SPORTING REGULATIONS - AMENDMENT****REFERENCE:**

RATIONALE:

Changes to the 2008 Sporting & Technical Regulations as requested by the Category Manager including an adjustment to signage in area 11, the addition of a Vehicle Performance sheet, a licence holders list and an alteration to the points system based on Divisions not classes

AUTHORITY:

These amendments to the regulations have been approved by the Australian Motor Racing Commission.

ACTION:

- S.3.1.2** Table 1, TCM Performance sheet, details the vehicle model, minimum weight, maximum revs and maximum tyre sizes allowed.
- S4.1.2** A licence holder list, Appendix B attached, details class and nominated division for the purpose of clarifying series points and awards as detailed in Section 7.
- S7.1** **Series Races and Points.**

The **Division** ~~Class~~ winners of the Series will be the Drivers who amass the greatest number of points from their best seven (7) round results of the Series for each **division** class. In the instance that a driver changes division ~~class~~ during the season, **division** class points will only ~~accrue~~ **be awarded** in the class in which they were gained. **for the one division most run, and other division points will be dropped.**

S7.2 **Points per Race.**

(1) —The points for each race will be awarded as follows based on ~~OUTRIGHT~~ **Division** positions;

(2) The points for each race will be awarded as follows based on CLASS positions;

Points in the instance that a race is not run or is red flagged prior to enough laps having been run to call it a full race, points will be awarded on an average of the points scored from the other 2 races.,

In the event that we have 4 races the last 3 races run will be the races that accumulate points. If all 4 races are run then points will be accumulated from races 2, 3 & 4.

S7.3 Tied Scores.

In the event of a “tie” at the end of the Series for any position, the final positions will be determined by a “count-back” of highest results achieved by the Drivers involved in each round of the Series.

S7.4 Classes Divisions per Round.

Any ~~class~~ **division** that has less than three (3) entries at any round will be amalgamated with the next capacity ~~class~~ division above it.

S7.5 Awards


S7.5.1 Driver awards per round will be presented to the first three (3) place getters outright in each ~~class~~ **division** providing there are sufficient ~~competitors~~ **division numbers** in the round of the Series. Additional awards per round may be made at the discretion of the Series Administrator.

S7.5.2 Driver Series Awards will be presented to the first three (3) place getters outright in the ~~race s~~**Series** providing there are sufficient division numbers at each round of the Series and have competed in at least three (3) rounds of the Series. Additional awards may be made at the discretion of the Series Administrator

Appendix A

Signage locations for Biante Touring Car Masters:

- **Area 11:** *Entrant or Sponsor logo (optional, max size in area 600cm² ie. 300mm x 200mm,). **Due to the position of signage on certain vehicles being impractical, the location may be either behind the headlight or at the rear of the front guard as approved by the Category Manager.***



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
