD working with head Coach Tom Cameron for two additional years. Walker's final stop as an assistant coach was at Colby (KS) Community College where he teamed with Brian Ostermann, one of Walker's former high school players. The Trojans compiled a 50-11 record during that time.

Walker earned his B.S. Degree from Bemidji State University (1975) with a double major in Physical Education and Health. He gained his M.S. Degree from Minnesota State University-Mankato in Sport Management (1997,2001). Walker is also the Director of Triple Threat Basketball, a youth summer basketball camp program, and has directed over 60 camps in the five summers of operation throughout the upper Midwest.

Coach Walker has a son (Ryan) who was a member of the 05-06 Bobcat squad; and a daughter (Stephanie) who is an elementary teacher in Cyrus, MN. Stephanie and her husband Scott have one child, Ella (3) making Coach Walker a very proud "grandpa".

#### Coach Walker comments on...

□ The Bobcats... I'm excited about this team, the guys have worked very hard this fall and the team chemistry is very good. We □ are not a big, physical team however, we have excellent overall quickness and I think we will compete every night. We have a demand-□ ing schedule and will go through some growing pains together but I think we will be very competitive and toughened by the time we get □ □ into MCAC play.

" His philosophy... I believe the old saying that defense wins championships. The best teams that I have been associated with have all been defensively sound. Defense is all about mental toughness, desire and trust in your teammates. Offensively I prefer to use the full 94' of the court with transition and presses of various types. We will look to run but yet also be able to execute in the □ half court.

What he looks for in a player... I look for student -athletes that understand that first and foremost comes their education. Our players go to class, attend study tables and have as many academic demands placed on them as they do athletic demands. In addition, I want players that have a passion for this great game! The kind of kids that you have to chase out of the gym □ each night.

# Why Bobcats ???

Peru State athletic teams did not have a mascot until 1921. "Baldy" Wilcox, the sports editor of the Pedagogian, the school's newspaper, and Dean W.N. Delzell decided the pseudo-nickname given to Peru's teams, "The Teachers", was too feminine. Wilcox wanted a rip-snorting masculine name for Peru.

He thought of "Bears" but it reminded him too much of future teacher's hugs. Finally one night he jumped out of bed with a great inspiration: "Fight like a bobcat." He sprung it on the boys and they immediately voted for it. Thus the Bobcat became Peru's mascot.

Peru State, according to the Pedagogian, was the first team in the conference to have a live mascot. On October 27, 1927, Peru received a real-live Bobcat. The live Bobcat was a gift from George Hansen, Class of 1912. He offered the live bobcat to Dean Delzell who accepted the gift on behalf of the school.

"Bob" the Bobcat lived in a cage south of the Peru State Auditorium until his death in 1938. He was then preserved and sat in the student center for years.
