NEW MEXICO ENDS MEMORABLE YEAR IN NCAA FIRST ROUND

Saturday, November 24---NCAA FIRST ROUND at UCLA

UCLA 1, New Mexico 0

NEW MEXICO made its fourth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament this past Saturday night, and sixth in the last seven years, coming up just short of UCLA 1-0 in the opening round at Drake Stadium in Los Angeles, CA. The Bruins scored the game-winner on a free kick with just 1:39 remaining in regulation. Senior goalkeeper **Mike Graczyk** picked up two first half saves and finished the year with 43. He also finishes his Lobo career with a school-record 30 shutouts, six of which came this year. Graczyk only allowed 14 goals this year for an MPSF-best 0.74 goals-against average. Junior forward **Chris Wright** led the MPSF in scoring with 28 points on 12 goals and four assists (1.47 PPG). Senior midfielder **Diego Barrera** also led the conference in assists with eight. As a team, New Mexico was first in both scoring offense and defense with 38 goals and a 0.71 goals-against average. The Lobos turned in a 12-5-2 overall record and 7-1-2 in MPSF action for a conference-high 23 points....
