2006 PITT BASEBALL OUTLOOK

Four straight 30-win seasons and five in the past six years has Pitt baseball back on the map heading into 2006. All-America candidates **JIM NEGRYCH** and **BILLY MULDOWNNEY** return to anchor a team loaded with talent, making this Panther team a legitimate contender for the Big East title and a berth in the NCAA Championships.

An NCAA berth has eluded the Panthers since 1995, a fact not lost on head coach **JOE JORDANO**, who has guided Pitt to those five 30-win seasons and has 231 victories in eight years as the manager.

"Every game is important to earn that spot in the NCAA Championship field," Jordano said. "With the new schools competing in the Big East, our conference games are going to be that much more important."

With the addition of USF, Cincinnati and Louisville, the Big East has become a 12-team conference and certainly a more competitive league as well.

The Panthers finished 33-22 in 2005, winning 19 of their final 28 games and coming within one game of the Big East title and an NCAA berth. Pitt won two games in the Big East Championships, defeating St. John's 4-1 and Boston College 3-2 in 12 innings on a dramatic home run by Negrych.

Two losses to Notre Dame, however, kept the Panthers from advancing further into the postseason but it set the stage for the 2006 campaign. Seven of nine position starters return and six key pitchers from last year's staff are also back.

"I like the build of this team," Jordano said. "We have a solid combination of hitting, fielding and pitching that rivals the best teams in the east."

CATCHERS

Pitt has three catchers on the roster, but two will be newcomers to the Panther lineup. Returning starter **JEFF STEVENS** is back for his senior campaign after hitting six home runs and driving in 31 runs in 2005. Stevens played in 46 of Pitt's 55 games and should see most of the action behind the plate this year.

Joining Stevens behind the plate are freshman **MORGAN KIELTY** and senior walk-on **BRENDAN SCHUBERT**. Kielty is a solid defensive catcher and his ability to hit the ball should get him into the lineup at designated hitter as well as catcher.

Schubert is a local product out of Central Catholic High School, joining the Panthers for his first season as a walk-on.

"Both Jeff and Morgan will see time at catcher for us," Jordano said. "We have confidence in both guys' ability to help our pitching staff and to get it done with the bat."

INFELDERS

Three-quarters of the Pitt infield will be back starting again and the Panthers also have veteran options at the only open starting spot - first base.

Negrych, a junior second baseman, was voted the Big East Preseason Player of the Year for the second consecutive season, and earned All-America honors in 2005.

His 16 home runs and 59 RBIs led the Panthers and he finished with a solid .349 average. Thirty-one of his 65 hits went for extra bases and he stole 11 bases as well, giving Pitt a consistent weapon at the top of the batting order.

"Jim has the talent and the skills to perform even better than he did a year ago," Jordano said. "He's not only one of the best position players in the Big East but in the Northeast region."

Entering the 2006 season, Negrych is eighth in career batting average (.364), fifth in slugging percentage (.641), eighth in on-base percentage (.468), 13th in hits (141), 14th in runs scored (96), sixth in home runs (23), tied for fifth in doubles (34), ninth in RBIs (104), 10th in total bases (248) and eighth in walks with 77. With another All-America-type season, Negrych could find himself on top of many of those lists.

Also back is senior shortstop **JIMMY MAYER**. Mayer hit .317 in 2005 with nine doubles, 22 RBIs and 11 stolen bases. He started 43 of the 46 games he played in as a junior and will be counted on to provide even more offense in his final campaign.

"I think Jimmy is capable of having as good of a season, if not better, this year," Jordano said. "He'll certainly be counted on to get on base, score runs and drive in some runs for us."

The Panthers also welcome back starting third baseman **DAN WILLIAMS**, a sophomore from Berwyn, Pa. Williams started 43 games and played in 45 total, scoring 29 runs from the bottom of the order.

"If Dan can make some improvements in his swing and in his defense, we will become a more successful team right away," Jordano said. "He could have a breakthrough season if he continues to work hard."

The starting first baseman spot will be competed for by juniors **EDGARD SUCRE** and **SETH BUTTON**. Sucre has played in 48 games over his first two seasons with the Panthers, including 28 in 2005 as a sophomore. He had 15 starts at first base and posted a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage for Pitt.



Button joins the Panthers in 2006 from Gloucester College, where he earned NJCAA District Defensive Player of the Year honors and was named the MVP of the NJCAA Division III World Series.

"Seth has championship experience at the junior college level, so he'll push for playing time right away," Jordano said. "Edgard is a solid defensive first baseman and will see plenty of at-bats as well."

Other infielders competing for playing time include freshmen **ROB LAWLER** and **BRIAN MULDOWNNEY**. Lawler hails from Rochester, New York, where he attended Greece Olympia High School and played shortstop.

Muldowney is the younger brother of Pitt pitcher Billy Muldowney, and will see time as a backup middle infielder and as a designated hitter for the Panthers.

OUTFIELDERS

Despite the loss of All-America outfielder Ben Copeland, a draft pick of MLB's San Francisco Giants, the Panthers should be able to field one of the better threesomes in the conference.

Junior **PETER PARISE** is back after starting all 55 games in 2005. Parise finished with a .316 average, ranking second on the team with 67 hits, and third with 31 runs scored and 40 RBIs. He also stole five bases and had 14 extra-base hits.

"Peter is a great ballplayer," Jordano said. "He hits the ball well and hard to all fields and also plays right field as good as anyone in the region."

Parise had just one error a year ago and has just four in 160 chances over his first two seasons.

2006 PITT BASEBALL OUTLOOK

Senior **DAVID CLINE** will man center field after starting 40 games a year ago. Cline hit .268 with 32 runs scored and 21 RBIs. A solid threat on the basepaths, Cline finished second on the Panthers with 17 stolen bases in 21 attempts.

Most of his work came as a designated hitter in 2005 so he will be counted on to replace Copeland in the center of the outfield.

"David was able to gain valuable experience last season," Jordano said. "He needs to build on that experience and be a defensive asset for us in center."

Left field will most likely be filled by sophomore **SEAN CONLEY**. Conley played in 52 games as a freshman, starting 49 of them and making just one error in 82 chances.

Conley was a solid hitting option, connecting for a .299 average with 26 RBIs and stole 13 bases as well.

"Sean was under the radar as a freshman but he is poised to have a breakthrough year," Jordano said. "He's got all the tools to be a good leadoff hitter - the ability to put the ball in play, get on base and speed."

Sophomore transfer **CHRIS WARNER** would have certainly competed as well for playing time but an offseason injury will keep him out for the entire 2006 campaign. Warner joins the Panthers from the University of South Carolina of the SEC.

Junior **MIKE MUZEKA** switches from the infield to provide depth for the Panthers in the outfield and will be joined by redshirt freshman **ERIC CHAMNESS** and freshman **MATT LITZINGER**.

Muzeka has seen action in 13 contests over his first two seasons but Chamness and Litzinger will be competing for the first time at the collegiate level. Chamness is from West Chester East High School, where he was a teammate of both Billy and Brian Muldowney. Litzinger played high school ball at nearby Serra Catholic, becoming the first Division I player from that school in over a decade.

PITCHERS

The Panthers' pitching staff will be one of their major strengths with three capable starters and solid relief to keep opponents off the scoreboard.

Leading the way is junior Billy Muldowney. The 2006 Preseason Big East Pitcher of the Year earned all-conference honors a year ago, finishing 7-3 with a 2.47 earned-run average. In a team-high 83.2 innings pitched, Muldowney struck out 89 batters and only allowed 19 walks.

Even more impressive was that all seven of Muldowney's victories came against Big East opponents. He was 7-1 with 61 strikeouts in 56.2 conference innings.



"Billy is the ace of our staff," Jordano said. "He came up with his top performances when we needed him the most last year."

The Panthers' No. 2 starter will be sophomore **ROB BRANT**, a freshman All-American in 2005. Brant also won a team-best seven games, finishing 7-2 with a team-low 2.07 ERA.

In 61 innings of work, Brant allowed just 47 hits and 23 walks while striking out 68 batters. Hitters managed only a .210 average against the rookie and like Muldowney, Brant's numbers were even better in the Big East.

He was 4-1 in six appearances against Big East opponents, allowing just six earned runs in 34.2 innings (1.56 ERA) while striking out 34 batters.

"Rob is our top lefty starter and with Billy [Muldowney], gives us two quality starters with a lot of experience on the mound," Jordano said. "You add Paul [Nardozi] and we're going to be tough to score against on the weekend."

Junior **PAUL NARDOZZI** has two years of experience as a starter on the Pitt staff, pitching in 29 games and starting 25 of them in 2004 and 2005.

He won six games as a freshman and has 10 total victories heading into his junior campaign. Last year, he struck out 66 batters in 62.2 innings, giving the Panthers three starting pitchers that averaged more than nine strikeouts per nine innings.

"Paul has given us a lot of quality starts over the past two years and gives us three guys that know how to get batters out," Jordano said.

Senior **SHAUN BUTLER** pitched in 18 games as a junior in 2005 after joining the Panthers from Gulf Coast Community College. He earned three victories and led the team with four saves.

In 45.2 innings, Butler struck out 45 batters and picked up his first Big East victory in a 6-1 win over Boston College on May 9 to give the Panthers a win in the three-game series at Chestnut Hill.

Converted infielder **JUSTIN CICATELLO** gives the Panthers a solid bullpen option. The submarine-throwing righty pitched in four games as a junior, striking out four batters in four innings.

Junior left-hander **MIKE BASSAGE** has made 21 pitching appearances in his first two years with the Panthers, striking out 33 batters in 35.2 career innings pitched. He should be counted on as one of Pitt's top lefties in the bullpen in 2006.

A pleasant surprise to the 2005 Panthers was **CHAD BAKER**, who made seven pitching appearances with three starts. Baker was 2-0 with a 2.45 ERA, allowing just 15 hits in 22 innings with 21 strikeouts.

Two Pitt hurlers will see their first collegiate action after redshirting in 2005. Right-handers **KYLE LANDIS** and **ANTHONY ROSSI** will serve as spot starters, as well as see some time out of the bullpen for Jordano's 2006 squad.

Newcomers competing for time on the mound include junior college transfer **BOBBY BELL**, junior walk-on **MAX ZINGLE** and freshman lefty **ALEX OLES**. Also capable of throwing a few innings for the Panthers is Parise, a hard-throwing right-hander.

THE SCHEDULE

Pitt opens the 2006 season taking on Coastal Carolina, a 2005 NCAA Championships participant, and George Mason. Other non-conference games include Boston College in a rematch of the 2005 Big East Championship semifinal in which Negrych connected on a walk-off home run to defeat the Eagles.

The Panthers will compete at the Music City Classic against SEC power Vanderbilt and travel to Winter Park, Fla., for Rollins College's 'Baseball Week.'

In addition to local rivals Duquesne, Cleveland State and Akron, the Panthers will take on Penn State at Falconi Field in Washington, Pa., on April 5. Falconi Field is the home of the Washington Wild Things of the Frontier League.

The Panthers were picked to finish second in the competitive Big East Conference, behind 2005 champion Notre Dame. Pitt is slated to visit Notre Dame for a three-game series March 31-April 2.

HEAD COACH JOE JORDANO



T rue to his word, Pitt baseball head coach Joe Jordano has brought success back to a program with a long tradition of winning. Part of what Jordano has done is bringing top-notch players to the University of Pittsburgh, but part of it is also his ability to get the most out of each member of his teams.

Four consecutive 30-win seasons heading into the 2006 campaign have brought an enthusiasm when discussing the Panthers' baseball squad. So far this decade, Jordano has led Pitt to 30 victories on five occasions in six years and compiled an overall record of 182-127.

The second winningest coach in Pitt baseball history and also the second winningest current head coach at the University of Pittsburgh, Jordano guided the Panthers to a 33-22 record a year ago and to the Big East Championship title game vs. Notre Dame.

Entering the tournament as the fourth seed, Pitt upset No. 1 seed St. John's, 4-1, in its first contest. After dropping a close game to Notre Dame the following day, the Panthers won a dramatic 3-2, 12-inning game over Boston College on a walk-off home run by Jim Negrych. Pitt was just one victory away from its fourth NCAA regional appearance - something Jordano sees happening very soon.

"We've enjoyed success the past several years in this program," Jordano said. "I think we're ready to achieve even more, both in the Big East and at the national level."

Not only have Jordano's Pitt teams been successful, but the individuals that make up the team have broken numerous school records and moved on to play professional baseball on a yearly basis.

Outfielder Ben Copeland became the 15th Panther to sign a contract to play professional baseball when he was drafted by MLB's San Francisco Giants in the fourth round - Pitt's highest selection since Chris Jelic went to the Kansas City Royals in the second round of the 1985 draft.

From 2002-05, Jordano has put together the best four-year winning stretch in the program's 96-year history, capturing a total of 143 wins, including 36, 36, 38 and 33 last year. The 38 wins in 2004 tied for the second-most victories in a single season. The accolades have been plentiful in that same time span.

Seven Panthers have been named All-Americans or Freshman All-Americans since 2002, four have earned All-Region honors and 17 have been named to the All-Big East teams. In addition to Jordano being named the 2004 Coach of the Year, P.J. Hiser was named Player of the Year, Nick Evangelista was named Co-Pitcher of the Year and Jim Negrych was named Rookie of the Year that season.

"Playing in the Big East tournament the past two seasons, we're getting closer to our goal to win a conference title," Jordano said. "These past few seasons have been a remarkable turnaround from where the program was at."

HEAD COACH JOE JORDANO

Over the course of Jordano's career, 24 players have played professional baseball, in addition to 11 All-Americans and countless All-Conference and All Region selections.

Jordano's overall record of 514-299-2 (.632) ranks him 32nd among active Division-I coaches.

In 2003, Pittsburgh fell just short of making the conference tournament but was well represented on the Big East's All-Conference teams. The Panthers finished with a 36-18 mark. Three players earned all-league status, marking the second of what is now four straight years the Panthers have inked at least three players on the list.

The 2002 season was one to remember as well. Although they narrowly missed a berth in the Big East Tournament and possibly an NCAA at-large selection, the Panthers went down to the final out of the season before settling for an impressive 36-16 record.

"That 2002 season was the culmination of a five-year plan to bring respectability and solid foundation to our program," Jordano said.

It wasn't an easy project from the onset. The date of his hiring alone made it a difficult start. Coupling with the late start and the fact that the Panthers made a rapid fall from its last Big East title in 1995, Jordano had a huge undertaking before him.

Hired on November 15, 1997, Jordano and his staff battled through a 12-win season, but quickly went out and made an impression with incoming recruits and more victories soon followed.

"That first year was tough, but we worked hard to lay the foundation for what we expected and what the future would hold for our team members," Jordano said.

With a roster full of newcomers, the Panthers made a dramatic improvement finishing with a 27-27 record in 1999. The following season, the Panthers were poised for a run at the Big East playoffs. In the bottom of the ninth inning on the final day of the regular season, the Panthers needed a win to get to the Big East Tournament. Trailing 5-2, the Panthers scored three to tie Boston College and then went on to win in extra innings, earning their first trip to the playoffs in five seasons. Pitt finished the year with a 31-24 mark, the most successful year since 1995.

In three short seasons and only two years behind the baseball desk, Jordano had the Panthers in position for continued success.

"I felt very good about the progress we made in our second [1999] and third [2000] seasons," Jordano said. "Not many teams can say they went from 12 wins to 31 wins in that short of time while competing in one of the toughest conferences in the country. I was proud of our guys and how they played the game the right way. We played hard."

After an injury-riddled 2001 campaign that saw the Panthers win just 18 games, Jordano made the most of it, instead of getting bogged down in negativity.

JORDANO ON ACADEMICS...

"Simply stated, we are in the education business. It is at the core of what we do. Each of our players understand coming in that our academic efforts are equally as important as our athletic ones. We have created an environment that is conducive to success in the classroom and will always be committed to achieving the ultimate goal — that every player will receive his degree from the University of Pittsburgh."



Entering his fifth year, Jordano was very optimistic. It would be the first class that consisted of all his players. The Panthers put up some impressive numbers. After starting the season at 10-3-1, the Panthers earned their highest ever national ranking — No. 32 in the NCBWA [National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Poll].

During the course of the year, the Panthers broke several individual and team records. Brad Rea became the most-prolific hitter in history; the team set a Big East regular-season win mark with 14; and the second most wins in school history with 36, all of which were eclipsed in 2004.

That trend of rebuilding has been a trait of Jordano in his coaching career. His first position was at Mercyhurst College in Erie, Pa. An NCAA Division II school that did not have a strong baseball tradition and inheriting a team that won only nine games the previous season, the success began immediately and did not stop for 10 seasons.

During his 10-year reign, Jordano's numbers speak for themselves: 283 wins against only 118 losses; six post-season appearances; two conference championships in his two years in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference; 30 All-Region players; four All-Americans; and several players in professional baseball.

JORDANO ON RECRUITING...

"We are very focused in our recruiting. We want individuals who are completely committed to becoming the best player and student possible. We are attracting a great quality player and will continue to secure individuals who are equally committed to achieving excellence both on and off the field, and will accept nothing less. We are confident that if a player chooses Pitt, he will never regret that decision."

Upon leaving Mercyhurst, Coach Jordano was the winningest coach in Mercyhurst College history and was ranked sixth all-time active winningest coaches in the DII baseball history.

Jordano was also named the GLIAC Coach of the Year twice and was the Louisville Slugger NCAA DII Independent Coach of the year in 1995.

In his last four years at Mercyhurst, Jordano's teams finished with a remarkable 128-31 record with four consecutive NCAA regional appearances. He also served on the NCAA DII National Baseball Committee and served as the chairman of the North Central Baseball Region.

Jordano has been honored by groups over the past several years for his contributions to baseball. In 2003, he was named "Baseball Man of the Year" in Erie, Pa. — his hometown, for "appreciation for his Lifetime support and devotion to baseball on the local and collegiate levels".

Following the 2004 season and the Big East Coach of the Year award, Jordano was recognized by the Team Pittsburgh Group of Erie and was also awarded an Honorary Lifetime membership to the San Francisco Bay Area Pitt Club.

Jordano received his bachelor's degree from Westminster College, where he was a stellar four-year letterwinner and All-District performer in baseball for the Titans. He also obtained his master's degree in Athletic Administration from Slippery Rock University.

Coach Jordano resides in Cranberry Township with his wife, Michell, and sons Matthew [7] and Joseph [6].

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH JOEL DOMBKOWSKI

Joel Dombkowski is in his ninth season at Pittsburgh and his 14th as part of Head Coach Joe Jordano's staff, dating back to when he assisted Jordano at Mercyhurst. For his hard work and dedication to the Panthers' baseball program, Dombkowski was promoted to Associate Head Coach for Pittsburgh in 2004. Dombkowski's primary responsibilities includes offensive instruction and working with the outfielders.

"I was very pleased to promote Joel to the position of associate head coach for our baseball team," Jordano said. "It is a well-deserved honor and it is a testament to his outstanding coaching ability and his loyalty to the University of Pittsburgh."

The Panthers' offense has improved dramatically over the past couple of years thanks in large part to Dombkowski. Over the past two seasons, numerous season and career records have been shattered as P.J. Hiser, Ben Copeland and Jim Negrych have all enjoyed All-America caliber seasons. Additionally, Dombkowski helped guide Hiser earn Big East Player of the Year, Jim Negrych to the Big East Rookie of the Year honor, and to All-America hype for both, as well as Copeland.

In 2004, the Panthers had a school-record six All-Big East selections and broke the Pitt record for number of Major League Baseball draftees, including Hiser (Cleveland Indians), Nick Evangelista (Philadelphia Phillies) and T.J. Gornati (San Francisco Giants). Also, Bryan Spamer broke the school's all-time hits record, finishing with 250. Last season, Copeland broke the Pitt single-season record for hits with 84, runs scored with 65, doubles (23), triples (10) and total bases (154).

At age 27, he began his career at Pitt as one of the youngest Division-1 assistant coaches in the country.

"What I believe in is quality work, physical and mental preparation, and a high level of energy every day," said Dombkowski.

In 2002, the Panthers boasted impressive numbers as they captured the Big East home run, doubles and stolen base titles while finishing second in hits. In addition, Dombkowski has helped seven former Panthers continue their careers in the professional ranks including Joe Lydic from Bethel Park (drafted in the 7th round by the Houston Astros in 2000), Brant Colamarino (hit 19 homeruns tying a then-Panthers all-time single season record while being drafted in the 7th round by the Oakland Athletics in 2002) and Brad Rea (broke the Panthers career hits and home run records while earning third team All-American honors). Rea signed with the Pittsburgh Pirates in the spring of 2003.

"I believe that the caliber of athlete we are getting here at the University of Pittsburgh will put us into a position to win a championship," said Dombkowski.

Prior to joining Pittsburgh, Dombkowski served on Jordano's staff at Mercyhurst College from 1992-1997. During his tenure there, Dombkowski helped coach the Lakers to five consecutive NCAA Regional appearances while capturing two straight Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference titles.

Dombkowski also began his own playing career under Jordano's direction at Mercyhurst and was a standout catcher for the Lakers. He earned All-Region honors twice and led the Lakers to two playoff berths in 1989 (ECAC) and 1991 (NCAA). Upon his graduation, Dombkowski made the quick transition to the coaching ranks by joining Jordano on the coaching staff.

"Joel is an integral part of our program," Jordano said. "He has orchestrated our offensive efforts and has great instincts for the game on and off the field."

A 1991 Mercyhurst graduate, Dombkowski earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice and his master's in administration of justice, also at Mercyhurst.

Dombkowski, 36, is a native of Erie, Pa., and currently resides in Pittsburgh. Dombkowski and his wife, Leigh Ann Gulla, have a two-year-old son Zachary Thomas.

Sean Moran joins the Panthers from Delaware State, where he served as hitting coach, infield coach and recruiting coordinator for the Hornets in 2004 and 2005. Under his guidance, the Hornets led the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) in hitting both seasons and advanced to the MEAC Championship game in 2004, the school's first in 10 years.

Prior to his two-year stint with Delaware State, Moran served Marist College in the same three capacities. In 2001, Moran was the Red Foxes' infield coach and helped the team qualify for the NCAA Regionals. Additionally, the Red Foxes led the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) in fielding percentage.

The following year, Moran was named the recruiting coordinator in addition to his infield coaching duties and helped the Red Foxes to a No. 3 seed at the Nebraska NCAA Regional. Marist won a school-record 41 games in 2002 and again led the MAAC in fielding percentage.

In 2003, Moran had another responsibility added as hitting coach and the Red Foxes had a school-record four MLB draft picks. During his three-year tenure at Marist, four players were named All-Americans.

His coaching career began at Dominican College in 1999 and 2000, where he served as hitting coach, infield coach and recruiting coordinator. He helped Dominican to the 1999 NAIA World Series, a Northeast Region championship, and a Central Atlantic Athletic Association (CAAA) title.

In all, Moran has coached 17 players that have moved on to play professional baseball, including six infielders. Moran played college ball at Mercy from 1995-98.

Moran will hold the same responsibilities with the Panthers, as infield and hitting coach and helping with Pitt's recruiting efforts.



Kirk Bruce
ASSISTANT ATHLETIC DIRECTOR/OLYMPIC SPORTS

Kirk Bruce is in his eighth year as assistant athletic director for Olympic sports, but his association with the university dates back much further. In his current capacity, Bruce oversees the day-to-day operations of Pittsburgh's Olympic sports.

Bruce previously served as the Panthers' head women's basketball coach for 13 years from 1985-1998. His coaching career was highlighted by the 1992-93 season in which the Panthers produced just their third 20-win season (21-10) and finished third in the Women's National Invitation Tournament. Bruce coached numerous Big East All-Conference players and two Kodak All-American honorable mention players in Jonna Huemrich and Lorri Johnson during his tenure.

A standout point guard at Pittsburgh from 1971-75, Bruce was a member of the Panthers' 1974 team that finished 25-4 and advanced to the NCAA East Regional finals. He was drafted by the Utah Stars of the former American Basketball Association (ABA). When the league disbanded, he returned to Pittsburgh to begin his coaching career as an assistant for the Panthers. Bruce was later promoted to the head women's coaching position prior to the 1985-86 season.

Bruce and his wife Marleen have three daughters, Chelsea (23), Carmen (20) and Courteney (18).

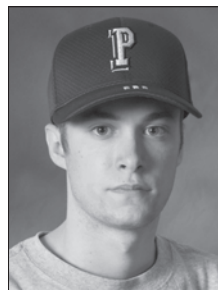

Trees Field...

Located behind the Cost Center with a striking view of the downtown skyline is Trees Field, home of the Pittsburgh Panther baseball team. Prior to the 1999 season, the park underwent a renovation worth over \$500,000, including the installation of a brand new major league-caliber astroturf infield and lights. In addition, two all-purpose astroturf fields adjoin Trees Field allowing for an additional practice area.



Home of the Panthers... Fitzgerald Field House Locker Room

The Pittsburgh baseball team uses a spacious locker room facility, located in Fitzgerald Field House. Added in 1999, the locker room includes pro-style individual wooden lockers and audio-visual systems for exclusive use by the Panthers. The new locker rooms provide an impressive home for all Pitt athletes.

Additionally, the locker room provides easy access to a new state-of-the-art Olympic Sports Weight Room and equipment room.



Charles L. Cost Sports Center...

One of the newest facilities at the University of Pittsburgh is the Cost Sports Center. This indoor facility is the practice arena for the baseball team during inclement weather and was recently refurbished with new astroturf. The team uses it for workouts, especially batting practice, and to host winter DIAMOND BASEBALL CLINICS. The Cost Center is large enough to house a regulation football field or nine tennis courts. The facility was named after former running back Charles L. Cost, who donated more than \$1 million for its construction.
