1957

NC State won its initial ACC gridiron crown with a 5-0-1 record, finishing a half-game ahead of Duke, which faltered in its bid for the league title losing to North Carolina 21-13 in the Blue Devils' season finale ... The Wolfpack, due to NCAA infractions in basketball, were unable to take part in post-season play ... Duke, 6-2-2 during the regular season, represented the ACC in the 23rd Orange Bowl, losing to Oklahoma, 48-21 ... For the first time, the ACC had three teams ranked in a season's final poll as Duke, Clemson and NC State earned listings in the UPI poll ... Clemson quarterback Harvey White, the ACC's total offense and passing leader, was named to the Academic All-America squad.

Clemson, despite a mid-season setback to arch-rival South Carolina, won its second ACC title in three years with a 5-1 mark ... The Gamecocks, 5-2 and 15th in the AP poll, were second ... Duke lost three games by a total of seven points ... Clemson's Frank Howard claimed his 100th career victory with a 26-21 decision over North Carolina, September 27 ... North Carolina finished 6-4 to post back-to-back winning seasons for the first time since 1948-1949 ... Clemson lost 7-0 to top-ranked Louisiana State in the 25th annual Sugar Bowl ... Virginia's Sonny Randle led the nation in kickoff returns with 506 yards on 21 returns ... NC State's Bill Rearick was an Academic All-American ... Dick Voris of Virginia was the league's lone rookie coach.

1961

Duke won its second straight ACC title and fifth overall, finishing with a 5-1 record, losing only to third-place Clemson ... North Carolina finished second edging Maryland when the Terps lost their season finale to Virginia, 28-16 ... Earlier, the Cavaliers snapped an 18-game ACC losing streak with a 28-20 win over South Carolina ... NC State's Dennis Kroll was an Academic All-American ... The ACC posted its best record against non-league foes in the 1960's, despite having only two teams, Duke and Maryland, posting winning records ... Terp wide receiver Gary Collins, the ACC's leading receiver with 30 catches for 428 yards and four TDs, was a consensus All-American ... First-year head coaches were Virginia's Bill Elias and Marvin Bass at South Carolina.

Duke won an unprecedented third-straight ACC title, posting the conference's first-ever 6-0 league mark in the process ... Clemson (5-1) was second, while Maryland (5-2) finished third ... Virginia ended its season with a 41-0 victory over Rutgers, and posted its first .500 season in 10 years ... Academic All-American honors were accorded to Virginia QB Gary Cuozzo, who passed for 1,136 yards and North Carolina center Joe Craver ... Wake's Donnie Frederick led the nation in kickoff returns averaging 22.8 yards on 29 returns ... No ACC team was listed in the final AP ranking for the first time since the poll started in 1936.

1963

North Carolina and NC State, a combined 6-13-1 in 1962, tied for the 1963 conference crown with 6-1 records ... The Tar Heels beat the Wolfpack, 31-10, but lost to Clemson, 11-7 ... Duke and Clemson, both 5-2, tied for second ... For the first time in its history, the ACC had two teams, North Carolina and NC State, earn bowl bids ... The Tar Heels, 3-7 a year earlier and making their first bowl appearance since 1950, trounced Air Force, 35-0, in the Gator Bowl, while the Wolfpack, 3-6-1 the previous fall, and playing in the post-season for the first time in 17 years, dropped a 16-12 decision to Mississippi State in the Liberty Bowl ... North Carolina QB Junior Edge and NC State's Joe Scarpati were Academic All-Americans.

For the seventh time in conference history and the second time in the 1990's, the ACC featured co-champions as **Florida State** and **Georgia Tech** tied with 7-1 league marks ... the title was the seventh for the Seminoles and the second for the Yellow Jackets ... for the second straight year, the ACC had two teams in the Top 10 of the final 1998 AP poll in Florida State (3) and Georgia Tech (9) ... five of the league's nine teams were ranked at least one week in the AP poll ... five ACC teams were featured in post-season bowl games including Florida State's 16-23 loss to Tennessee in the Fiesta Bowl ... in bowl game action, North Carolina defeated San Diego State 20-13 in the Las Vegas Bowl, while Georgia Tech marched from behind to collect a 35-28 victory over Notre Dame in the Gator Bowl ... NC State faced Miami in the Micron PC Bowl dropping a 46-23 decision and Virginia fell to Georgia in the Peach Bowl 35-33 ... 2001

For the first time in league history, the ACC had six teams participate in bowl games as Maryland, Florida State, North Carolina, Georgia Tech, NC State and Clemson earned bowl berths ... **Maryland** claimed its first ACC football title since 1985, and ninth overall, finishing the regular season 10-1 overall and 7-1 in league play ... an all-time high seven ACC teams posted winning records in 2001, including four teams with eight wins or more and six with seven or more victories ... Maryland junior LB E.J. Henderson was named both ACC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year while Terp tailback Bruce Perry was ACC Offensive Player of the Year ... Florida State QB Chris Rix was the league's top rookie while Maryland's Ralph Friedgen was a unanimous selection as ACC Coach of the Year ... Friedgen, the first coach in league history to win the ACC football title in his first year at a school, was also a consensus choice for National Coach of the Year ... eleven ACC players earned All-America honors in 2001, including three first team selections ... two ACC players - Maryland's Henderson and UNC's Julius Peppers - were consensus All-Americans ... Peppers became the fourth ACC player to win the Vince Lombardi Award as the nation's top college lineman and the league's first player to capture the Chuck Bednarik Award as the nation's top defensive player ... Clemson's Woodrow Dantzler became the first player in NCAA history to rush for 1,000 yards and throw for 2,000 yards in the same season.

Florida State claimed its 12th ACC title in 14 years with a 27-22 victory over Virginia Tech in the inaugural ACC Title Game, played in Jacksonville, Fla. ... a league-record eight teams earned bowl bids in 2005 ... the ACC was 13-9 (.591) against BCS conference opponents with seven different teams recording BCS wins during the season ... Virginia Tech headed up a group of five ACC teams ranked in both the final AP and Coaches' polls ... the 12 league teams drew a league-record 3,835,260 over 73 games, including 72,749 in the ACC title game ... for the 13th consecutive year Florida State led the ACC in attendance, averaging 82,724 fans per game ... Wake Forest's Chris Barclay was selected by the league's media as the ACC Player of the Year after leading the ACC in rushing with 1,127 yards and 10 touchdowns ... Maryland linebacker D'Qwell Jackson was named the 2005 ACC Defensive Player of the Year while Clemson tailback James Davis was named ACC Rookie of the Year ... Virginia Tech head coach Frank Beamer was voted the league's Coach of the Year for the second straight season ...
