



Total Student Enrollment





School of Origin

Of new undergraduates 77% entered as freshmen, while 23% transferred in at a higher class level. Eighty-six percent of new freshmen students entered UCSB from public high schools; 13% graduated from private high schools. The majority of transfer students came from community colleges (91%); over a quarter of transfer students came from Santa Barbara City College alone (29%). Other transfer students came from other University of California campuses (3%), the California State University system (2%), and other 4-year colleges (4%).












Sixty-six percent of UCSB students received some form of financial aid through the university, including 60% of all undergraduates and 96% of all graduate students.




Of those funds received from non-federal sources, \$23.5 million are flow-through from federal sponsors. Thus, total federal funding is almost 82% of the award total.
