The University of Illinois at Chicago is a major research university located in the heart of one of the world's great cities. UIC provides a first-rate education for its students and is committed to creating and disseminating new knowledge as a university of national and international stature. UIC has more than 24,000 students, 15 colleges, including the nation's largest medical school, and annual external research funding of more than \$200 million.

UIC's hallmark is its Great Cities Commitment through which UIC faculty, staff and students engage in hundreds of programs with community, corporate, government and civic partners to improve the quality of life in Chicago and other cities around the world.

With 110 buildings on more than 240 acres, UIC has transformed its campus environment with the south campus project, which includes housing for more than 1,500 students, new retail establishments, parking facilities and athletics fields.

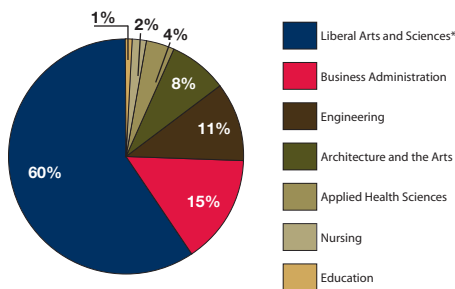


- Approximately one in six Illinois physicians is a graduate of the UIC College of Medicine.

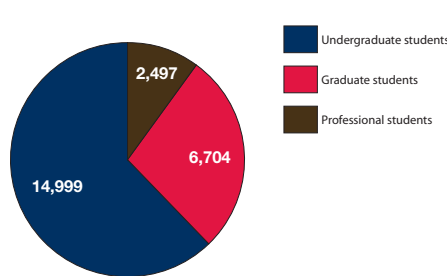

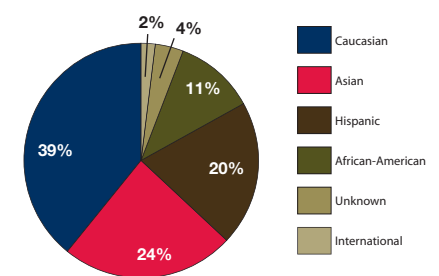

Students

UIC's student body is recognized as one of the nation's most diverse. The university considers the diversity of its student body among its greatest strengths. The growing numbers of students attracted to UIC reflect the global character of Chicago.

Faculty

At UIC, 75 percent of tenured faculty members teach undergraduate courses. Eighty-three percent of UIC's full-time instructional faculty members have earned a PhD or equivalent degree in their field.

Technology

UIC's 23 computer labs are equipped with the latest software and printers. Students can log on to any computer on the UIC campus. Wireless access at UIC is continually expanding, and most public spaces are wireless-accessible. All student residence halls are wired for Internet use and equipped with wireless accessibility.

UIC offers extensive academic and student support services, through which students meet mentors, receive help with classes and connect with friends. Some of these offices and services include:

In addition, UIC offers centers where students can get help with class assignments. The Writing Center, Science Learning Center and Mathematical Sciences Learning Center offer peer-to-peer tutoring services for UIC students throughout the academic year.

Career Services

The Office of Career Services assists UIC students and recent graduates in career planning and preparation for lifetime success. Career services professionals have information on part-time employment, full-time career opportunities and graduate school programs. They maintain relationships with regional employers to promote the employment of UIC students and graduates.

Campus Housing and Dining

Ten residence halls house UIC students on campus. In addition, approximately 6,000 UIC students live within 1.5 miles of campus in the surrounding neighborhoods of Greektown, Little Italy and Pilsen.

The UIC area has no shortage of great places to eat. A student meal plan card can be used at on-campus restaurants like Sbarro, Wendy's, Subway and multiple cafeterias. UIC's south side of campus offers many options for students looking to dine out, including Lalo's Mexican Restaurant, Caribou Coffee and Cold Stone Creamery. Likewise, some of Chicago's finest Greek and Italian restaurants are only blocks away, in the nearby Greektown and Taylor Street neighborhoods.

Student Life

UIC's more than 180 student organizations are an important part of life on campus. Through involvement in clubs and organizations, UIC students learn to work together in a diverse environment, develop into well-rounded individuals and acquire leadership skills for the future.

Athletics

The UIC Flames compete in 18 Division I sports as members of the Horizon League. The school colors are red and blue, as worn by UIC mascot Sparky D. Dragon. Men's teams compete in baseball, basketball, cross country, track and field, gymnastics, soccer, swimming, diving and tennis. Women's teams compete in basketball, cross country, track and field, gymnastics, softball, swimming, diving, tennis and volleyball.



Recreation Facilities

UIC's new Student Recreation Facility is located on the east side of campus. The facility includes a 42-foot climbing wall and a leisure pool with a lazy river. The fitness floor overlooking downtown Chicago is complete with treadmills, elliptical trainers, bikes, stair climbers, rowing machines, cable motion equipment, free-weights, an indoor track and basketball courts.

The hub of recreational activity on the west side of campus is the Sport and Fitness Center, located adjacent to the Student Center West. The facility houses an 8,000-square-foot fitness floor with cardiovascular equipment, a running track and a six-lane swimming pool.

Sport Clubs

For students interested in intramural athletic and sport clubs, UIC has 20 intramural events each semester. UIC also has 18 clubs that compete in rugby, martial arts, volleyball, water polo, soccer, dance, ultimate Frisbee, boxing and more.

Tuition

Student tuition, on average, for the 2007-2008 academic year is \$5,700 per semester for undergraduate Illinois residents and \$11,900 per semester for out-of-state students. Tuition differentials vary depending on academic programs. On-campus housing costs are additional and vary based on specific room and meal plan. Financial Aid and Scholarships

Last year, UIC students were awarded more than \$118 million in financial aid, including \$42 million in loans and work study, and \$58 million in scholarships and grants.

Seventy-seven percent of students who applied for financial aid were awarded need-based scholarship or grant aid.



OPPORTUNITIES FOR EXCEPTIONAL STUDENTS

The UIC **Honors College** is home to 1,400 students. In the past, UIC honors students have won many prestigious awards including Rhodes, Truman, Gates-Cambridge and Goldwater Scholarships, as well as Fulbright and Phi Beta Kappa Graduate Fellowships.

Honors students benefit from advisers, a computer lab and a study lounge dedicated to support students' academic goals. With a low student-to-Faculty Fellow ratio, honors students have the opportunity to build one-on-one relationships with faculty and advising staff members.

Through UIC's **Guaranteed Professional Program Admissions** initiative, a select group of incoming UIC freshmen are admitted to undergraduate programs with the guarantee of admission to their choice of professional programs. GPPA students follow a specific curriculum and meet established performance criteria to maintain their guarantee.

With the security of admission to a professional program, GPPA students can focus on undergraduate studies and explore diverse subject areas, without worrying about the pressure of the graduate school application process.

UIC's **Office of Special Scholarship Programs** assists students in applying for nationally competitive scholarships. OSSP provides students with information about available awards, advice on application preparation and assistance throughout the scholarship application process.
