At the gathering of the First African Leadership Conference on Space Science and Technology for Sustainable Development held in Abuja, Nigeria, from  $23^{rd} - 25^{th}$  of November 2005, four African Alumni of the International Space University, France, "ISU": Messrs Peter Martinez, Tare Brisibe, Ola Abraham and Ayodele Faiyetole resolved to work towards the establishment of the ISU African Alumni Association, "ISU-AA".
